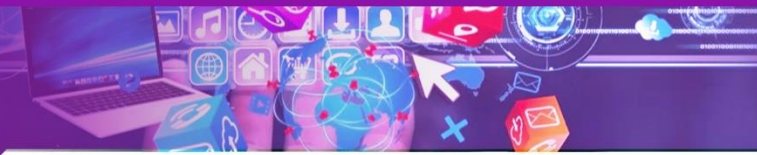

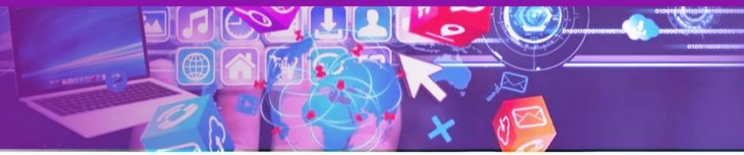

SVI 9S yang tidak mempunyai rekod perakuan Sirim, wang tunai berjumlah RM500 dan sekeping resit pembelian.

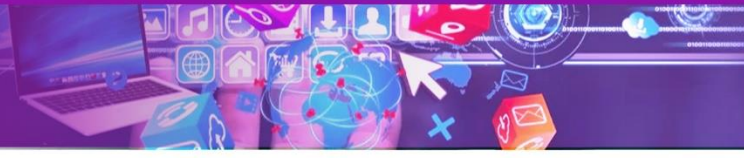
"Berdasarkan siasatan, sindiket ini membuat penjualan kotak android secara

Women's charities sound alarm as aid cuts hit equality spending

AID cuts could put more women and girls at risk of domestic violence, unsafe abortions and dropping out of school as rich nations' spending to fight gender inequality stagnates for the first time in a decade, charities and policy experts say.

Britain, the Netherlands and Japan pledged less money to tackle gender violence in 2020/21, and committed a smaller share of total aid to gender equality programmes for the first time since 2010, a new report by the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) shows.

As major donors, such as Sweden and Germany, reassess aid spending, campaigners are warning of the potential consequences.

"When gender equality funding is reduced, there are real-life implications on the provision of health services, particularly, sexual and reproductive health,"

said Foteini Papagiotti, senior policy adviser at the United States-based International Centre for Research on Women.

"So that will very likely affect women and girls in some of the poorest countries around the world."

According to the OECD report, the share of total overseas development aid dedicated to gender equality-related programmes slipped to 44 per cent in 2020/21 from 44.5 per cent in 2018/19 after 10 consecutive years of growth.

And in 2020/21, rich nations, including Canada, Norway and Germany, committed less money to tackle gender violence, pledging US\$458 million compared with US\$531 million in 2018/19, the data showed.

Papagiotti warned that the downward trend was likely to continue for the next two or three years given that several countries, including Britain, have decreased their foreign aid budgets due to fallout from the Covid-19 pandemic and the Ukraine war.

Sweden, which spent 57.4 bil-

lion crowns on overseas aid last year, said in February it would allocate an annual aid budget of 56 billion crowns until 2025.

Germany, which is the world's second-biggest donor after the US, is also considering reductions to its overseas humanitarian budget.

The potential cutbacks from major donors came after Britain reduced its overseas aid in 2020 to 0.5 per cent of gross national income (GNI) — down from the UN target of 0.7 per cent of GNI — to free up cash for domestic spending during the pandemic.

An official assessment published by United Kingdom lawmakers earlier this month found that thousands of women and girls — from Afghanistan, Yemen and across Africa — would not receive critical healthcare, education and access to safe abortions as a result of the cuts.

Monica Ferro, head of the UK office of UNFPA, the UN reproductive and sexual health agency, acknowledged the budget challenges facing donor govern-

ments, but said funding for gender equality programmes was "life-saving".

"This is why we have to keep on highlighting the needs of women and girls. Their needs are intensified by these crises," Ferro said.

UNFPA said the £150 million that Britain cut from the agency's programmes in 2021/22 could have prevented 47 million unintended pregnancies, 813,000 maternal and child deaths and 14.4 million unsafe abortions.

Britain is the agency's fourth-largest donor and the leading funder of the UNFPA Supplies Partnership, the world's largest provider of donated contraceptives, the group said.

The International Planned Parenthood Federation, a global reproductive health charity, said Britain had cut its funding by 50 per cent this year, an amount equivalent to over £10 million.

Some cutbacks on gender programmes have also been explained by the rising domestic cost of hosting refugees and asylum seekers, for example,

Ukrainians fleeing Russia's invasion or Afghans leaving their homes due to the Taliban's takeover.

Total foreign aid rose to a record US\$204 billion last year from US\$186 billion in 2021 because of the rising refugee-related costs, according to OECD data.

Rich countries spent US\$29.3 billion on "in-donor" refugee costs, US\$7 billion more than what was spent on humanitarian aid, the report said.

Last year, Britain used a third of its aid budget — about £3.7 billion — to host refugees, most of them Ukrainian, official data showed, drawing widespread criticism from lawmakers, aid watchdogs and charities.

"In a political sense, when there are people coming on boats at your door, it's hard to justify the spend overseas," said Lyric Thompson, founder of US-based think-tank Feminist Foreign Policy Collaborative.

PETALING JAYA: In a move to deter bullying at schools, the Malaysian Crime Prevention Foundation (MCPF) has embarked on a campaign to advise students against committing such acts of aggression.

MCPF's crime prevention club chairman Datuk Seri Johny Ch'ng Ewe Gee said the programme was also mooted in conjunction with the National Day month to instil a sense of patriotism and loyalty to the country.

"We want our students to respect one another and not intimidate their peers for the sake of having fun or showing off.

"School is the best platform to inculcate a spirit of togetherness and friendship as part of nation-building towards a safe, united and prosperous Malaysia," he said.

During the campaign at SJK (C) Han Ming in Puchong, Ch'ng, who is also MCPF national exco member and former Pahang

MCPF chairman, shared crime prevention tips with about 1,500 students.

He reminded them to study hard and not to play truant or bully their classmates as it could land them in trouble with the authorities.

Ch'ng said the initiative was also part of a concerted activity held in schools in which every student must partake in a sport, a club or a uniformed body.

"We hope to encourage more students to join and be active members of the crime prevention club in their school.

"This could help to deter unhealthy activities and shape students and youth to be responsible citizens," he added.

Separately, MCPF national vice-chairman Datuk Seri Dr King Lim Chin Fui said it would continue to work closely with the authorities especially the police to help deter crime in the neighbourhood.

He said MCPF would organise more talks and activities such as the Women Care Programme, crime prevention clubs in schools and cadet police through partner-

ships with parent-teacher associations.

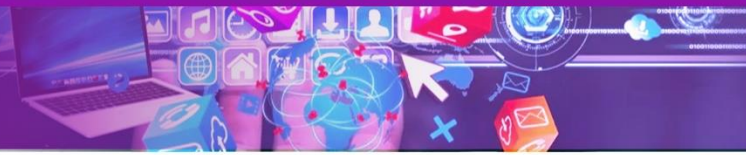
"On the police part, the Pahang contingent told us that they are committed to ensuring a safe, conducive and crime-free environment for all through its initiatives, namely the foster neighbourhood programme.

"We will assist them in getting more public participation especially youth in community events and crime prevention campaigns to increase awareness among society as of late, scam and cheating cases are on the rise," he said.

Lim had led a delegation to pay a courtesy visit to Pahang police chief Comm Datuk Seri Yahaya Othman and other top brass in the state where they discussed a host of issues and pressing matters.

"We are planning to hold more seminars in the district and state level to disseminate information on crime prevention and enhance the Safe City concept via the use of more CCTVs.

"We hope the private sector and the public will give us their full support," he said.

'Ministry out to help girls facing teen pregnancy'

KUCHING: The Women, Childhood and Community Wellbeing Development Ministry is ready to help girls facing teenage pregnancy, assures Deputy Minister I Datuk RoseyYunus.
"We know that cases of teenage pregnancies exist. However, these young girls may not want to keep the babies.

"To these teenagers facing such problems, we have a place," she told reporters yesterday when asked about the recent case of a baby girl being abandoned in Batu Kawa here.
"These teenage girls just need to contact the Women and Family Department Sarawak (JWKS) at WismaWanita, or any nearby Welfare Department

(JKM) office to get assistance.
"We will help them because we have a safe haven for cases like this, to prevent the baby from being abandoned.
"We don't want this to happen; it's very distressing," she added.
Moreover, Rosey said help could be sought by contacting the JWKS Helpline, at [082-448866](tel:082-448866).
On Aug 18, a newborn baby

girl was found abandoned near a dumpster at Moyan in Batu Kawa area, around 7.30am.
The baby was discovered by garbage collector contractors, who were emptying the dumpsters.
According to Rosey, the baby is now under the protection of JKJ, and the case is still under police investigation.

'Teen pregnancy cases in Sarawak show decline'

KUCHING: The number of teenage pregnancy cases in Sarawak posted a 38.09 per cent decline from 2016 to last year, said Minister of Women, Childhood and Community Wellbeing Development Dato Sri Fatimah Abdullah.

She also highlighted the sharp drop in cases since the establishment of the One Stop Teenage Pregnancy Committee in 2016.

"We set up the committee not to encourage pre-marital sex, but to help tackle problems such as baby dumping," she said when met by reporters after launching the International Chinese Muslim Conference 2023 at a hotel here yesterday.

Fatimah said in 2016, Sarawak recorded 2,481 teenage pregnancy cases, and the number gradually reduced to 1,536 in 2022.

According to her, baby dumping occurs because teenage mothers do not want people to know about them engaging in pre-marital sex.

She said this was why the government collaborated with the KPJ Specialist Hospital to set up a baby hatch for teenage mothers to place their babies in a safe spot.

"Now that KPJ has moved, we are now in the process of setting

up a new baby hatch at Borneo Medical Centre, which should be ready soon," she added.

Fatimah said as at Aug 18 this year, Sarawak recorded two baby dumping cases.

She said previously, there were 10 baby dumping cases in

2016, followed by four in 2017, 10 in 2018, five in 2019, five in 2020, 10 in 2021 and six last year.

Moreover, the minister appealed to teenage pregnant mothers who might feel lost and not knowing what to do, to approach her ministry for help.

"Please do not abandon the baby, but put the baby in a safe place. We want to save lives.

"The number of teenage pregnant mothers seems to be decreasing — that means we have achieved our objective. It is not totally zero, but the number has reduced. This is what we want.

"If the teenage mother is younger like 12 or 13, the uterus is not well developed yet and there is risk for the mother too. If teenage pregnancy really happens, there is a place safe for you. Come to us," she said.

Fatimah added that teenage pregnant mothers could have two options — either to inform their parents who might scold them but in the end, would decide to take in the baby; or they could put up the baby for adoption.

"Women are essential to the

development of children. Thus, women play a significant role in moulding the family, which will have impact on community development and nation building.

"Thus, women and family are the key to sustainable development and quality of life in the development of the community and nation building. The role of women and family is very significant in community development and ensure the stability, progress and long-term development of the nation," she

said this when launching the International Chinese Muslim Conference 2023 themed 'The Roles and Impacts of Chinese Muslims: Embracing the Future' at a hotel here yesterday.

The three-day conference, hosted by the Malaysia Chinese Muslim Association (Macma), is being attended by delegates from China, Thailand, Taiwan, Brunei Darussalam, Singapore, Hong Kong and Malaysia.

Macma president Datuk Prof Dr Taufiq Yap Yun Hin said

the conference would feature a diverse range of sessions and workshop on topics such as education, business and finance, culture and the role of Chinese Muslims together with other citizens in promoting peace and development.

He said delegates would also have the opportunity to engage in networking events, and participate in cultural activities highlighting the rich history and traditions of Chinese Muslim communities.

His son, Tuai Rumah Mulok Seliman, said his father had been receiving treatment at the Saratok Hospital over the past few days due to illness.

"At 5.20am this morning (Aug 19), our father breathed his last, and his remains had been brought back to our longhouse in Klua Krian, Saratok.

"He left behind two children, nine grandchildren and 23 great-grandchildren.

"He is scheduled to be buried on the morning of Aug 22 at the Klua Christian Cemetery," said Mulok.

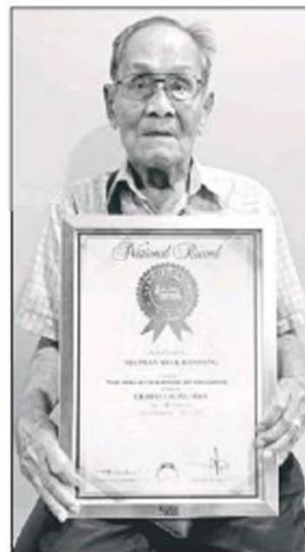
Kalaka assemblyman Mohamad Duri, who visited Seliman at the hospital on Wednesday, expressed his deepest condolences to the family in a Facebook post yesterday.

He said Seliman's family was closely related to him from the Klua longhouse.

"Seliman was a close friend of my late father, and our families have always supported each other from the past until now.

"I used to play at his longhouse during my childhood," recalled the assemblyman.

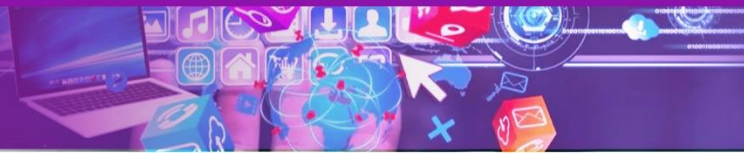
Aug 29, 2021, it was stated that Seliman from Tenggalat in Saratok was born on March 21, 1910.

He was announced 'the oldest living man in the country' by MBR via its Facebook livestream.

Michael had said that the family prepared balanced meals for him as well.

Missing teens in Kuching reunited with family, thanks to Good Samaritan

KUCHING: A 14-year-old boy and his friend, who had gone missing since Friday evening, were reunited with their family yesterday with the help of a Good Samaritan.

They were both found at Kampung Nombor at 9.30am, said one of the boy's mother.

"Both of them were found walking by the roadside by a man riding his motorcycle around the village area," she said when contacted.

Immediately after being informed of their discovery, she brought the two boys to the police station to withdraw a report lodged on Friday.

Earlier yesterday, she had appealed to members of the public to help locate the two boys.

According to her, she had gone to pick up her son from St Thomas' Secondary School at 6.15pm on Friday, but could not find him anywhere.

"He usually waits at the 7-11 (shop). He didn't show up, so I went to the school guard to ask if there were any more students in the school premises, but they said 'no more'.

"There a few more boys waiting at the gate and I asked

them if they had seen him. Shortly after that, another guardian came to ask about her nephew because she couldn't find him either," she said.

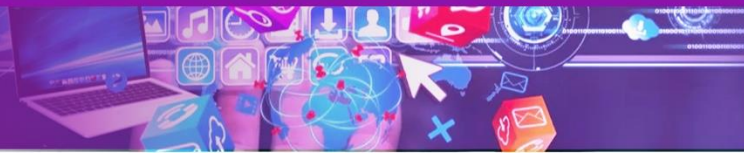
She said the boys waiting at the gate told her they had seen the two walking towards Plaza Merdeka.

"So we went there to search — nothing. Went to Waterfront, Tugu Pahlawan, Civic Centre, Reservoir Park, also nothing,"

she said.

Moreover, she said the two boys were last seen at Kampung Nombor.

"We had that person's contact and we called him to verify. He said he had seen them both walking past a cafe and asked them where they were going. They said they were going to a friend's house, and we don't know who's this friend," she said.

Woman arrested over alleged abandonment of newborn baby

KUCHING: A woman, in her early 20s, was arrested over suspected abandonment of a newborn baby found by a dumpster in Moyan Square, Batu Kawa early Friday.

Acting Padawan District police chief DSP Lim Jaw Shyong, in a statement, said the police located the suspect and brought her in for questioning at 11.20am on Friday.

"We are currently investigating this case under Section 317 of the Penal Code (exposure and abandonment of a child under 12 years old by parent or person having care of it)," said Lim, adding that the suspect is a local and not married.

If found guilty, the accused could be sentenced to jail for a term that might extend to seven years, or a fine, or both.

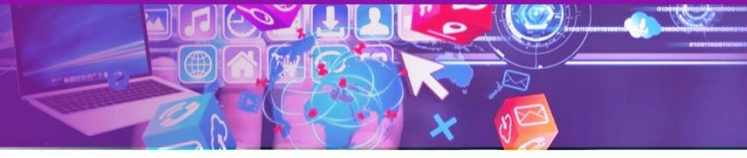
On the baby girl, Lim said she was currently under treatment and observation at the Sarawak General Hospital (SGH).

"Doctors who conducted checks on the baby discovered that she's quite weak due to hunger," said Lim, adding that no visible injuries were found on her body.

The baby, he said, was found inside a cardboard box next to a dumpster by waste collection workers at 6.50am. Shocked by the discovery, the workers then took the baby to a nearby coffee shop where two women there volunteered to bring the baby to the Batu Kawa Health Clinic.

Lim also said the police had been in contact with the Welfare Department for further action.

"I would also advise the public to not speculate on this case to ensure that a smooth investigation can be carried out," said Lim.

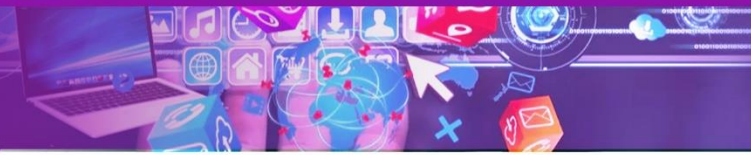

Kes buang bayi di Sarawak menurun hasil inisiatif OSTPC

Kementerian dapat mengurangkan bilangan remaja hamil bermula 2,481 kes pada 2016 kepada 1,500 kes pada 2022

KUCHING: Bilangan kes buang bayi di Sarawak menunjukkan penurunan hasil pelbagai inisiatif yang dilaksanakan menerusi Jawatankuasa Sehati Kehamilan Remaja (OSTPC).

Menteri Pembangunan Wanita, Kanak-Kanak dan Kesejahteraan Komuniti Dato Sri Fatimah Abdullah berkata, pada 2016 sebanyak 10 kes buang bayi direkodkan di Sarawak dan menurun kepada empat kes pada tahun 2017.

Bagaimanapun pada tahun 2018, kes meningkat kembali kepada lima kes dan menurun kepada lima kes pada tahun 2019 dan 2020 dan meningkat sekali lagi pada tahun 2021 iaitu 10 kes.

Pada tahun 2022, kes buang bayi di Sarawak kembali menurun kepada enam kes dan untuk tahun ini, dua kes direkodkan bagi tempoh Janu-

ari hingga 18 Ogos, katanya.

"Apabila kita wujudkan OSTPC, salah satu daripadanya adalah untuk mengurangkan bilangan kes kehamilan remaja dan menyelamatkan bayi daripada dibuang.

"Menerusi inisiatif ini, kita dapat mengurangkan bilangan remaja hamil bermula dengan 2,481 kes pada tahun 2016 kepada 1,500 kes pada tahun 2022.

"Meskipun tidak mencapai sifar kes, tetapi kes berkurangan dan itu yang kita mahu-kan," ujarnya.

Beliau berkata demikian kepada pemberita ketika ditemui pada Persidangan Cina Muslim Antarabangsa (ICMC) 2023 yang berlangsung di sebuah hotel di sini semalam anjuran Persatuan Cina Muslim Malaysia (MACMA).

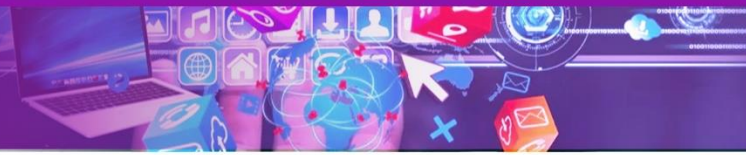

Jabatan Kebajikan Masyarakat (JKM) kita yang berdekatan untuk mendapatkan bantuan.

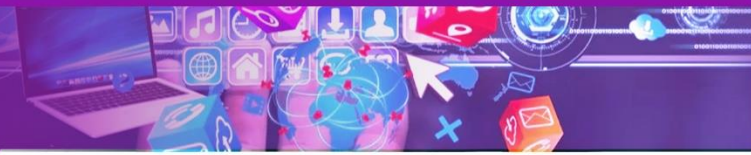

Wanita dipercayai ibu kandung dalam kes buang bayi ditangkap

KUCHING: Seorang wanita berusia 22 tahun dipercayai ibu kepada bayi perempuan yang ditemui di tempat pembuangan sampah di kawasan Moyan Square telah ditahan untuk siasatan lanjut.

Pemangku Ketua Polis Daerah Padawan DSP Lim Jaw Shyong memberitahu, wanita terbabit berjaya dikesan dan dibawa ke Balai Polis Batu Kawa untuk siasatan lanjut pada jam 11.20 pagi kelmarin.

“Suspek merupakan wanita tempatan dan belum berkahwin,” katanya dalam satu kenyataan pada malam kelmarin.

Kes disiasat di bawah Seksyen 317 Kanun Keseksaan yang membawa hukuman penjara sehingga tujuh tahun atau denda atau kedua-duanya sekali.

“Orang ramai dinasihatkan agar tidak membuat sebarang spekulasi yang boleh mengganggu siasatan.

“Dalam kes ini, pihak polis telah berhubung dengan pihak Jabatan Kebajikan Masyarakat (JKM) untuk membantu pengurusan bayi tersebut,” katanya.

Jelasnya, pemeriksaan di Klinik Kesihatan Batu Kawa mendapati bayi tersebut cukup sifat dan tiada sebarang kesan kecederaan di tubuh.

“Bagaimanapun ia agak lemah (semasa ditemui) kerana kelaparan,” jelasnya.
