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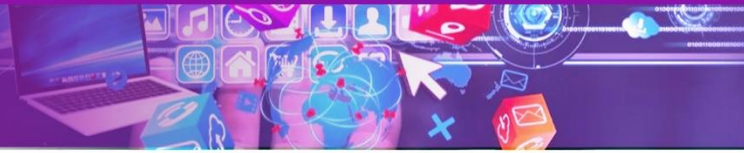

KHDC promosi pelancongan, pelihara busana tradisional

Kuala Lumpur: Seramai 500 pereka fesyen peserta dari negara Asia Tenggara, bakal berentap dalam Pertandingan Rekaan Warisan Kebaya (KHDC) bagi menyrlahkan kreativiti masing-masing dalam bidang itu, pada 9 September depan.

Selain Malaysia, pertandingan dianjurkan Persidangan dan Pameran Antarabangsa Budaya Dunia 2023 (ICWC '23) itu turut membariskan pereka dari Indonesia, Singapura, Thailand dan Brunei.

Pertandingan ini akan membawa impak besar dalam memupuk kesedaran global terhadap warisan kebaya.

Ia juga dapat meningkatkan peluang tersenarai dalam carta warisan budaya Pertubuhan Pendidikan Kebudayaan dan Saintifik Pertubuhan Bangsa-Bangsa Bersatu (UNESCO), pada tahun hadapan.

Justeru, KHDC sebagai platform mempromosi pelancongan kebudayaan dan memelihara busana tradisional untuk generasi akan datang, selain menekankan sejarah kebaya sejak awal perkembangannya bermula 1910 hingga kini.

Timbalan Menteri Pelancongan, Seni dan Budaya, Khai-

rul Firdaus Akhbar Khan, berkata pertandingan itu dapat mengiktiraf kepentingan budaya, melindunginya daripada pupus ditelan zaman dan meluaskan budaya Malaysia ke luar negara.

Ia juga menunjukkan inisiatif kerjasama dengan negara jiran dalam mengukuhkan hubungan dua hala.

"Saya menghargai semua yang mengambil bahagian da-

lam KHDC kerana ia dapat meluaskan lagi jaringan pasaran pelancongan, kesenian, dan budaya Malaysia, katanya ketika berucap pada pelancaran KHDC, di Kompleks Kraf, baru-baru ini.

Azmi berkata, KHDC menjadi platform pereka memaparkan hasil kreativiti dan menceritakan identiti, keunikan gaya dan rekaan kebaya dari perspektif berliman budaya.

Beri impak positif

Selain industri fesyen, pertandingan ini turut memberi impak positif terhadap pasaran pelancongan.

"Kami yakin sebagai sebuah pasukan, mampu menekankan kepentingan memelihara, melindungi warisan Malaysia dan memberi impak positif kepada generasi muda," katanya.

Penyertaan dibuka sejak 15 Jun lalu dan peserta perlu meng-

hantar lakaran rekaan mereka sebelum 30 Julai menerusi platform dalam talian.

"Pada masa terdekat, kami juga akan pergi ke beberapa negara terbabit untuk mempromosikan pertandingan ini, sekali gus menarik minat pereka fesyen negara luar untuk mengikut KHDC.

Katanya, 50 finalis dari setiap negara akan memaparkan rekaan kebaya mereka di ICWC pada awal September bersama dengan butiran persembahan, maklumat dan kepentingan budaya yang membawa kepada rekaan akhir.

"Negara yang terbabit, juri selebriti dan pengunjung akan menilai rekaan itu dan berkongsi maklum balas menentukan pemenang.

"Untuk pusingan akhir, 25 finalis dari setiap negara akan menyertai Majlis Makan Malam Gala ICWC, pada 9 September untuk acara pertunjukan fesyen dan penyampaian anugerah kepada pemenang," katanya.

Juara akan membawa pulang wang tunai sebanyak 23,350 (USD 5,000); kedua RM14,000 (USD3,000) dan ketiga RM9,304 (USD2,000).

Orang ramai diminta bantu jejak i ibu bapa Rayyan Farhan

Putrajaya: Helah suami isteri yang mengatakan mahu ke klinik dan meninggalkan bayi lelaki dengan seorang jiran di FELDA Sungai Behrang di Slim River, Perak pada 11 tahun lalu mengakibatkan kanak-kanak itu berdepan masalah dokumentasi, sekali gus sukar memperoleh pendidikan formal.

Pelindung Pejabat Kebajikan Masyarakat (JKM) Daerah Sepang, Siti Fairuz Dul Wahab, berkata Rayyan Farhan, 11, ditinggalkan ibu bapanya dengan seorang jiran, Sariyah Marhusin ketika usianya masih 12 hari.

Beliau berkata, hasil siasatan mendapati ibu bapa kanak-kanak berkenaan baru berpindah seminggu ke kawasan itu dan memberi alasan untuk ke klinik bagi mendapatkan rawatan isterinya dan meninggalkan bayi malang itu tanpa sebarang dokumen.

Katanya, ibu angkat kanak-kanak itu memaklumkan bapa kanak-kanak berkenaan bekerja sebagai tukang rumah dan kurang pasti, sama ada warga

asing atau tempatan.

“JKM memohon bantuan orang ramai untuk mengesan ibu bapa Rayyan Farhan bagi tujuan hak penjagaan, dokumentasi dan persekolahan,” katanya.

Siti Fairuz berkata, sejak ditinggalkan, ibu bapa Rayyan Farhan tidak pernah muncul untuk mencari anaknya dan masih tinggal dengan Sariyah sehingga

hari ini.

Katanya, waris kanak-kanak diminta tampil bagi memudahkan pihaknya membuat permohonan hak penjagaan di mahkamah dan proses seterusnya bagi masa depan Rayyan Farhan.

“Orang ramai yang mempunyai maklumat boleh menghubungi JKM Sepang di 03-87061026,” katanya.

Wanita kena kuasai seni pertahanan diri

Asas keselamatan aspek penting wajar dikuasai lindungi daripada sasaran penjenayah

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Kuala Lumpur: Memiliki kemahiran seni mempertahankan diri bukanlah 'tiket' atau menjadikan seseorang wanita itu kebal daripada menjadi mangsa jenayah. Apa yang lebih penting mengetahui cara betul untuk melindungi diri, selain cakna terhadap kemungkinan risiko, terutama ketika berada di tempat awam. Aktivis masyarakat, Kaanthini Thedchanamoorthy, 45, berkata ramai wanita alpa mengenai aspek keselamatan diri dan perkara ini antara faktor menyebabkan mereka menjadi sasaran mudah penjenayah.

"Yang penting adalah memper-

kasa wanita supaya mereka tahu bagaimana cara melindungi diri, tanpa perlu bergantung kepada orang lain.

"Tak perlu wajib kuasai kemahiran taekwando untuk elak jadi mangsa, apa lebih penting tahu apa langkah perlu diambil jika berpotensi jadi mangsa jenayah jalanan, sentiasa peka dan mampu bertindak pantas supaya tidak berdepan risiko kecederaan," katanya ketika ditemui pada program Women's Street Crime Awareness Campaign 2023 anjuran Road Safety Marshal Club (RSMC), di KL Gateway, baru-baru ini.

Wanita berkeluarga dan bekerja dalam bidang perbankan itu turut berkata, asas keselamatan adalah aspek penting yang perlu dikuasai wanita.

"Saya sendiri tak pernah belajar apa-apa seni mempertahankan diri, sebaliknya hanya mempelajari mekanisme untuk melindungi diri daripada ancaman jenayah.

"Apa yang kita perlu tahu mengelakkan risiko jenayah. Contohnya, jika tinggal di kawasan sunyi, tindakan wajar yang perlu diambil kira adalah

soal keselamatan diri.

"Bagi wanita bekerja umpamanya, elakkan keluar terlalu awal atau lewat malam berseorangan. Jika memandu sendiri ke pejabat, disarankan supaya kerap tukar laluan ke tempat kerja. Ini antara aspek keselamatan yang perlu dititikberatkan," katanya.

Berkongsi pengalaman peribadinya menjadi mangsa ragut kira-kira 10 tahun lalu, katanya, kejadian itu berlaku sekelip mata dan memberi kesedaran untuk lebih berwaspada di jalanan.

Didatangi kumpulan peragut

Kaanthini berkata, beliau dihampiri sekumpulan lelaki bersenjatakan pisau ketika menuju keretanya.

"Saya pasti ramai (sebelum ini) fikir peragut akan datang dengan motosikal, tetapi lain pula jadi pada saya. Saya didatangi sekumpulan peragut yang menaiki kereta.

"Seorang daripada mereka datang ke kereta saya kononnya nak bertanya jalan, namun tiba-tiba dia mengeluarkan pisau. Kemudian dua orang lagi rakan mereka keluar dari kenderaan.



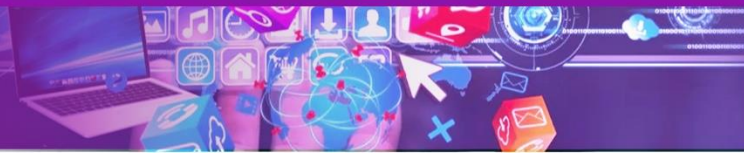

"Saya baru sedar ketika itu, mereka ini nak meragut. Jadi, saya ambil rantai yang dipakai dan terus campak ke jalan. Pada masa itu saya segera lari kerana sedar niat mereka bukan saya sebagai sasaran, tetapi nak mendapatkan barang kemas.

"Inilah yang patut wanita cakna, memang kita hilang harta yang berharga, tetapi itu lebih baik daripada cuba bergelut de-

ngan penjenayah ini dan akhirnya mungkin menyebabkan kecederaan," katanya.

Justeru, beliau juga aktivis RSMC menggalakkan wanita mengikuti kegiatan kesukarelawanan berkaitan keselamatan supaya dapat memberi ilmu dan membina keyakinan supaya sentiasa bersiap siaga dalam mendepani apa juga risiko terutama jenayah jalanan.

Kepala Batas: Kementerian Pembangunan Wanita, Keluarga dan Masyarakat (KPWKM) menggalakkan syarikat swasta menubuhkan pusat jagaan warga emas di negara ini, bagi memberi pilihan kepada keluarga berkemampuan menghantar ibu bapa mereka di pusat tersebut.

Menterinya Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri berkata langkah berkenaan dilihat berseesuaian, kerana pusat jagaan itu menawarkan perkhidmatan penjagaan berkualiti dan terbaik, kepada golongan berkenaan.

“Sebenarnya ada pusat jagaan warga emas ini bukan sahaja untuk golongan itu, malah untuk orang kelainan upaya (OKU) juga, mereka juga memerlukan penjagaan rapi sebab itu kita galakkan lebih banyak pusat jagaan swasta dibuka, untuk memberi pilihan kepada

orang ramai.

“Anak-anak yang bekerja dan berkemampuan, mereka mahu hantar ibu bapa atau ahli keluarga ke pusat jagaan ketika (mereka) bekerja, kerana yakin penjagaan rapi yang baik di situ dan sebenarnya inilah ‘care’ ekonomi yang bagus kita harap ia diperluaskan,” katanya kepada pemberita di sini semalam.

Terdahulu beliau mengadakan lawatan kerja di Pusat Jagaan Damai Permai, di sini dan terdapat seramai 54 penghuni di pusat jagaan perkhidmatan berbayar milik persendirian itu.

Nancy berkata ketika ini terdapat 393 pusat penja-

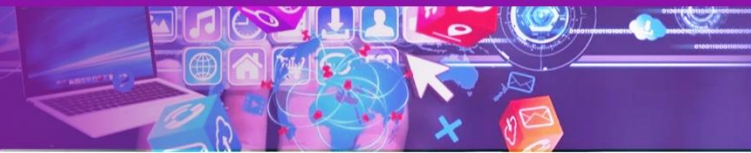
gaan warga emas di seluruh negara, berdaftar di bawah Akta Pusat Jagaan 1993.

Namun beliau berkata jumlah itu dianggap masih rendah, memandangkan ramai yang memerlukan dan mahu menggunakan perkhidmatan itu ketika ini.

“Kalau pusat jagaan warga emas bawah kerajaan dan Jabatan Kebajikan Masyarakat (JKM) memang ada dah, ia wujud lama di bawah kita, namun bagi anak-anak yang mempunyai kemampuan untuk mendapatkan perkhidmatan yang lebih baik, akan memilih untuk menghantar ibu bapa mereka ke institusi penjagaan swasta,” katanya.

Cops nab man for allegedly hitting 91-year-old mum in the face

BINTULU: Police have arrested a man for allegedly hitting his 91-year-old mother at a longhouse in Selangau.

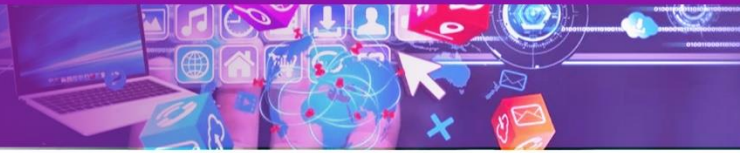
Mukah police chief DSP Muhamad Rizal Alias said the 60-year-old suspect was detained at 3pm Sunday to assist with the investigation.

He said on July 16, a 26-second video showing a man hitting an old woman with his hands went viral on Facebook.

After further inspection, he said the police found the incident happened on July 14 at a longhouse in Selangau.

"Following the police report, the Mukah police headquarters opened investigation papers under Section 323 of the Penal Code and Section 18A of the Domestic Violence Act 1994," Muhamad Rizal said in a statement yesterday.

He revealed that the victim suffered injuries to her face and received treatment at the Selangau Health Clinic before being brought to Sibu Hospital for further treatment.

Establish more senior care centres, minister urges private sector

KEPALA BATAS: The Women, Family and Community Development Ministry (KPWK) has called on organisations, especially from the private sector, to establish more senior care centres in the country to provide options to families who can afford such facilities.

Minister Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri said these centres could also offer support to people with disabilities (PWD) as they too need close monitoring.

"Working adults would prefer to send their aged parents or family members to such centres when

they are working because they are confident their loved ones will be well taken care of," she told reporters during a visit to the privately-owned Damai Permai Care Centre here yesterday, which houses about 54 residents.

She said there are 393 elderly care centres in Malaysia registered under the Care Centres Act 1993, however, it is still low considering the number of people who currently need or want such services.

"No doubt we already have elderly care centres under the Department of Social Welfare,

but adult children who can afford it would prefer to send their parents to private facilities," she said.

"In some cases, aged parents are sent for daycare to places like Damai Permai Care Centre. People who live in Kedah but work in Penang send their parents to be looked after here every day," she said.

She praised the management of the care centre for providing daily and monthly care services, particularly for the elderly and the disabled.

"Based on observation, I feel

this centre is among the best in terms of cleanliness and conducive environment for senior citizens. We hope it can be a role model for those intending to establish such care centres," she said.

Nancy, who was on a one-day work visit to Penang, also visited families under the Ziarah Kasih Programme and the Pokok Machang Children's Activity Centre (PAKK), near here before officiating at the Anjung Kasih accommodation for patients' next of kin at the Seberang Jaya Hospital. — Bernama

copies of their documents to the victims.

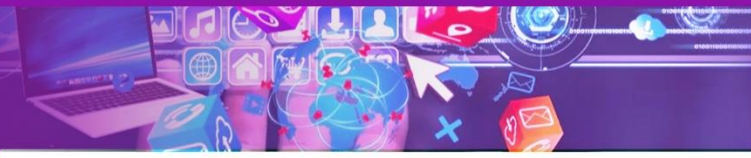
Accompanying Lee were Cr Nicholas Toh and KK Mohd Suhaimi Obeng.

"In fact, our society needs more community service volunteers with empathy and compassion to reach out to those in need.

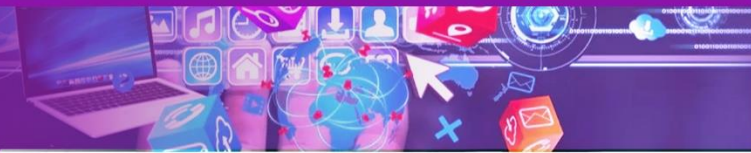

A child may be suffering right this minute

PETALING JAYA: While the case of abused Down syndrome teenager Bella may have culminated with her abuser and former caretaker serving a prison sentence, cases of child abuse and negligence have never ceased.

On July 8, a 31-year-old man was arrested over the death of his girlfriend's three year-old son in Cheng, Melaka.

The man was said to have kicked and beaten up the three-year-old for staining a sofa at his home.

Another toddler, aged one year and 11 months, suffered multiple injuries to her face and back after being abused, allegedly by her mother's boyfriend in Setapak.

Wangsa Maju deputy OCPD Deputy Supt D. Saralathan said it had received a distress call about the incident at around 5.05pm on June 8.

Several cases of children losing their lives after being left in cars have also been reported time and again.

In April last year, a 10-year-old girl died after she was pinned underneath a reversing car in Kuala Ketil, Kedah.

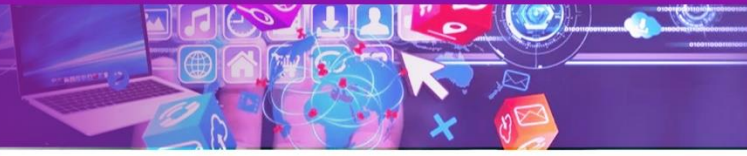
The girl was allegedly playing in the family car with her younger brother and had released the handbrake. She then stood behind the car to stop the car from reversing.

Women, Family and Community Development Minister Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri said on March 27 that a total of 828 male and 743 female children were physically abused in 2019. In 2022, there were 679 cases involving boys and 622 cases involving girls.

A total of 336 abuse cases between 2021 and 2022 happened at both registered and non-registered kindergartens and daycare centres, she had told Parliament.

On May 18, Children's Commissioner (CC) Dr Farah Nini Dusuki urged the public to support government agencies by reporting unlicensed or unregistered childcare centres to the Social Welfare Department.

She said this was in light of the "alarming" and "deeply disturbing" spate of child abuse or neglect cases allegedly perpetrated by childcare providers or babysitters.

Existing child protection laws are enough, says Nancy

GEORGE TOWN: When his daughter kicked up a fuss about going to the nursery, Remi (not his real name) thought it was normal for a child to get cranky when trying to get used to a new environment.

The girl, who was about eight months old, would start crying when she reached the nursery's door in George Town every morning. "She refused to get out of the car. We thought it was normal for a young child to behave this way

at a new place or maybe she was not feeling well.

"We did not suspect anything amiss," said the civil servant in his 30s.

Two weeks later, Remi received a video clip from an anonymous person via WhatsApp.

His daughter was apparently slapped by a member of the nursery staff.

"I was shocked and immediately lodged a police report," he said, adding that the case is now under police investigation.

Remi said he and his wife were traumatised by the incident in June last year. His mother now

helps to care for his daughter.

"I hope something can be done to alleviate things like this. The government should make it mandatory for all nurseries to install closed-circuit television cameras so that we working parents can have peace of mind," he said.

Women, Family and Community Development Minister Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri, when asked to comment, said existing laws were adequate to protect children in the country.

She said these laws include the Child Act 2001 (Act 611), which can be used to protect, rehabilitate and care for children.

She also cited other laws like the Sexual Offences Against Children Act 2017 (Act 792) and the Evidence of Child Witness Act 2007 (Act 676) that were related to the protection of children.

"There are also laws that can be used against negligent parents or caretakers such as Section 31 of the Child Act 2001.

"Health personnel, family members, caretakers, guardians and anyone within the community can inform the authorities if they come across abuse victims," she said during a visit to the Pokok Machang Children's Activity Centre (PAKK) in Tasek Gelugor on

the Penang mainland yesterday.

They could also call Talian Kasih 15999, WhatsApp 019-261 5999 or inform the nearest Welfare Department, police station or hospital, she added.

During the visit, Nancy presented a mock cheque for RM117,000 to all five PAKK and five Children's Protection Teams (PPKK) in Penang.

There are currently 142 PAKK and 140 PPKK in the country.

Also present were the ministry's secretary-general Datuk Dr Maziah Che Yusoff and Welfare Department director-general Norazman Othman.

RM64,000 lost to 'AI investment scheme'

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JOHOR BARU: It was a bitter pill to swallow for a housewife who got cheated out of her savings of over RM64,000 after falling for an online investment scheme that claimed to use artificial intelligence (AI) to give her high returns.

The 61-year-old, known only as Tan, said she thought she was being clever by taking a few months to observe the scheme after first coming across it in March.

"I had prior experience in stock trading. I learned about the scheme from a Facebook advertisement and out of curiosity, I clicked on it and it led me to download an app.

"I wanted to give the app a try as it claimed to provide accurate insider information and used AI to source background information on stocks and investment portfolios in order to save us from having to do this ourselves.

"I was contacted via WhatsApp by someone who claimed to be an agent, telling me that I could easily earn about RM700 just by signing my attendance in the app daily and observing the situation if I was still hesitant.

"So, I signed my attendance daily for about three months and was promised RM732. However, I was told I had to enter my particulars by signing up for an account in the app to get my

hands on the money," said Tan who did what she was told.

She said the agent then started to persuade her more fervently about joining the scheme, for which she was promised over RM70,000 with an investment of RM50,000.

Tan said strangers trying to allay her concerns also contacted her via WhatsApp, claiming they knew her from the app.

"Thinking their testimonials were true, I decided to dig into my savings to join the scheme.

"I deposited money from May 23 until July 12, with amounts varying between RM2,000 and RM7,000 each time until this came up to more than RM64,000.

lated her "contract" and had to make a final deposit of RM7,840 to cash out all her earnings of more than RM80,000.

"After I deposited that amount, everything was wiped out from my account in the app, including my personal information and the people who had contacted me.

"I am under a lot of stress because the money I forked out was what I have saved up over the years. I cannot believe that it is all gone.

"It was my retirement fund and the 'coffin money' for my funeral when I am gone one day," lamented Tan, adding that she then sought help from Kluang MCA public complaints bureau chief Joan Ng.

Ng said with many elderly people using social media, they had become easy targets for scam syndicates using new tactics.

"They use buzzwords like AI and ChatGPT, and operate with a group of people to slowly reel their victims in," she added.

Johor police chief Comm Datuk Kamarul Zaman Mamat reminded people to use the website to check the legitimacy of the bank accounts.

"Do not be influenced by online advertisements that promise things that seem too good to be true," he said.

Those who suspect they have been cheated can call the Johor police hotline at 07-221 2999 or head to the nearest station.

"I should have known better because the accounts I deposited money into were different each time - from company accounts to personal accounts of people unknown to me," said Tan, who is from Kluang.

Using the <https://semakmule.rmp.gov.my/> website, a check by *The Star* on one of the so-called company bank accounts Tan deposited into showed a "Warning" alert with six police reports lodged against it.

Another account showed the same alert with eight police reports lodged against it.

Tan said she only realised she had fallen victim when the agent told her she had supposedly vio-

Share more on child abuse

Groups: Govt should hold roadshows to create greater awareness

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PETALING JAYA: Despite having laws in place to combat child abuse and negligence, such cases continue to happen because parents, guardians and, to a certain extent, teachers do not know what is considered as abuse and negligence, say stakeholders.

Some are unaware of the consequences of their actions and the fact that they are punishable by law.

They also said the government must come up with a standard operating procedure (SOP) for kindergartens on child safety and protection from abuse and negligence.

Suriana Welfare Society chairman Dr James Nayagam said his findings through his social work, especially in People's Housing Projects (PPR), showed that many residents and community leaders were unaware of child abuse until the seriousness of it was conveyed to them.

"The situation simply shows that the message of child abuse has not reached the community. That is why it is happening. Even though you have the law and there are punishments, to them, these are only on paper.

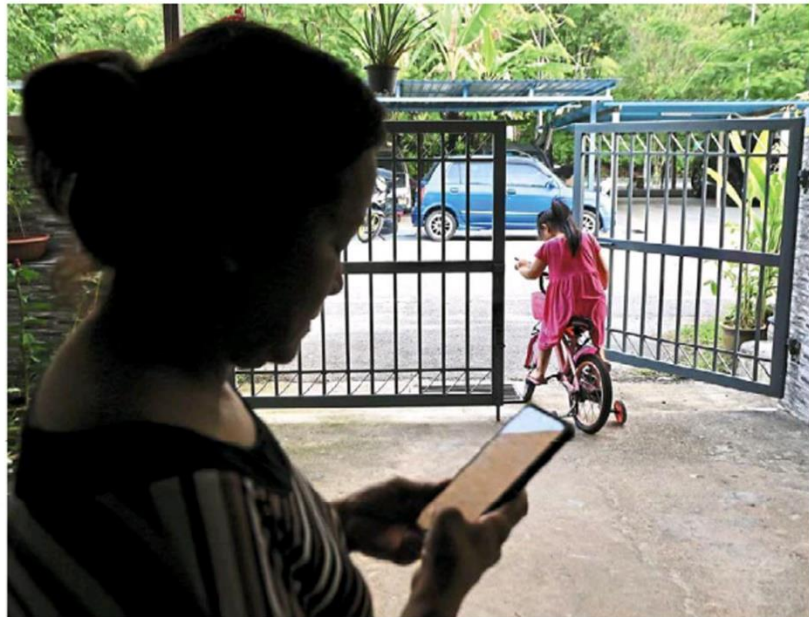
"As long as they are uninformd, these things will keep occurring because of low awareness," he said.

Nayagam called on the government to conduct roadshows and mobilise people to the ground to create awareness of such abuse.

"If the government is facing a manpower crunch, it should outsource the job and work with non-governmental organisations which have the expertise to do so and monitor the situation on the ground," he said.

Having conducted audits on kindergartens, Nayagam said many did not have SOP on aspects like child safety, prevention of abuse and discipline of staff, adding that the SOP in place was generally confined to management as well as fire and building safety.

"Most kindergartens are not audited for the safety of the children. The danger is that they sweep things under the carpet," he said.

He urged the government to come up with SOP in this area "without delay".

Nayagam was asked to comment on laws to protect children in light of recent cases of abuse or neglect, and what more could be

done to ensure their safety in schools and at home.

Last week, a kindergarten teacher in Ipoh claimed trial to a charge of leaving a child without reasonable supervision that led to the four-year-old boy's death five days after he fell into a swimming pool in April.

Also in Ipoh last week, two day-care teachers were accused of intentionally causing physical harm to five children while a day-care owner was accused of leaving a two-year-old girl unattended, which led to an injury. All three pleaded not guilty in court.

Earlier this month in Melaka, a man was arrested after his girlfriend's three-year-old son, who was reportedly sick at the time, died after he allegedly kicked and beaten up the child for vomiting on his favourite sofa.

Malaysian Kindergarten Teachers Association national president Sally Ng agreed that there must be documented guide-

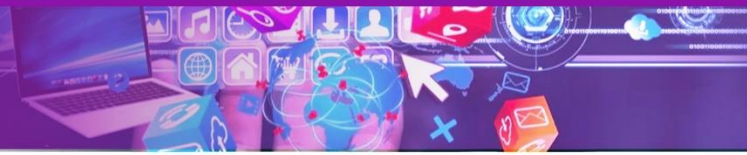
lines on the safety aspects, although qualified teachers of early childhood had gone through courses on laws such as the Child Act, detection of abuse as well as safety.

She added that principals and kindergarten operators would also inform staff of the dos and don'ts, the laws and the punishments.

"Principals and teachers need to learn to recognise and identify abuse, neglect, learning disorders and others disabilities which are not so visible.

"We are responsible and legally required to take action and report our suspicions to the proper authorities, although situations like these are challenging for all parties involved," she said, adding that some might choose not to act due to fear or to avoid complications.

Ng reminded parents to make sure that they enrolled their children in registered kindergartens.

○ Rape victims required to make police report before medical examination to ensure procedure is legal, proper: Lawyer

KUALA LUMPUR: Rape victims have to make a police report first before a medical examination is carried out as the procedure is mandated by law, said lawyer Kokila Vaani Vadiveloo.

She was commenting on a statement by Women, Family and Community Development Minister Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri on Sunday, who recommended that the Health Ministry consider permitting victims to undergo a medical examination before making a police report of an alleged rape.

Nancy said she was making the recommendation considering the traumatic situation faced by rape victims.

"Since the report and rape kit must be administered within 72 hours, our recommendation is that the victim gets a medical examination first and then be left to decide whether to make a police report or not," she said.

However, Kokila said Section 376 of the Penal Code 1952 sets out the procedures for dealing with rape victims.

She added that the law states: "No medical

officer shall conduct a medical examination on a person who alleges that she has been raped unless a police report has been made in respect of the alleged rape."

She said the law was enacted to ensure the medical examination is conducted in a legal and orderly manner. The police need to be involved in the process to ensure that evidence is properly collected and preserved.

"However, there are some exceptions to this. If the victim is under 18 years, she does not need to file a police report before she can have a medical examination.

"This is because the law recognises that children are especially vulnerable to abuse, and they need to be able to access the medical help they require without having to go through the trauma of filing a police report."

Kokila said there are additional reasons the law generally requires a police report to be made first by an alleged rape victim.

"Apart from complying with Section 376 of the Penal Code, police need to take a written statement from the alleged victim to investigate the crime and build a case.

"Police also have to act quickly on the report to detain the perpetrator as medical evidence could be collected from (the suspect's) clothing

and body.

"The medical examination of the perpetrator may also provide important evidence, such as DNA samples, which could be used to conclusively identify, charge and prosecute the perpetrator during the trial."

Kokila said police also need to protect the victim from further harm, adding that as the medical examination can be a traumatic experience, they want to ensure the victim is safe and supported.

If police believe there is enough evidence, the perpetrator will be charged with rape. The case will be prosecuted in court and the alleged victim called to testify.

However, she also said the current procedure presented some challenges. For example, it can be difficult for victims to come forward and report the crime, especially if they are afraid of retaliation or being stigmatised as rape victims.

Kokila said the current procedures in Malaysia for handling rape reports are generally fine.

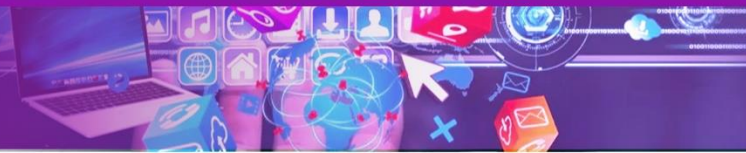
"The procedures provide for a victim-friendly approach, which is important to ensure

rape victims feel comfortable coming forward and reporting the crime."

She said the procedures also provide for medical and psychological assistance, which can be essential to help victims cope with the trauma of rape. However, there are some areas where the procedures could be improved, she added.

"The training of police officers on how to handle rape reports could be improved. There could also be more support available for victims, such as counselling and even financial assistance.

"Overall, the procedures in place for handling rape reports in Malaysia are good, but there needs to be an improvement in the manner in which police officers speak with the victim. Perhaps more compassion is required so the victim does not feel intimidated by the line of questioning."

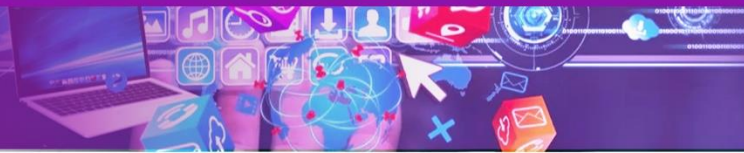

Jurucakap Pusat Gerakan Operasi, Jabatan Bomba dan Penyelamat Malaysia (JBPM) Sarawak memberitahu, pihaknya menerima panggilan kecemasan daripada Ibu Pejabat Polis Daerah (IPD) Sri Aman berhubung laporan kejadian sekitar jam 1.56 petang.

Menurutnya sebaik menerima laporan, sepasukan anggota dari Balai Bomba dan Penyelamat (BBP) Sri Aman bergegas ke lokasi.

Apabila tiba di lokasi kejadian katanya, pasukan bomba mendapati berlaku kemalangan melibatkan sebuah van yang melanggar belakang sebuah lori tanah yang diparkir di tepi jalan.

Jelasnya, mangsa yang dikenali sebagai Tan Kok Sun tersepit di tempat duduk pemandu van berkenaan.

"Pasukan bomba dengan peralatan perlindungan diri (PPE) lengkap telah menggunakan peralatan penyelamat bagi mengeluarkan mangsa yang tersepit di tempat duduk pemandu.

"Bagaimanapun, setelah mangsa berjaya dikeluarkan, mangsa disahkan meninggal di tempat kejadian oleh pihak Kementerian Kesihatan Malaysia," katanya dalam satu kenyataan semalam.

Tambahnya, mayat mangsa diserahkan kepada pihak polis untuk tindakan selanjutnya.

kejadian, pasukan bomba mendapati sebuah rumah kediaman jenis tidak kekal satu tingkat terbakar 100 peratus.

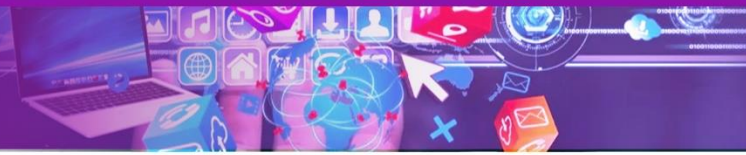

“Punca sebenar kebakaran dan jumlah kerugian ditanggung mangsa masih dalam siasatan,” jelasnya.
