Court defers hearing on mum's right to determine child's religious upbringing to Oct 11

KUCHING: The High Court here has postponed the hearing of a case regarding a mother's right to determine her child's religious upbringing until Oct 11 as an official report from the National Registration Department (JPN) is still pending.

Senior Federal Counsel Shamsul Bolhassan, who is acting for all six respondents including the JPN, told the court yesterday that he needed the one-month extension because his replies to the submissions of the plaintiff would depend on the JPN's official report.

Shamsul indicated that they had made the request for the report from the JPN at the end of August, but did not state reason for the delay.

The woman's lawyer Joshua Baru initially objected to the request for extension of time, suggesting that the hearing should start yesterday as the JPN's internal working is not the plaintiff's issue but rather the age of her son, who will turn 18 on Oct 18.

It is understood that the legal consideration for the case later on may be different when the child is 18 and above, compared to when he is below 18.

Presiding judge Zaleha Rose Pandin said she decided to grant the one-month adjournment of the trial hearing in the interest of justice.

Earlier, the plaintiff's other lawyer Clarice Chan pleaded to the court for the names of the parties be simply referred to as 'father', 'mother' and 'child' throughout the court proceedings in order to protect their identities, to which Shamsul had no objection.

Chan also said the woman's originating summons was served on the JPN on Aug 10.

The 52-year-old plaintiff filed an originating summons in early August to seek a declaration that she has the right to determine the religion and upbringing of her teenage son, who at present has a Muslim name on his MyKad.

The plaintiff is seeking a court order to compel the JPN, among others, to record changes in her son's MyKad in relation to his religion.

The mother named the Malaysian Births, Deaths and Adoptions director, the Sarawak regional registrar of Births and Deaths, the Identity Card Division director, the JPN director-general, JPN, and the federal government, as the first to sixth defendants.

It was previously reported that the son, who was born in Sabah and is now residing in Sarawak, has professed the Buddhist faith all his life.

The plaintiff - a divorcee - contends that her son's Muslim father has no objections to him being a Buddhist.

The boy declared support in his affidavit for his Buddhist mother's legal challenge against JPN's alleged delay in changing his religious status on his MyKad.

The teenager has just completed his schooling at a Chinese-medium school in Kota Kinabalu, and his friends know him by his Chinese name.

Born on Oct 18, 2005, the teenager during his schooling years did not take any Islamic religious classes and has neither practised Islam in his life nor wants to be identified as a Muslim.

The mother and the boy's father were married under Sabah's Islamic Family Law Enactment 1992 on Aug 3, 1999 but she continued to practise Buddhism.

The couple divorced on Jan 27, 2010 and the woman was granted sole care and custody of their son, who was raised as a Buddhist since birth.

Her former husband, who is a Muslim, has since remarried and now has a separate family of his own.

The mother claimed that on July 5 this year, she and her lawyers faced problems when applying to JPN Sarawak to change the details in her son's identity card registers.

The applicant claimed that a woman JPN Sarawak counter staff member refused to accept the application and instead gave her a separate set of forms to fill.

The mother claimed she resubmitted the application on July 18 with supporting documents from her former husband as well as their son, which JPN accepted.

She alleged that following her lawyers' letter to the state JPN, the department replied via a letter dated July 31 that neither granted nor rejected the application and that she was asked to fill even more forms.

The mother said the forms were repetitive as they were, in essence, identical - especially the second and third forms - save for the provisions of the relevant ordinance.

She contended that as a Malaysian citizen, she is entitled to correct the details on her son's identity card in the relevant register in any part of the country.

The mother also claimed that her son is known to friends, family, teachers, and the community by his Chinese name and that they both attend a Buddhist society here.

Entomology show aims to nurture science interest in kids

KUCHING: Sarawak plans to set up an interactive exhibition on entomology at the Sarawak Science Centre, with the aim of inspiring the young generation to explore this branch of zoology.

According to Minister of Education, Innovation and Talent Development Datuk Roland Sagah Wee Inn, insects are more than merely a fascinating representative of biological sciences.

"Hence, we gather here today with a shared passion to unlock the secrets and potentials of insects in diverse fields including agriculture, environmental conservation, biotechnology, and also human health.

"Their (insects) uniqueness in physical forms, characteristics and functions presents a wealth of learning topics for integrating STEM (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics) disciplines," he said at the launch of the Fifth International Symposium on Insects (ISol) here

yesterday.

The minister's text-of-speech was read by Sarawak Research and Development Council (SRDC) general manager Dr Peter Morin Nissom.

Adding on, Sagah said learning about insects would not only help enhance the problem-solving skills in children, but would also inspire them to be 'good stewards of the environment'.

In this respect, he said the ministry would want to work with entomologists in developing effective STEM-focused learning tools to nurture in children an interest in science.

Moreover, he also called upon all stakeholders to collaborate with the ministry in addressing the skills gap in STEM.

According to Sagah, Sarawak needs to have at least 60 per cent of students in STEM stream by 2030.

"Entomology, as many are aware, is the study of insects and it is a discipline branching from STEM.

"By setting up the Sarawak Science Centre, this would

serve as a platform to foster the interest in and appreciation for science and technology among the younger generation, and also the public.

"At state level, we are committed to and supportive of the efforts to encourage and motivate the public to venture into STEM disciplines."

In acknowledging ISol 2023 as part of the efforts to raise STEM literacy in Sarawak, Sagah hoped that the findings and ideas shared during the symposium would be able to assist his ministry in encourage more participation in STEM.

In this regard, he hailed ISol 2023 as a platform to present and discuss 'the astonishing aspects of insects', in line with the direction of his ministry's advocacy for STEM education.

"I applaud this effort and endeavour to provide up-to-date, relevant and educational information towards producing findings that would benefit socio-economic interests and ensure quality education in the nation," he added.

Getting women back to work

Steps taken to increase their labour participation to 60%

KUALA LUMPUR: Efforts will be stepped up to encourage women to remain in employment or return to the workforce as Malaysia aims to increase their participation in the labour force to 60% within a decade.

Prime Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim said this will be carried out with relevant facilities and support, such as childcare, financial incentives and flexible working hours.

Programmes such as MamaCare, affordable daycare, Career Come Back and nursery fee subsidies at work would be implemented, he said when tabling the 12th Malaysia Plan Mid-Term Review in the Dewan Rakyat here yesterday.

"Women's role in the care economy will be acknowledged to increase their participation in the workforce.

"This effort will also combat the challenge of a shrinking workforce as the result of an ageing nation," said Anwar.

He added that this would, however, require a commitment from

all parties, including the private sector and civil society groups, as well as a "whole of nation" approach.

On Aug 30, Women, Family and Community Development Minister Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri

said her ministry would focus on three areas to increase female labour participation from 56.2% to 60%.

These are better policies and laws; an ecosystem to support women; and training capacity

building, upskilling and reskilling.

In terms of the ageing population, those aged 65 and above were expected to account for 14% of the population in two decades.

This shift would affect the country's socioeconomic development and fiscal position should no serious attention be given to the issue, Anwar said.

"The most significant impact is the decline in the working population and productivity, as well as the government's increased financial commitments in preparing care services for more senior citizens," he said.

Putrajaya is in the midst of developing a National Action Plan for Aging, he said.

The government had also taken the proactive step to set up a new geriatric centre and was finetuning the implementation of Private Aged Healthcare Facilities and Service Act 2018, which was passed in Parliament on Nov 29, 2017, he added.

The Act, Anwar said, would come into force in 2025.

Inspectors break glass ceiling

Four women become pioneer female pilots of police air wing unit

IPOH: Four women have created history by becoming the pioneer female pilots of the Police Air Wing Operations unit.

Insp Nur Hidayah Mohd Aisa, 33, Insp Wan Aulia Hami Fariheen Wan Azulkefeli, 31, Insp Siti Nabilah Abdullah, 33, and Insp Yeoh Yee Chee, 31, were among 12 trainees who received their private pilot licences.

The official pinning of the honorary wing badges on them was carried out by Deputy Inspector-General of Police Comm Datuk Seri Ayob Khan Mydin Pitchay during the wing's training base 44th anniversary here yesterday.

The four had been serving in the police force for a number of years at different departments and states before applying for the flying training programme.

Insp Nur Hidayah from Ipoh, who was based in Kapit, Sarawak prior to her training, was also announced as the best female trainee for the flying course.

"The training started in 2021, and ended in July this year. I encouraged myself to apply for the programme as I knew it was now or never.

"After fulfilling the criteria and being selected, the challenge for me and the rest of the women

was to show our abilities and capabilities, since the majority of the trainees were men.

"The only criterion set for women during the one-and-a-half-year training was that we were not allowed to get married during that time frame," she added.

Insp Yeoh, who hails from Penang and was attached to the Commercial Crime Investigation Department for seven years in Kedah, said she decided to take up the challenge when she saw the training programme was open to women.

"After meeting all the require-

ments, I decided to apply, and went through the necessary stages before being picked.

"This is indeed a proud moment for me and I cannot wait for my first official working flight," she said, adding that she could now think about starting a family too.

Insp Siti Nabilah, who has been in the police force for the past six years, said the most terrifying moment was during the solo flight training.

"During the first solo flight, I was excited but at the same time nervous, as part of the training was to take off and land safely.

"Since our training is over now, those of us in a relationship can start thinking about marriage and having a family," she quipped.

She said the trainees were eagerly waiting for their first mission.

Earlier, during a press conference, the unit's commander Deputy Comm Datuk Noor Sham Md Jani said there were previously lots of constraints in taking in female pilots, including matters involving pregnancy of married officers.

"But we decided to come up with terms and conditions before selection for female trainees, including for them not to get married during the training period.

"From 36 applicants, the final four were picked, and I am proud of our pioneer female pilots who completed their training.

"Currently in training are also six female pilots for our wing's helicopter unit.

"We are encouraging more women to join the training programme," he added.

Make initiatives last, say women's groups

PETALING JAYA: There must be effective implementation to ensure the longevity of any initiative to encourage the participation of women in the workforce, say women's groups.

All Women's Action Society (Awam) information and communications officer Amanda Shweeta Louis said there must be engagement with civil society and relevant groups to help women keep on working or return to the job market.

"It is great to see the government acknowledging the importance of daycare programmes in re-platforming mothers who took a hiatus from work to care for their children, as a method to close the gender gap in the labour force," she said when contacted.

Awam also called for a safe working environment for women that is free of all forms of harassment and discrimination.

"Women must have equal and unrestricted access to promotion opportunities, breaking through any remaining glass ceilings," Louis said.

Noting that a high number of women are involved in low-wage jobs with limited career security and benefits, she said she hopes the government would help to improve the quality of jobs.

A member of Lean in Malaysia, a women-led non-profit organisation, suggested that additional support be given to single career women who are also caregivers for elderly or sick relatives.

She said providing specific perks or assistance tailored to women's unique challenges, in addition to current initiatives for working mothers, would create a more inclusive and supportive environment.

She said it was important to have plans that cover various aspects to make it easier for women to balance between their responsibilities and work commitments.

GUA MUSANG: Seorang kanak-kanak lelaki berusia empat tahun ditemukan lemas setelah dipercayai terjatuh ke dalam parit yang terletak di belakang rumah keluarganya sebelum dihanyutkan air deras di Felda Chiku 1, di sini kelmarin.

Ketua Polis Daerah Gua Musang Supt Sik Choon Foo berkata mangsa Muhammad Syahrul Darwish Mohd Mazuan, ditemukan penduduk pada 6.50 petang kira-kira empat kilometer dari lokasi parit tersebut.

Sik berkata terdahulu polis menerima laporan kehilangan mangsa pada 6.15 petang.

“Mangsa telah ditemukan

dalam keadaan terbaring di padang bola Felda Chiku 1 dipercayai dibawa arus deras dan disahkan telah meninggal dunia di tempat kejadian oleh petugas kesihatan,” katanya dalam kenyataan, semalam.

Perbicaraan kes babitkan hak ibu terhadap status quo agama anak ditangguh 11 Oktober depan

KUCHING: Mahkamah Tinggi di sini, menangguhkan perbicaraan kes membabitkan hak ibu terhadap status quo agama anaknya, ke tarikh baharu iaitu 11 Oktober depan.

Ini kerana menurut Peguam Kanan Persekutuan (SFC) Shamsul Bolhassan penangguhan perbicaraan kes itu disebabkan laporan rasmi Jabatan Pendaftaran Negara (JPN) masih belum selesai.

Shamsul dari Putrajaya, bertindak mewakili kes-emu enam responden termasuk JPN, memberitahu mahkamah semalam, beliau memerlukan lanjutan sebulan kerana jawapannya kepada penghujahan plaintif, bergantung kepada laporan rasmi JPN.

Shamsul menyatakan mereka telah mengemukakan permintaan pada akhir Ogos, untuk laporan daripada JPN tetapi tidak menyatakan sebab kelewatan itu.

Peguam mewakili wanita berkenaan (ibu) Joshua Bian pada mulanya membantah permintaan SFC untuk lanjutan masa, mencadangkan perbicaraan harus dimulakan semalam kerana kerja dalam JPN bukanlah isu plaintif tetapi usia anaknya, yang akan berumur 18 tahun pada 18 Oktober depan.

Bagaimanapun Hakim Mahkamah Tinggi Zaleha Rose Pandin berkata beliau telah membuat keputusan, membenarkan penangguhan satu bulan perbicaraan demi kepentingan keadilan.

Terdahulu, seorang lagi peguam kepada plaintif, Clarice Chan merayu kepada mahkamah bahawa nama pihak-pihak hanya dirujuk sebagai 'bapa', 'ibu' dan 'anak' sepanjang prosiding mahkamah untuk melindungi identiti mereka.

Rayuannya itu tidak mendapat bantahan daripada SFC.

Chan juga berkata saman

pemula (OS) wanita itu telah diserahkan kepada JPN pada 10 Ogos.

Plaintif berusia 52 tahun memfailkan saman pemula pada awal Ogos untuk mendapatkan perisytiharan mahkamah bahawa dia mempunyai hak menentukan agama dan didikan anak remajanya, yang pada masa ini mempunyai nama Islam pada MyKadnya.

Plaintif dalam proses memohon perintah mahkamah untuk memaksa JPN, antara lain, merekodkan perubahan dalam MyKad anaknya berhubung agama.

Si ibu telah menamakan pengarah Kelahiran, Kematian dan Pengangkatan Malaysia; pendaftar Kelahiran dan Kematian wilayah Sarawak; pengarah Bahagian Kad Pengenalan; ketua pengarah JPN; JPN dan kerajaan persekutuan sebagai defendan pertama hingga keenam.

Dalam laporan media sebelum ini, difahamkan anak lelaki itu dilahirkan di Sabah dan kini menetap di Sarawak, menganut agama Buddha sepanjang hayatnya.

Wanita yang sudah pun bercerai (dengan suaminya) berhujah bahawa bapa anaknya yang beragama Islam tidak mempunyai bantahan anaknya itu seorang penganut agama Buddha.

Kanak-kanak lelaki itu dalam afidavitnya mengisytiharkan sokongan terhadap tindakan ibunya mencabar secara undang-undang JPN yang didakwa lewat menukar status agamanya pada MyKad kanak-kanak tersebut.

Remaja itu baru sahaja menamatkan persekolahannya di sebuah sekolah aliran Cina di Kota Kinabalu Sabah dan rakan-rakan mengenalinya dengan nama Cina.

Dilahirkan pada 18 Oktober 2005, remaja itu semasa zaman persekolahannya tidak mengikuti mana-mana kelas agama Islam dan tidak men-

gamakan Islam dalam hidupnya dan tidak mahu dikenali sebagai penganut Islam.

Ibu dan bapa kanak-kanak itu berkahwin di Sabah pada 3 Ogos 1999 tetapi secara peribadi menganut agama Buddha.

Pasangan itu bercerai pada 27 Januari 2010. Wanita itu diberikan penjagaan sepenuhnya terhadap anak lelaki mereka, yang dibesarkan sebagai penganut agama Buddha sejak lahir.

Bekas suaminya yang beragama Islam, telah berkahwin semula dan kini mempunyai keluarga sendiri.

Ibu itu mendakwa pada 5 Julai tahun ini, dia dan peguamnya berdepan masalah apabila memohon kepada JPN Sarawak untuk menukar butiran dalam daftar kad pengenalan anaknya.

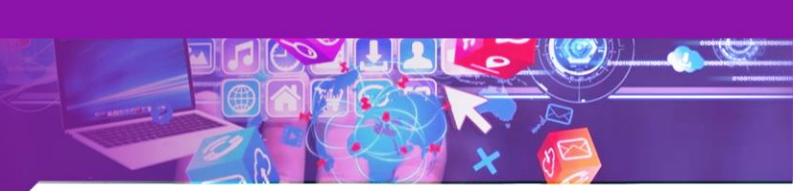
Pemohon mendakwa seorang kakitangan (wanita) yang bertugas di kaunter JPN Sarawak enggan menerima permohonan itu, sebaliknya memberinya satu set borang berasingan untuk diisi.

Ibu itu mendakwa mengemukakan semula permohonan itu pada 18 Julai lalu dengan dokumen sokongan daripada bekas suaminya serta anak mereka, yang diterima JPN.

Beliau mendakwa berikutan surat peguamnya kepada JPN negeri, jabatan itu menjawab melalui surat bertarikh 31 Julai bahawa permohonan itu tidak dibenarkan mahupun ditolak dan beliau diminta mengisi lebih banyak borang.

Ibu itu berkata borang itu berulang kerana ia, pada asasnya, sama - terutama borang kedua dan ketiga - kecuali peruntukan ordinan yang berkaitan.

Beliau menegaskan sebagai warganegara Malaysia, beliau berhak menuntut butiran kad pengenalan anaknya dalam daftar berkaitan di mana-mana bahagian negara.

KUCHING: Warga emas dari kawasan Dewan Undangan Negeri (DUN) Bukit Saban kini mempunyai Pusat Aktiviti Warga Emas (PAWE) mereka sendiri di bandar raya ini.

dalam talian lain,” katanya ketika berucap merasmikan pusat itu pada Ahad.

Uggah yang juga Timbalan Premier Sarawak berkata sekiranya pusat itu berjaya, ia akan membuka pintu kepada semua warga emas dari kawasan Parlimen Betong.

Justeru, beliau berharap semua pihak dapat memberikan kerjasama yang erat dalam memastikan kejayaannya.

RMK12: Peranan wanita akan diperkasa dalam ekonomi ihsan

KUALA LUMPUR: Kerajaan akan memperkasakan peranan wanita dalam ekonomi ihsan (care economy) sebagai usaha meningkatkan penyertaan mereka dalam pasaran tenaga kerja bagi tempoh akhir Rancangan Malaysia ke-12 (RMK12).

Perdana Menteri Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim ketika membentangkan usul Kajian Separuh Penggal RMK12 di Parlimen semalam berkata usaha berkenaan juga boleh menangani cabaran penyusutan guna tenaga kesan daripada trend negara menua.

“Komitmen daripada semua pihak, termasuk pihak swasta dan pertubuhan masyarakat sivil melalui pendekatan keseluruhan negara dituntut untuk mencapai matlamat ini, dan terus mempergiat usaha untuk memastikan kadar penyertaan tenaga pekerja wanita mencapai sasaran 60 peratus dalam tempoh 10 tahun.

“Langkah untuk menggalakkan wanita kekal atau

kembali bekerja akan ditingkatkan melalui penyediaan kemudahan dan sokongan yang diperlukan, seperti penjagaan anak, insentif kewangan dan waktu bekerja fleksibel,” katanya.

Beliau berkata antara program yang dilaksana termasuk inisiatif MamaCare, insentif pusat jagaan kanak-kanak mampu bayar, Career Come Back Programme dan subsidi yuran taska di tempat kerja.

Sementara itu, Anwar berkata kerajaan juga akan memberi penekanan dalam memperkasa Orang Kurang Upaya (OKU) dalam meningkatkan akses kepada pekerjaan.

“Maklumat mengenai pencari kerja dalam kalangan OKU akan disepadukan dalam portal MyFutureJobs, manakala prosedur operasi standard pengambilan OKU dalam perkhidmatan awam akan ditambah baik bagi mencapai sasaran 1 peratus OKU dalam perkhidmatan awam,” katanya lagi.

Wanita terkejut ular tedung dalam mesin basuh

MIRI: Hasrat seorang wanita hendak mencuci pakaian terbantut apabila mendapati seekor tetamu tidak diundang berada di dalam mesin basuhnya dalam kejadian yang berlaku di sebuah rumah di Vista Perdana di sini, lewat petang Ahad.

Setiba di lokasi katanya, anggota bertugas terus bertanya kepada pengadu tentang keberadaan ular itu.

“Pengadu memberitahu kehadiran ular berbisa itu disedari ketika dia hendak mencuci pakaian dan mendapati seekor ular berada di dalam mesin basuhnya.

“Anggota bertugas kemudian memeriksa di tempat yang dinyatakan dan mendapati seekor ular tedung hitam masih berada di dalam mesin basuh pengadu,” katanya.

Ular tedung sebesar batang penyapu itu dan dianggarkan sepanjang dua kaki kemudian berjaya ditangkap menggunakan peralatan khas sebelum dilepaskan semula ke habitat asalnya.
