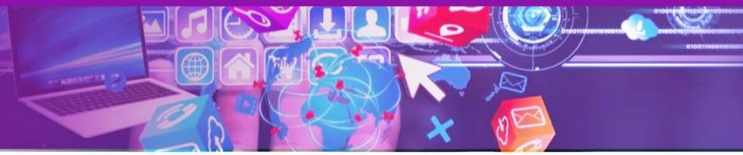

headed by Councillor Kevin Lau.

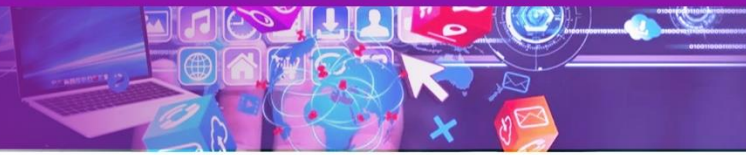
According to Lau, the visit was made two weeks after his team had helped the family submit their application for aid to the department.

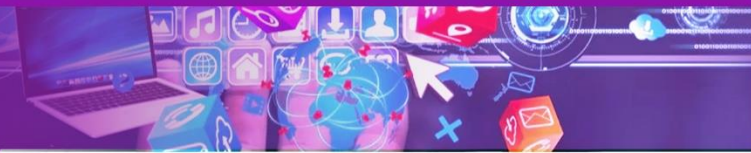
Fadhlina said SMKPK

Bumbong Lima, which is the 35th special needs school in the country and the fifth in Penang, reflects the MoE's commitment to giving special attention to students with special needs.

Therefore, allocation in the federal budget for students with special needs was also increased and the government is also developing a special education sports school in Bandar Enstek, Nilai, Negeri Sembilan.

Fadhlina also promised that the MoE would not leave any groups behind in education.

It includes providing access to education to students who do not have identification documents and do not have citizenship, through the initiative of the Sekolah Bimbingan Jalinan Kasih (SBJK) initiative for sickly students and those who are in the shackles of poverty. — Bernama

Review of e-Kasih list needed to remove non-deserving recipients — Nancy

KUCHING: A comprehensive review on the e-Kasih database needs to be done to ensure that only deserving individuals are included in it, said Women, Family and Community Development Minister Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri.

She said the methods and criteria currently used to assess the beneficiaries do not reflect their actual condition.

With the Sarawak government conducting a thorough review of the e-Kasih recipients' list in the state, Nancy pointed out that such a move is crucial as it will provide a more accurate representation of the beneficiaries' conditions.

"We receive information based on the data sent to us – details on the applicants, as well as the criteria – all this depends on the decisions made by the Ministry of Economy as e-Kasih falls under their jurisdiction.

"Nevertheless, the data that we receive are those deemed deserving based on the agreed-upon criteria, depending on the circumstances," she added.

She said this after officiating the ministry's Keusahawanan Wanita Bangkit programme in Siburan here yesterday.

Nancy said although her ministry accepts applications for the e-kasih programme, the final decision regarding aid recipients will involve various agencies from other ministries.

This collaborative approach aims to avoid data duplication and create a standardised reference system for all parties involved, she added.

Premier Datuk Patinggi Tan Sri Abang Johari Tun Openg had previously said that the state government will conduct a review to measure the poverty level in the state, which will also involve the recipients under the e-Kasih list.

With Nancy at the press conference was state Transport Deputy Minister Datuk Dr Jerip Susil who is Mambong assemblyman.

Wanita Bangkit: Over RM2 mln to help women break free from poverty

KUCHING: More than RM2 million has been allocated by the Ministry of Women, Family and Community Development for the Wanita Bangkit programme to help women break free from poverty, said minister Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri.

She said since January this year to date, a total of 6,651

participants have benefitted from the programme.

"Through this programme, participants are provided with guidance and cash aid amounting to RM500, which will be deposited into their respective accounts as initial capital to start their businesses.

"After three months, the

participants will be monitored by our volunteers to assess their progress, as well as to evaluate the programme's effectiveness in assisting them to increase their income through their respective businesses," she said.

She said this at the Wanita Bangkit programme held at Siburan Community Hall here

yesterday. Nancy said in Sarawak, a total of 11 such programmes have been organised involving 4,823 participants, with 500 taking part in yesterday's event.

Also present at the event were state Deputy Minister for Transport Datuk Dr Jerip Susil who is also Mambong assemblyman.

'Black magic' women scammers

Victims blame 'pukau' but expert says there are more mundane reasons why they get fooled

JOHOR BARU: A 72-year-old woman, who was approached by three strangers at a wet market here in June, almost ended up handing them her savings and jewellery.

She was saved by nature's call as the woman, who only wanted to be known as Tan, said she had an upset stomach and had to leave mid-conversation.

Otherwise, she believed she could have become a victim of "pukau" (black magic).

"I had just finished shopping at the morning market and was loading my things into the car. That was when a woman came up to me.

"She asked if I knew of any physician. She wanted to seek help for her husband who recently suffered a misfortune, that had led to a string of health problems.

"Then a second woman came along, saying she could recommend a physician. Although I felt odd, somehow I followed them as they walked towards an alley," said Tan in an interview.

Recounting her encounter with the cheat in June, Tan said then a third woman came along, claiming she was the daughter-in-law of the physician.

"She (the third woman) took one look at me and told me that bad luck had befallen my family and suggested we go to a quieter place - her car - where she could tell me more.

"When we got into the car, she started asking me about my children, personal savings and jewel-

lery. Surprisingly, I told her everything.

"She then told me to go home and put all my valuables in a paper bag and fill it with uncooked rice before handing it over to her to perform a ritual to ward off the bad luck.

"But then I had a stomach ache and excused myself. I went to a restaurant where I was supposed to meet a friend for breakfast. I related the incident to my friend and she told me that I had almost become a victim of a 'black magic' scam," she said.

In another case, a 68-year-old woman named Ng was not as lucky as she lost about RM40,000 in savings and jewellery to three strangers she met at another wet market on June 3.

These strangers, estimated to be in their 40s and 50s, had approached Ng one by one.

It all started with the first woman asking Ng where she could buy Chinese herbs.

A second woman joined in, claiming that she knew a "sifu" (master) who would give free treatment.

She offered to drive them to see the sifu when Ng told them that her husband had been unwell.

Ng said when they got to the car, she saw another woman inside the vehicle.

This third woman told Ng that bad luck would befall her children and that she should seek help from the sifu.

"They convinced me to return home and place my money and jewellery into a paper bag before meeting them again for a ritual to ward off the bad luck.

"I could only remember them telling me to hold onto the paper bag tightly while chanting my children's name until they left."

To her horror, Ng later discovered that there were only two bottles of water and a small bag of rice in the paper bag.

She believed that she had been put into a "trance" by the women.

Although there had been many of such cases where victims claimed that they were "hypnotised", the Malaysian Society of Clinical Hypnosis (MSCH) - made up of trained medical professionals - said otherwise.

MSCH president Datin Dr Thema Abdul Majid said hypnotherapy was the use of hypnosis to treat medical or psychological disorders and should not be confused with the tactics of syndicates to persuade their victims into doing their bidding.

"Pukau or being put under a spell is not hypnosis. Pukau is usually associated with an intention to manipulate and cause harm.

"It is used without consent where techniques such as charming language, touch, staring into the eyes and a shock factor are used to scare the victims into thinking that they may be in grave

danger if they do not seek help. "This usually involves handing over their valuables in exchange for certain rituals," she said in an interview.

She said many were confused with the concept and this had led to hypnotherapy being cast in a negative light.

In hypnotherapy, Dr Thema said medical professionals apply hypnosis techniques to encourage the patient's unconscious mind to find solutions to their health problems.

"Patients usually seek hypnotherapy to address health concerns like anxiety, phobias, weight management, smoking cessation, terminal illness, pain management, unhealthy habits, insomnia, childhood or adolescent issues, and substance abuse.

"It is important to note that during hypnosis - unlike what is typically depicted on TV shows - the patient, while feeling relaxed and comfortable, is fully in control of himself.

"It is done with consent and patients can open their eyes any time and reject whatever that does not resonate with them.

"It is definitely not a practice of putting the patients into a trance by just snapping our fingers.

"The patient must also be willing and cooperative to go into a hypnotic stage. It cannot be forced.

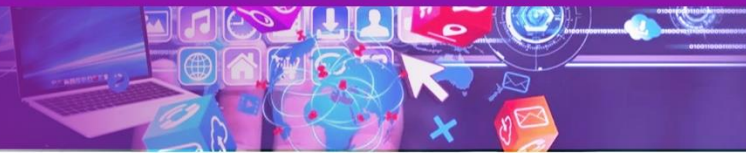
"MSCH hopes to eliminate the confusion as the field of hypnosis is growing rapidly not only in Malaysia but globally.

"Inaccurate representation will set our progress back and prevent patients from receiving much-needed assistance as the healthcare system is moving towards a holistic way of healing," she added.

Dr Thema, who is also the medical director at the London College of Clinical Hypnosis (LCCH) Asia, said hypnotherapy was recognised by the British Medical Association in 1892, and later recommended for inclusion into the medical curriculum in the 1950s.

In Malaysia, formal training for clinical hypnotherapy was introduced in 2006, she said.

She added that in the early days of the Covid-19 pandemic, MSCH and LCCH operated a virtual therapy platform, launched by then Health deputy director-general for public health Datuk Dr Chong Chee Keong, to help people suffering from anxiety and depression during the lockdowns.

Tree falls on car, killing three in a family

KOTA BARU: Three members of a family were killed when a tree fell on the car they were travelling in near Kampung Bukit Cina in Kok Lanas.

Two others were injured in the incident that happened on Saturday night.

Nik Mohd Zulmi Ramli, 44, his wife Nik Amirah Ab Rahman, 40, and their five-year-old daughter Nik Aishah Azzahra died at the scene.

The couple's two other children, Nik Adilia Zulaikha, 11, and Nik Adam Zariif, nine, sustained injuries and were rushed to Hospital Machang for treatment.

Ketereh Fire and Rescue station chief Mohd Roslan Omar said they were alerted to the incident at 8.06pm.

“The incident involved two cars, one driven by Nik Mohd Zulmi. Both cars were hit by a falling tree.

“All five in the other car escaped unhurt,” he said.

Muhammad Ridha Abdullah, a relative of the victims, said the couple was on their way home after cleaning Nik Amirah's mother's house in Ketereh.

“After cleaning the house, they went to pick up their children, who had gone to a book fair, before going to a nearby restaurant for dinner.

“As they were on the way home, a falling tree hit their car,” Muhammad Ridha, Nik Amirah's brother-in-law, told Bernama.

KUALA LUMPUR: In a progressive and inclusive society, women's empowerment plays a pivotal role in driving positive change and fostering sustainable development.

Recognising the significant contributions of women in all aspects of life, the government has taken a momentous step by introducing measures under Belanjawan 2023 that focuses on uplifting and safeguarding the fairer sex, especially those in the B40 group in urban and rural areas.

The wide range of measures tailored to support mothers and single mothers aim to provide relief to the needs of women who are the cornerstone of Malaysia.

The core of Belanjawan 2023's objectives is to ensure women empowerment and protect their rights and welfare.

Whether it is providing financial relief, enhancing safety, offering professional training, or promoting entrepreneurship, the government is dedicated to uplifting the lives of women nationwide.

The initiatives introduced under Belanjawan 2023 have already begun making a positive impact on the lives of women.

One of the key measures is to encourage women to return to work after giving birth by amending the Social Security Organisation (Socso) Act to allow for a grant equal to 80% of the insured employee's salary.

A total of RM250 million per year have been allocated under this policy and rough estimates show that over 130,000 women who return to work after childbirth will benefit from this grant.

The government's further commitment to fostering women's entrepreneurship is evident through initiatives like the women's business financing fund.

The fund will enable women micro-entrepreneurs to apply for up to RM235 million (cumulative total) in financing from Bank Rakyat, Bank Simpanan Nasional, Tekun Nasional and Majlis Amanah Rakyat.

Benefits from Belanjawan 2023: No woman left behind



Building Safer Communities

Women, Family and Community Development Minister Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri said the Tribunal for Anti-Sexual Harassment is part of the advocacy programme to empower women to fight against harassment and abuse and ensure justice prevails.

A fund of RM10 million went to the establishment of the tribunal while RM8.3 million will be used to open one-stop Local Social

Support Centres.

These centres will help address domestic violence and social problems by offering guidance, counselling sessions, immediate relief to those in need.

Even the police is establishing a specialised unit under its D11 unit (Sexual, Women and Children Investigation Division) to be more aggressive in investigating sexual abuse cases involving women and children.

In addition, the government recognises the invaluable role of mothers in shaping the future generation and will extend financial support in the form of tax reliefs for

medical treatment expenditures.

Starting from the assessment year 2023, the tax relief limit for medical treatment expenditures will be raised from RM8,000 to RM10,000.

In addition, the scope of this relief will also be expanded to cover the cost of intervention treatment for children with developmental disabilities such as autism, Down syndrome and specific learning disabilities, up to a maximum of RM4,000.

There will be additional tax incentives for employers who establish childcare facilities within their premises and tax relief for childcare centre fees.

These measures reduce the financial burden on mothers and encourage a nurturing environment for their children.

Belanjawan 2023 further demonstrates its commitment to women's health by subsidising mammograms and cervical cancer screening programmes, aiming to enhance early detection and prevention.

The subsidised mammograms will be offered to women aged between 35 and 70. Households with total incomes of less than RM10,000 will enjoy a full subsidy while those with more than RM10,000 will receive a RM50 subsidy.

Women aged between 30 and 65 will also receive free HPV DNA test screening kits at selected Klinik Nur Sejahtera and National Population and Family Development Board outreach programmes.

These measures in Belanjawan 2023 stand as a testament to the government's dedication to women's empowerment and the advancement of gender equality in Malaysia.

By creating awareness and encouraging women to utilise the initiatives, it is hoped that no woman will be left behind in the journey towards a more inclusive and prosperous society.

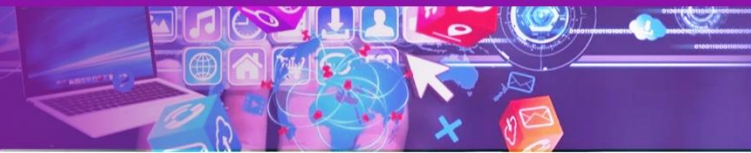
Remand extended for child abuse suspects

IPOH: A remand order against a woman and her boyfriend, believed to be involved in the death of a nine-year-old boy last week, has been extended for another six days.

“The extension is until Aug 12. The probe is ongoing and the investigation papers will be referred to the DPP soon,” Taiping district police chief ACP Razlam Ab Hamid said yesterday.

The boy was found dead on July 31 at a house in Taman Panglima, Assam Kumbang and elements of abuse were discovered during investigations.

Three killed, two hurt after tree crushes car

KOTA BHARU: Three members of a family were killed and two others injured on Saturday when a tree fell on their car near Kampung Bukit Cina in Kok Lanas.

Nik Mohd Zulmi Ramli, 44, his wife Nik Amirah Ab Rahman, 40, and their daughter Nik Aishah Azzahra, five, died at the scene while the couple's two other children Nik Adilia Zulaikha, 11, and Nik Adam Zarif, nine, were rushed to the Machang Hospital for treatment after sustaining injuries.

Ketereh Fire and Rescue Station chief Mohd Roslan Omar said they were alerted to the incident at around 8pm.

"The tree had hit two cars, one of which was driven by Nik Mohd Zulmi. However, all five passengers of the other vehicle escaped unhurt."

Nik Amirah's brother-in-law Muhammad Ridha Abdullah said the couple were travelling back home after tidying up her mother's house in Ketereh.

"After cleaning the house, they went to pick up their children who had gone to a book fair at a supermarket here, before going to a nearby restaurant for dinner. Unfortunately, as they were on the way home (from the restaurant), a falling tree hit their car."

He added that Nik Amirah had worked at the National Audit Department in Tunjong, while Nik Mohd Zulmi was a staff member of the Pasir Mas National Anti-Drug Agency office. - Bernama

“Kejadian membabitkan dua kenderaan iaitu Nissan Sentra dan Honda City dihempap pokok melibatkan 10 mangsa. Tiga mangsa tersepit di dalam kereta Nissan Sentra disahkan meninggal dunia, manakala dua lagi selamat.

“Lima mangsa iaitu tiga lelaki dan dua wanita di dalam kereta Honda City juga selamat,” katanya.

Sementara itu, adik ipar mangsa Muhammad Ridha Abdullah, 35, berkata Nik Amirah dan Nik Mohd Zulmi ketika itu dalam perjalanan pulang ke rumah mereka di Kok Lanas selepas selesai mengemas rumah ibu mereka di Ketereh.

“Pasangan tersebut mengambil keputusan untuk mengemas rumah

ibu mereka iaitu Amnah Ismail, 64, yang berada di Kuala Lumpur dan dijangka pulang ke Kelantan semalam.

“Selepas siap mengemas dan mengambil anak-anak mereka yang ke pesta buku di sebuah pasar raya di sini, mereka makan malam terlebih dahulu. Malang tidak berbau, ketika dalam perjalanan untuk pulang ke rumah kereta Nissan Sentra yang dinaiki mereka dari arah Machang ke Kota Bharu dihempap pokok,” katanya kepada Bernama semalam.

Muhammad Ridha berkata, Nik Amirah bekerja di Jabatan Audit Negara, Tunjong manakala Nik Mohd Zulmi berkhidmat di Agensi Antidadah Kebangsaan (AADK) Pasir Mas. — Bernama
