Isteri buntu cari punca suami koma

Seremban: “Saya masih buntu dan tidak mengetahui apa yang terjadi hingga menyebabkan suami koma di hospital. Dia dipercayai terbabit kemalangan berhampiran susur keluar Pedas Linggi, Lebuhraya Plus Sabtu lalu,” ujar Raja Nur Syalini Raja Hamir, 26, yang kini sedang hamil anak pertama.

Menurutnya, dalam kejadian kira-kira jam 8 pagi itu, suaminya, Mohd Muhaimin Mohd Saleh, 26, dalam perjalanan dari Melaka ke Shah Alam, Selangor untuk bertemunya.

Raja Nur Syalini berkata, suaminya ditemui orang

awam di dalam longkang di tepi lebuhraya dalam keadaan tidak sedarkan diri dipercayai terbabit kemalangan.

“Kami memang berasal dari Melaka, tetapi saya bekerja di Shah Alam. Pada hari kejadian, suami dalam perjalanan untuk berjumpa saya dengan menunggang motosikal.

“Kira-kira jam 8.30 pagi, saya menerima panggilan daripada orang awam memaklumkan suami terbabit kemalangan sebelum menghubungi mentua supaya bergegas ke lokasi,” katanya semalam.

Dia berkata, suaminya

dibawa ke Hospital Tuanku Jaafar (HTJ), di sini, menggunakan ambulans dan kini masih lagi dirawat di Unit Rawatan Rapi (ICU).

“Sudah empat hari suami berada dalam koma. Doktor memaklumkan paru-parunya bocor selain ada beberapa tulang patah serta terdapat pendarahan dalam kepala.

“Berdasarkan pemantauan, doktor memaklumkan kakinya sudah mula bergerak, namun matanya belum terbuka. Kami perlu sentiasa berada di sisinya supaya suami kembali sedar,” katanya.

Tambahnya, dia kini agak

buntu kerana baru disahkan mengandung anak pertama, namun suami pula ditimpa kemalangan dan tidak sedarkan diri.

“Saya tidak pasti sama ada suami dilanggar kenderaan lain atau terbabas sendiri. Sehingga kini belum ada laporan polis dibuat kerana suami belum sedarkan diri.

“Bagaimanapun, jika ada mana-mana pengguna jalan raya yang melihat atau merakam kejadian ini, saya merayu supaya dapat menghubungi saya di talian 012-2243775 untuk membantu saya membuat laporan polis,” katanya.

BAYI PEREMPUAN ENAM BULAN HIDAP AVSD SEJAK LAHIR

Perlu dana **RM80,000** tutup jantung berlubang

Kuala Lumpur

Sejak dilahirkan Mac lalu, bayi perempuan ini tidak pernah berkesempatan pulang ke rumah dan sentiasa dalam pemantauan doktor kerana penyakit dihidapinya.

Tan Yu Fei yang baru berusia enam bulan juga terpaksa dibantu untuk bernafas selepas disahkan menghidap jantung berlubang atau *Atrioventricular Septal Defect* (AVSD).

Bapa bayi itu Tan Teng Inn, 42, berkata, dia dan isteri, Lim Eik Ying, 36, mengesan kelainan pada anak mereka selepas Yu Fei dilahirkan.

"Ketika itu, jururawat beritahu pernafasan anak laju dan mungkin ada masalah jantung. Bayi saya juga sindrom Down.

"Saya memang tidak dapat menerima keadaan itu dan kecewa dengan perkara (penyakit) yang menimpa anak saya," katanya dalam temubual secara talian di sini, semalam.

Teng Inn berkata, anak kesayangannya perlu menjalani pembedahan segera untuk

menutup lubang sebesar enam milimeter, dengan kos diperlukan RM80,000.

Katanya, dia tidak mampu menyediakan dana sebanyak itu kerana pendapatannya hanya RM1,200 sebulan, hasil pelbagai pekerjaan dilakukan

termasuk pengaturcaraan bebas dan mengajar kanak-kanak memasang lego.

"Isteri pula menjual baju kanak-kanak secara dalam

talian dan memperoleh RM1,300.

"Selain itu, saya perlu menguruskan ibu yang menjalani dialisis di rumah," katanya yang memberitahu tidak dapat bekerja buat masa ini kerana perlu menjaga anaknya.

Sementara itu, Eik Ying berharap bantuan orang ramai untuk membolehkan anaknya dibedah, seterusnya dapat membesar seperti kanak-kanak lain.

"Saya berharap keadaannya bertambah baik selepas pembedahan kerana saya ingin melihat dia seperti kanak-kanak (sihat) yang lain dan boleh bermain dengan abangnya di rumah.

"Kami bukan orang senang dan sangat memerlukan bantuan untuk me-

nampung kos rawatan ini. Saya harap ada yang sudi membantu," katanya yang kini menetap sementara di rumah sepuanya di sini.

Orang ramai yang ingin membantu boleh menyerahkan sumbangan dalam bentuk wang tunai atau cek dengan menulis nama pesakit di belakang cek kepada Tabung Kemanusiaan Media Prima-NSTP.

WANITA WARGA EMAS DIPERDAYA SINDIKET *PHONE SCAM*

Rugi RM485,000 ditipu 'pegawai polis'

Seorang wanita warga emas di Kerian dekat sini, kerugian RM485,000 akibat terpedaya dengan sindiket penipuan panggilan telefon atau *phone scam* yang menyamar sebagai pegawai polis.

Ketua Polis Perak Datuk Seri Mohd Yusri Hassan Basri berkata, wanita berusia 72 tahun itu yang juga pesara swasta, membuat laporan polis jam 11.40 pagi kelmarin.

"Hasil siasatan awal mendapati, mangsa dihu-

bungi seorang lelaki pada 4 Ogos lalu, yang mendakwa kakitangan syarikat penghantaran. Ia kononnya, mangsa ada membuat penghantaran bungkusan yang tidak berjaya dihantar kepada penerima.

"Suspek turut memaklumkan bungkusan itu mengandungi kad kredit serta cip kad pengenalan. Mangsa bagaimanapun menafikan perkara terbabit.

"Mangsa kemudiannya disambungkan panggilan kepada dua individu yang menyamar 'pegawai polis' masing-masing kononnya dari 'Ibu Pejabat Polis Daerah Ipoh' dan 'Bukit

Aman,'" katanya, semalam.

Mohd Yusri berkata, mangsa diperdaya dengan dituduh terbabit berkaitan kes pemerdagangan manusia dan pengubahan wang haram serta diugut akan ditangkap dan dipenjarakan.

"Mangsa yang ketakutan kemudiannya memindahkan semua wang milik mangsa ke akaun diberikan suspek kononnya bagi mengelakkan wang mangsa dirampas dan dibekukan," katanya.

Mohd Yusri berkata, suspek turut berjanji untuk memulangkan wang terbabit selepas siasatan selesai

dan suspek turut mengarahkan mangsa untuk tidak memaklumkan perkara ini kepada sesiapa, kononnya bagi mengelakkan siasatan terganggu.

"Bermula 8 Ogos sehingga 6 September lalu, mangsa melakukan 34 transaksi ke 11 akaun bank milik seorang individu.

"Mangsa hanya menyedari ditipu selepas perbuatannya dicurigai anak saudara yang datang melawat sewaktu mangsa ingin keluar membuat pindahan wang berikutnya," katanya.

Kes disiasat di bawah Seksyen 420 Kanun Keseksaan.

Help baby Yu Fei see the world by donating for her surgery

KUALA LUMPUR: Tan Yu Fei was born five months ago, but she has yet to see the outside world.

She is suffering from an atrioventricular septal defect (AVSD) and is spending most of her early life being warded in the hospital.

There is a 6mm "hole" in her heart, extending from between the upper chambers to the lower ventricles.

She has also been diagnosed with Down syndrome.

Her mother, Lim Eik Ying, 35, said her pregnancy was normal until she gave birth, which was when the doctors noticed that the infant's heart rate was accelerated.

The baby's father, Tan Teng Inn, 42, had to commute between Kuala Lumpur and Kuala Terengganu to take care of his mother, who is a kidney patient undergoing dialysis every day.

Teng Inn tried to bring his mother to Kuala Lumpur to manage the situation, but it was not a feasible solution. When his mother's medication had run out, he had to return to Terengganu to replenish it.

"The round-trip expenses amount to between RM1,000 and RM2,000. We were relying a bit on my relatives, who were kind-hearted in helping us," he said.

He was not sure how much longer he could sustain the medical expenses for both his child

and mother, as he was currently unable to work a full-time job.

As the only child, he had to take care of his mum and his ailing daughter.

"Our total household salary is only RM2,500. We cannot afford the urgent surgery that Yu Fei needs."

The couple were extremely exhausted with bloodshot eyes as they described the moment they saw their newborn daughter struggling to breathe.

"She breathes with the help of a ventilator and receives milk through a tube," said Teng Inn.

The couple have another child, a 4-year-old son.

"(Yu Fei's) brother always asks for his baby sister and grandmother's whereabouts.

"I told him that she (the grandmother) is at the hospital looking after the baby," he said.

Yu Fei was born in Kuala Terengganu and was transferred to the neonatal intensive care unit of Gleneagles Hospital in Ampang for further observation.

The couple is appealing for donations to raise RM80,000 for her surgery so she can recover and live a normal life, including playing with her brother.

"We hope the baby will be healthy after the surgery.

"The donations will help us overcome the challenges that we are facing for the past few

months," said Lim.

Jobless man jailed 6 months for hitting, strangling sister

KUCHING: The Magistrates' Court here yesterday sentenced an unemployed man to six months in jail for causing hurt to his 38-year-old sister.

Magistrate Mason Jaro Lenya Barayan convicted Mohammad Adams Lee Mohammad Sanny, 32, on his own guilty plea to a charge framed under Section 323 of the Penal Code, read together with Section 326A of the same Code.

The Section carries a jail term of up to one year, or a fine of up to RM2,000, or both, upon conviction.

Mason also ordered for Mohammad Adams' jail sentence to take effect from the date of his arrest on July 24, 2023.

He committed the offence at

the family home in Petra Jaya here around 2.45pm on July 24, 2023. Based on the facts of the case, he suddenly hit his sister on the left eye and proceeded to strangle her.

The victim immediately lodged a police report, which led to Mohammad Adams' arrest on the same day around 9.55pm.

The investigations found that the sister sustained abrasions on her left cheek and a laceration wound on her left wrist.

Mohammad Adams has multiple past criminal records involving drug abuse and causing hurt to another person.

Insp Merylene Lindan Andrew Mang prosecuted the case, while Mohammad Adams was unrepresented by legal counsel.

Mosti to study teaching methods to attract PwDs into STI

KUALA LUMPUR: The Ministry of Science, Technology and Innovation (Mosti) is studying suitable teaching methods to improve learning outcomes for the Science, Technology and Innovation (STI) streams to attract persons with disabilities (PwDs).

Minister Chang Lih Kang said this was in line with the ministry's support of the PwD Policy, aimed at providing them with the equal rights and opportunities for lifelong learning in the field of STI.

"They (PwDs) should be given equal opportunities with a different approach as they have different needs.

"So we need to make some adjustments," he told reporters after launching the Special Science Day 2023 at the National Science Centre (NSC), here yesterday.

Phone scam: Ipoh senior citizen fleeced out of RM485,000

IPOH: A retiree in the Kerian district claimed to have lost RM485,000 after falling victim to a phone scam.

Perak police chief Datuk Seri Mohd Yusri Hassan Basri said the 72-year-old woman filed a police report at 11.40am on Monday.

"Initial investigations revealed that the victim was contacted by a man on Aug 4 claiming to be from a courier company.

"He alleged that the victim had sent a package containing credit cards, identity card chips and ATM cards to a recipient, and the delivery attempt was unsuccessful.

"The woman denied the claim but was connected to two individuals who posed as police officers, one from the Ipoh police headquarters and the other from Bukit Aman," he said in a statement yesterday.

Mohd Yusri said the victim was also accused of being involved in human trafficking and money laundering cases and was threatened with arrest and imprisonment.

Out of fear, the victim then made 34 transactions to 11 bank accounts provided by the suspect between Aug 8 and Sept 6.

"The victim only realised she had been deceived when a visiting relative became suspicious of her conduct as she was about to make another money transfer. She explained the situation when her family inquired and lodged a police report," he said.

The case is being investigated under Section 420 of the Penal Code. — Bernama

Sarawakian teen needs RM195,000 cell therapy to stop him going blind

KUCHING: Sarawakian Alyster Liew Tian Hao had an exciting future ahead of him.

With his excellent grades, the 13-year-old was selected to enrol in a government vocational school to pursue a music programme.

However, after attending classes for three weeks, life suddenly threw him a curveball when the Siburan boy found his vision deteriorating.

According to a news release from the Community Care Enrichment Programme (CCEP) Foundation, what was initially believed to be an eye disorder, turned out to be Leber Hereditary Optic Neuropathy (LHON), a neurodegenerative mitochondrial disease that affects the optic nerve, causing vision loss.

It said Alyster's chances of restoring his vision could only be treated with cell therapy, which costs around RM195,000.

CCEP Foundation is appealing for donations from the public to help Alyster's parents raise funds for his treatment in Selangor.

The non-profit organisation has been entrusted by Alyster's parents to handle the crowdfunding as they cannot cope with the high medical expenses.

Alyster's father Liew Sing Tau said his son was diagnosed by an ophthalmologist in August after

months of medical check-ups and consultations.

He said Alyster had been examined by ophthalmologists at two different medical centres, who confirmed that he was suffering from a neurological eye condition and recommended that he undergo further examinations and a CT scan.

"When his eyesight suddenly deteriorated in April this year, the doctor diagnosed him with optic neuritis but because of the costly treatment, we were referred to the Sarawak General Hospital (SGH).

"He received five steroid injections during his treatment at SGH but his eyesight did not improve," said Liew.

After the LHON diagnosis, Liew learnt that cell therapy was an effective treatment for Alyster's condition.

"There is a stem cell research centre in Peninsular Malaysia and after consulting with the ophthalmologists at SGH, we decided to let Alyster undergo cell therapy.

"The procedure will take place at the Shah Alam General Hospital in Selangor and at the Stem Cell Research Centre," he said.

He hoped to be able to send his son for the treatment by the end of this month.

"The specialists and doctors

have recommended three treatment sessions, with each session spaced one month apart, and estimated that the treatment costs to be RM195,000.

"It is my sincere hope that we would be able to receive some donations from the kind members of the public as the high cost of the treatment is beyond my means," he said.

Liew, 40, works as a construction site supervisor while his wife Nelida Jawa, 38, is an assistant teacher at a local Chinese kindergarten.

Besides Alyster, they have two daughters aged nine and two.

Liew said as Alyster's eyesight continued to deteriorate rapidly, he only attended three weeks of school since classes started in March.

"Alyster has not attended school for five months now, so as soon as his vision improves after treatment, we hope to send him back to school as soon as possible.

"Both my wife and I are working, so he is currently at home being taken care of by my parents," Liew said.

Headed SGH ophthalmologists have given their commitment to monitor Alyster's condition closely after he completes his cell therapy.

"I would also like to express my deepest gratitude to CCEP

Foundation for agreeing to assist in the fundraising efforts.

"I am willing to cooperate with any arrangements so long as they can help my child," he said.

CCEP Foundation chief executive officer Yee Poo Yoon said the foundation decided to take up this case as Alyster is still very young.

"If he were to lose his sight at such a tender age, it would have a significant impact on his future," she said.

She said the foundation also took into consideration that Alyster has a promising future, especially with his strong interest in music.

"He is a very talented young individual, and it would be a great loss if he were to lose his eyesight.

"CCEP empathises deeply with Alyster's situation, and we hope to raise the necessary medical funds as soon as possible to help him regain his vision and give him the opportunity to showcase his talent in the field of music," said Yee.

Senior citizens lose RM383,000 to scams

KUCHING: Two senior citizens here lost a total of RM383,000 after falling victim to separate phone scams recently.

Sarawak Police Commissioner Datuk Mohd Azman Ahmad Sapri said the first victim, a retiree in his 70s, was contacted by someone claiming to be from a courier company on Aug 24.

"During the conversation, the suspect claimed that the victim had received a parcel containing identification card and bank cards. The victim however denied the matter.

"The call was then connected to a 'policeman' from Ipoh, Perak who identified himself as 'ASP Moktar'. The 'policeman' claimed there was an arrest warrant issued in the victim's name for committing money laundering," he said in a statement.

Following that, Mohd Azman said the victim was instructed transfer money to several bank accounts for 'investigation' purposes.

"The victim proceeded to transfer money in four transactions totalling about RM103,000 to two different bank accounts at the end of August 2023.

"The victim was also instructed to delete all the WhatsApp conversations and to discard the money transfer receipts," he added.

Mohd Azman said the victim

only realised that he had been scammed after informing his family members about the matter, and subsequently lodged a police report for further investigation.

The second case involved a clerk in her 60s who received a phone call from an unknown woman claiming to be from the Ministry of Health (MoH) on Aug 10.

"During the conversation, the suspect claimed the victim had taken painkiller medications in a large quantity, which she denied.

"Following that, she was connected to a 'Sgt Azlan' – purportedly from the Perak police contingent – who told the victim that there was an arrest warrant issued in her name for committing money laundering," said Mohd Azman.

He said the victim was then instructed to make money transfers to several accounts, again for 'investigation' purposes.

"The victim transferred her money in nine transactions totalling about RM280,000 to three different bank accounts from mid-August until early September.

"She only realised she had been scammed after the individuals failed to be contacted after the last transfer was made. She then lodged a police report for further investigation," he added.

Bodies of man and grandson found floating in unused pool

SUNGAI PETANI: A daily routine for a man and his grandson turned tragic when they failed to return from their evening walk to an unused pool on Monday.

Villagers found the bodies of the 78-year-old man and his one-year-old grandson floating in the

one-metre pool in Jalan Kempas, Taman Kempas near here.

Kuala Muda OCPD Asst Comm Zaidy Che Hassan said police received a MERS 999 call informing them about the discovery of the two bodies around 7.20pm.

"A team from the Tikam Batu police station rushed to the scene and found both victims floating in the pool.

"Based on the information from an eyewitness, the bodies were pulled out from the pool by the villagers," he said in a statement yesterday.

ACP Zaidy said the father of the boy told police that his father would take the boy for a walk every day after fetching him from his mother's working place at the nearby restaurant.

"When the father of the boy noticed that both of them had not returned home by 7pm, he went out to look for them.

"During this time, he saw many people crowding around the pool. He later found out that the two bodies pulled out from the pool were his father and his son," he said.

ACP Zaidy said based on their

investigation, they found there was no foul play or any criminal elements involved in the incident.

He said both the victims who lived at Kampung Matang Berangan in Pinang Tunggai were pronounced dead by medical officers at the scene.

The bodies were later sent to the Sultan Abdul Halim Hospital for a post-mortem examination.

Kin charged with gang rape

KUALA LUMPUR: A woman's brother-in-law, who was charged with conspiring in her gang rape, is also allegedly involved in raping her, say police.

The unemployed man was initially charged on Sept 8 at a Sessions Court at the Kuala Lumpur Court Complex here with conspiring with accomplices to commit the gang rape.

Wangsa Maju OCPD Supt Ashari Abu Samah said investigations revealed the suspect was also one of the five who raped the 26-year-old victim.

"The suspect was initially charged under Section 375B of the Penal Code on Sept 8, and we will now be amending the charge to Section 376(1).

"The suspect and four others, who were arrested, will be

charged in court tomorrow," he said when contacted.

He said the five were believed to be high on drugs during the rape at a house in Wangsa Maju.

It was reported that the woman was awakened from sleep, gagged and tied up by the five men prior to the incident on Aug 30, with one of the suspects recording the attack.

On Sept 2, police arrested a 29-year-old man, who was identified as the victim's brother-in-law, in front of a restaurant in Jalan Rampai Niaga 5, Wangsa Maju.

The suspects managed to enter the house because the brother-in-law had allegedly told the victim earlier to leave the door unlocked.

The other suspects were arrested between Sept 7 and 9.

Safe space open to abuse

Suhakam releases startling find of 'rehab centre' for children

KUALA LUMPUR: It was called a drug rehabilitation centre – but it turned out to be more like an abusive detention centre, according to findings by the Human Rights Commission of Malaysia (Suhakam).

Its probe showed that inmates as young as 10 were made to eat rice with salt, fed just once a day and only allowed to sleep for between two and three hours a day.

The four children at the centre, who have since been rescued, were also not allowed to go to school.

Those who broke the rules were handed down commando-style punishments by the trainers, some of whom are on the police "wanted list", said Suhakam.

What's worse, the victim's families paid the centre for this "rehabilitation".

These were among the human rights violations found by Suhakam after its investigation into the rehabilitation centre in Bukit Beruntung in Selangor.

It started investigations in June after complaints by trainees who escaped from the centre.

Suhakam has recommended that a Special Committee be set up to oversee the operation of private rehabilitation centres after the abuse at the centre was revealed.

"There were 52 trainees between the ages of 10 and 54, and they claimed to be fed only once a day and sometimes given rice with salt.

"They were allowed to sleep between two and three hours a day and told to perform 100 *rakaat* of *sunat* prayers daily," Suhakam commissioner Prof Datuk Noor

"The families paid monthly fees of RM600. During family visits, the trainees were prevented from reporting the mistreatment to their families. If they did, they would be punished."

Aziah Mohd Awal said.

The centre had claimed to use religious teachings for its rehabilitation programmes for drug addicts and those with social problems.

It was found that the centre was illegally conducting rehabilitation programmes according to the Drug Dependents (Treatment and Rehabilitation) Act 1983 and the Mental Health Act 2001.

"According to the centre, it has four modules which consist of preaching, reading a selection of hadith, zikir, hafazan, and others.

"The programme might seem normal but our investigations showed the trainees were deprived of sleep due to the intense activities. Some were given commando-style punishment," Prof Noor Aziah told a press conference yesterday.

She said Suhakam's investigations in June included monitoring visits, recording statements from 33 witnesses, a compilation of 49 exhibits, and discussions with relevant agencies.

"According to the programme plans, the module should only last for six months with the trainees allowed to leave at the end of the session but there are trainees

who have been held there for more than four years.

"The families paid monthly fees of RM600. During family visits, the trainees were prevented from reporting the mistreatment to their families. If they did, they would be punished.

"We also found that the centre was secured using a padlock. Even during our interviews with the trainees, we were locked inside with them. The trainers claimed it was routine," she said, adding that the centre's activities violated Article 5 and Article 8 of the Federal Constitution and Article 3 to Article 7 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.

Noor Aziah added that the female dormitory, housing 12 trainees, had a zinc wall and was shielded from view using thick curtains.

She said the centres' treatment and rehabilitation programmes for the four minors were not in compliance with the Care Centres Act 1993.

"The centre's care and rehabilitation programmes for the minors are in conflict with the Children Act 2001.

"The children were not sent to

school. Section 29A (2) of the Education Act 1996 says attendance for primary education is compulsory," she said, adding that the children have now been placed with the Social Welfare Department.

Suhakam revealed that police also found out that some trainers were on the police "wanted list" and that the registration of one of the premises had expired.

The allegations of abuse first surfaced in May but it is believed the centre had refuted the claims.

Attempts have been made by *The Star* to seek clarification from the centre.

Following Suhakam's investigation, Prof Noor Aziah also outlined recommendations for the authorities to continue its investigations.

"The Social Welfare Department and Selangor Islamic Religious Council must review the registration and operation of the centre.

"Relevant agencies such as the Social Welfare Department, the Islamic Religious Council and the National Anti-Drugs Agency have to review the registration status of all such centres and monitor other registered rehabilitation centres.

Prof Noor Aziah also urged the government to establish a special committee comprising various government agencies to develop policies on the operation of private rehabilitation centres.

She also called on the public to share information and report human rights violations in any such care centres.

Update on guidelines for child cases

Current developments on laws to be included

KUALA LUMPUR: The special guidelines for handling cases on sexual offences against children will be updated to a new version in January 2024, says Minister in the Prime Minister's Department (Law and Institutional Reform) Datuk Seri Azalina Othman Said.

She said the update will take into account current developments related to the amendment of relevant laws and to keep up with information technology.

"It also takes into account the challenges faced by all the agencies and special measures introduced by the Sexual Offences Against Children (Amendment) Act 2023, Evidence of Child

Witness (Amendment) Act 2023 and other amendments to be tabled at the next Parliament session.

"The guidelines have not been updated since they were issued in 2017, so it will be addressed properly now," she told reporters after visiting the child interview centre at Bukit Aman here yesterday.

Also present was Bukit Aman Criminal Investigation Department director Datuk Seri Mohd Shuhaily Mohd Zain, Bernama reported.

Azalina said the Legal Affairs Division of the Prime Minister's Department will work with the Chief Registrar of the Federal Court office on the matter.

She said the Legal Affairs Division will also cooperate with the Communications and Digital Ministry, and Malaysian Communications and Multimedia Commission to amend the Communications and Multimedia Act 1998 (Act 588) to enact laws or mandatory industry codes to block child abuse content online.

Queried on the latest developments regarding the establishment of the Children's Commission, Azalina responded that the proposed Bill will be tabled in Parliament next month.

She said when the Children's Commission is formed, it will act as an independent body and

observer of all issues involving children.

"The Children's Commission will also become the main reference centre for the handling of undocumented and refugee children in Malaysia and could also

be a model for other countries.

"Currently, the Children's Commission comes under the purview of the Human Rights Commission of Malaysia (Suhakam) but I want it to be independent," she said.

Two duped of more than RM900,000 in phone scams

○ First victim threatened with arrest while second complainant accused of involvement in money laundering

IPOH: A private sector retiree in the Kerian district has claimed to have lost RM485,000 in a phone scam, said Perak police chief Datuk Seri Mohd Yusri Hassan Basri.

He added that the 72-year-old woman filed a report at about 11am on Monday.

"Initial investigations revealed that she was contacted by a man on Aug 4, who claimed to be from a courier company. He alleged that she had sent a package containing credit cards, identity card chips and ATM cards to a recipient and the delivery attempt was unsuccessful.

"The woman denied the claim but was connected to two individuals who posed as

police officers, one from the Ipoh police headquarters and the other from Bukit Aman."

Mohd Yusri said she was also accused of being involved in human trafficking and money laundering cases, then threatened with arrest and imprisonment.

Out of fear, she made 34 transactions to 11 bank accounts provided by the suspect between Aug 8 and Sept 6.

"The woman only realised she had been deceived when a visiting relative became suspicious as she was about to make another money transfer. She explained the situation when her family inquired and lodged a report."

In another case, a private sector employee lost RM473,225 of her Tabung Haji and Amanah Saham savings to phone scam syndicate members who impersonated an insurance agent, police officer and a lawyer.

Mohd Yusri said the 55-year-old woman from Bercham lodged a report on Monday after realising the syndicate had been duping her since January, Bernama reported.

"The woman received a call on Jan 25 from someone posing as an insurance agent, asking if she had received RM78,000 in insurance claims.

"About a week later, she received another call from someone claiming to be an officer from the Ampang Jaya district police headquarters, asking her to lodge a report to claim the insurance payout."

He said the woman was then connected to another individual impersonating a lawyer, who informed her that she was involved in a money laundering case.

On Feb 3, two other individuals called the woman and instructed her to withdraw her funds, following which she withdrew RM458,000 from her Amanah Saham and Tabung Haji accounts and transferred the money into her bank account.

"She also deposited RM35,000 in five transactions into three accounts on the instructions of one of the callers, purportedly to settle a compound for her 'criminal offence'.

"On Aug 25, the woman received a notice from her bank that there were 17 transactions totalling RM438,225 from her account to several unknown accounts between Feb 9 and March 28."

Mohd Yusri said both cases are being investigated under Section 420 of the Penal Code for cheating.

KUALA LUMPUR: Kementerian Sains, Teknologi dan Inovasi (MOSTI) akan mengkaji kaedah untuk menambah baik pembelajaran dalam aliran Sains, Teknologi dan Inovasi (STI) bagi menarik minat kanak-kanak orang kurang upaya (OKU).

Menteri berkenaan Chang Lih Kang berkata ia selari dengan sokongan MOSTI terhadap Dasar OKU yang memberi hak dan peluang kepada semua lapisan masyarakat termasuk golongan berkenaan untuk menerima pendidikan sepanjang hayat dalam bidang STI.

“Mereka (OKU) per-

lu diberi peluang yang sama... mungkin pendekatan itu perlu berbeza sedikit kerana mereka ada kelainan, misalnya alat (kaedah) yang kita pameran dan program yang kita persembahkan mungkin ada sedikit penyesuaian,” katanya selepas melancarkan Hari Istimewa Sains 2023 di Pusat Sains Negara (PSN) di sini semalam.

Turut hadir Timbalan Ketua Setiausaha (Perancangan dan Pembudayaan Sains) MOSTI Ruziah Shafei dan Pengarah Pusat Sains Negara Mismah Jimbun.

Chang turut membuka ruang kepada pakar dalam

bidang berkenaan untuk memberikan pandangan mengenai menambah baik kaedah pembelajaran dalam STI kepada golongan OKU.

Sementara itu, Chang berkata Hari Istimewa Sains tahun ini yang bertemakan ‘Eksplorasi Citra Alam’ mendapat sambutan lebih 1,000 peserta daripada kalangan kanak-kanak OKU.

Program selama dua hari itu menyediakan aktiviti seperti kreatif hands-on, demonstrasi sains, persembahan anak-anak OKU, bengkel permainan sensori dan eksplorasi alam. — Bernama

Penganggur dipenjara enam bulan kerana cederakan kakak

KUCHING: Mahkamah Majistret di sini semalam menjatuhkan hukuman penjara enam bulan ke atas seorang penganggur kerana menyebabkan kecederaan kepada kakaknya.

Mohammad Adams Lee Mohammad Sanny, 32 mengaku bersalah bagi pertuduhan di bawah Seksyen 323 Kanun Keseksaan, dibaca bersama Seksyen 326A Kanun Keseksaan di hadapan Majistret Mason Jaro Lenya Barayan.

Mason Jaro turut mengarahkan hukuman penjara itu berkuat kuasa dari tarikh Mohammad Adams ditangkap iaitu 24 Julai 2023.

Seksyen itu menetapkan hukuman penjara sehingga satu tahun atau denda hingga RM2,000 atau kedua-duanya jika sabit kesalahan.

Tertuduh melakukan kesalahan itu di rumah keluarga mereka di Lorong Petra Jaya, Jalan Astana Petra Jaya dekat sini sekitar 2.45 petang, 24 Julai 2023.

Berdasarkan fakta kes, tertuduh dengan tiba-tiba memukul mata kiri kakaknya sebelum mencekik mangsa.

Rentetan serangan itu, mangsa terus membuat laporan polis yang membawa kepada penahanan tertuduh pada hari sama sekitar 9.55 malam.

Siasatan mendapati kakaknya mengalami luka melecet di pipi kiri begitu juga di pergelangan tangan kirinya.

Tertuduh juga mempunyai beberapa rekod jenayah lampau, melibatkan penyalahgunaan dadah serta menyebabkan kecederaan kepada orang lain.

Pendakwaan kes dikendalikan Inspektor Merylene Lindan Andrew Mang manakala tertuduh tidak diwakili peguam.

Pesara wanita di Kerian kerugian RM485,000 ditipu 'phone scam'

IPOH: Seorang wanita warga emas di daerah Kerian mengalami kerugian RM485,000 akibat terperdaya dengan penipuan panggilan telefon atau 'phone scam' yang menyamar sebagai pegawai polis.

Ketua Polis Perak Datuk Seri Mohd Yusri Hassan Basri berkata wanita berusia 72 tahun itu yang merupakan seorang pesara swasta, membuat laporan polis pada pukul 11.40 pagi semalam.

"Hasil siasatan awal mendapati mangsa telah dihubungi oleh seorang lelaki pada 4 Ogos lalu, yang mendakwa dari sebuah syarikat penghantaran kononnya mangsa ada membuat penghantaran bungkusan yang tidak berjaya dihantar kepada penerima.

"Suspek turut memaklumkan bungkusan tersebut mengandungi kad kredit, cip kad pengenalan dan kad ATM. Mangsa bagaimanapun menafikan perkara tersebut.

"Mangsa kemudiannya telah disambungkan panggilan kepada dua individu yang menyamar sebagai pegawai polis masing-masing dari Ibu Pejabat Polis Ipoh dan Bukit Aman," katanya dalam satu kenyataan semalam.

Mohd Yusri berkata mangsa telah diperdaya dengan dituduh terlibat berkaitan kes pemerdagangan manusia dan penggubahan wang haram, serta diugut akan ditangkap dan dipenjarakan.

"Mangsa yang ketakutan kemudiannya telah bertindak mengikut arahan yang diberikan oleh suspek, dengan memindahkan kesemua wang milik mangsa ke dalam akaun yang diberikan suspek, bagi mengelakkan daripada wang mangsa dirampas dan dibekukan," katanya.

Mohd Yusri berkata suspek turut berjanji untuk memulangkan wang tersebut setelah siasatan selesai dan suspek turut mengarahkan mangsa untuk tidak memaklumkan perkara ini kepada sesiapa, kononnya bagi mengelakkan siasatan terganggu.

"Bermula 8 Ogos sehingga 6 September lalu, mangsa telah melakukan sebanyak 34 kali pindahan wang di mesin ATM sekitar daerah Kerian dan Nibong Tebal di Pulau Pinang ke dalam 11 akaun bank milik seorang individu.

"Mangsa hanya menyedari telah ditipu setelah perbuatan mangsa tersebut dicurigai oleh anak saudara, yang datang melawat sewaktu mangsa ingin keluar membuat pindahan wang berikutnya dan menceritakan segalanya setelah didesak oleh keluarga dan membuat laporan polis," katanya.

Beliau berkata kes disiasat di bawah Seksyen 420 Kanun Keseksaan dan siasatan masih diteruskan. — Bernama
