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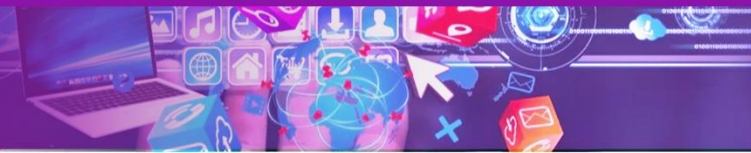

## Pelajar Sabah tersenarai calon 50 terbaik untuk anugerah GSP

**Kota Kinabalu:** Pelajar Kolej Vokasional Keningau (KVK), Sabah, Nurul Nazieha Jasnief, terpilih sebagai seorang daripada calon 50 terbaik bagi anugerah Global Student Prize (GSP) anjuran Varkey Foundation di United Kingdom (UK).

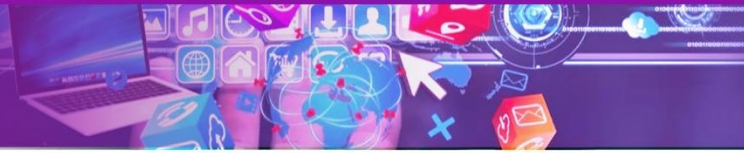

# Ziarah Kasih jadi program tetap kerajaan dekati rakyat

KKD teruskan usaha salur bantuan kebajikan, selesai masalah internet

**Kuala Selangor:** Kementerian Komunikasi dan Digital (KKD) akan menjadikan program Ziarah Kasih sebagai program tetap di bawah

KKD bagi mendekati dan membantu rakyat memerlukan, selain meneliti masalah internet dihadapi mereka.

Menterinya, Fahmi Fadzil, berkata program itu turut membabitkan pihak berkaitan, sekali gus menjadikan bantuan disalurkan lebih menyeluruh.

"Kita lihat memang wajar program di bawah KKD diteruskan sambil selesaikan isu internet, kita juga beri perhatian kepada isu kebajikan.

Fahmi berkata, program sama akan diadakan di Sabah dan Sarawak, masing-masing pada 25 Ogos serta 2 September ini.

"Sekitar tempoh itu kita akan ambil kesempatan untuk ziarah wartawan (pengamal media) atau orang awam yang menghadapi isu kesihatan atau kebajikan, sambil

teliti masalah internet yang mereka hadapi," katanya.

#### Arah MCMC selesaikan masalah

Mengulas kelajuan internet di kampung itu, Fahmi berkata, beliau mengarahkan pihak Suruhanjaya Komunikasi dan Multimedia Malaysia (MCMC) menyelesaikan masalah berkenaan dengan segera.

"Saya difahamkan penduduk kampung sudah lapor (masalah internet) sejak 2020 kepada MCMC, saya tidak faham mengapa ada kelewatan dan masalah internet masih berlarutan.

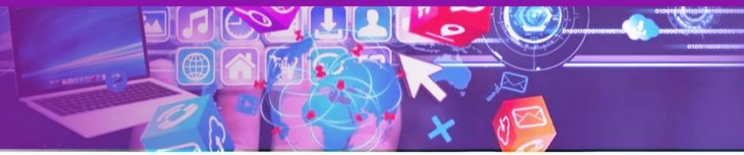
"Kita tengok di sini satu bar (ke-

lajuan internet) saja, memang ada masalah kronik, saya cuba selesaikan. Namun ia bergantung kepada isu, jika membabitkan pembinaan menara ia akan mengambil masa, kita akan semak menara sedia ada," katanya.

Sementara itu, warga emas, Sawiah Adam, 72, menyifatkan kehadiran Fahmi di rumahnya membuktikan menteri itu berjiwa rakyat dan prihatin dengan nasib masyarakat.

"Beliau juga akan menampilkan buku resipi berasaskan masakan tradisional pelbagai etnik di Sabah, agar rantau ini dapat memelihara warisan budayanya menerusi makanan tradisional. 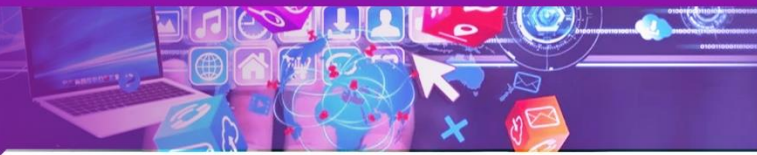

Mayat Muhammad Faris Irfan, 10, ditemukan nelayan berhampiran Tanjung Hantu di sini jam 8.20 pagi, semalam.

Penolong Pengarah Bahagian Operasi Jabatan Bomba dan Penyelamat Malaysia (JBPM) Negeri Perak, Sabarodzi Nor Ahmad berkata, mayat ditemukan dua batu nautika dari lokasi dilaporkan hilang.

"Mayat kemudian diserahkan kepada polis untuk tindakan lanjut," katanya.

Menurutnya, operasi mencari dan menyelamat (SAR) membabitkan 67 anggota daripada pelbagai agensi termasuk bomba, polis, Angkatan Pertahanan Awam (APM) dan

## PPDK Kampungku Sayang bantu OKU jana pendapatan

**Melaka:** Pusat Pemulihan Dalam Komuniti (PPDK) Kampungku Sayang, Bukit Baru berjaya menghasilkan pelbagai kraftangan hasil peserta orang kurang upaya (OKU) dalam usaha menjana pendapatan selain pada masa sama, mendidik peserta berdikari.

Penyelia PPDK itu, Seri Andayu Mamat, 47, berkata, antara produk dihasilkan ialah alas kaki serta sarung tangan malah ia mendapat sambutan baik daripada penduduk.

Katanya, walaupun pasaran agak terhad namun ia menarik perhatian umum.

Jelasnya, terdapat 36 peserta di PPDK itu dengan lima daripada mereka mampu menghasilkan produk berkualiti setaraf insan normal.

"Walaupun pendapatan jualan hanya kira-kira RM200 sebulan, namun apa yang penting ialah, mereka mampu menghasilkan produk sendiri.

Peserta PPDK, Nur Fatin Salim, 33 berkata, dia memperoleh pengalaman dan pengetahuan dalam bidang jahitan serta kraftangan se-

lepas menyertai pusat berkenaan sejak 2009.

Anak bongsu daripada empat beradik itu juga sedia untuk berkongsi ilmu dan kemahiran sebagai sokongan kepada mereka yang berminat.

# 'DO MORE TO GET WOMEN INTO WORKFORCE'

Better incentives, quality childcare options can boost participation rate, say experts

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**E**XPERTS have urged the government to do more to encourage women to return to their careers. The onus is also on the private sector to ensure that women take up more senior positions, said one non-governmental organisation. International Women's Rights Action Watch Asia Pacific director Mary Shanthy Dairiam said she welcomed the launch of the "Madani Economy: Empowering

the People" framework by the government, which included initiatives to increase women's participation in the workforce. She urged the government, through its funds, to encourage private sector companies to appoint qualified women in more senior roles in return for incentives, such as tax waivers. She added that the government could adopt a wage-subsidy incentive model to encourage more women to work. "Aside from better childcare centres, better jobs with better pay must also be available to women. The wage gap is there; men earn more than women. "The government can set targets for the companies to achieve in return for government incentives, such as tax exemptions. "Underemployment and a lack of quality jobs are why women are willing to forgo their careers for the sake of their children," she said, adding that the government's solution solved only part

of the problem. At Thursday's launch of the "Madani Economy: Empowering the People" framework, Prime Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim said the government wanted to increase women's participation in the workforce. He added that the participation rate of women in the labour force, at 55.5 per cent, was low compared with men at 80.9 per cent. One way to do so, he said, was through an allocation of RM10 million to streamline the registration process and expansion of the childcare centre and nursery white-listing programme. Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia Professor of Law in family, women and children Datuk Noor Aziah Mohd Awal said the government should invest in setting up more childcare centres and nurseries to encourage women to return to work. She said having more nurseries and centres would benefit working women, especially those in

the B40 income group. To ensure these women had peace of mind and could focus on work, the government's funding should also be used to improve the centres' facilities. "In other countries, teachers and the management of childcare centres are qualified individuals. "Some even have child psychologists or staff who are at least certified with a bachelor's degree in early childcare development. "We don't have this here. Some centres, especially unregistered ones, are run by unqualified and uncertified carers. "This is why parents, especially mothers, hesitate to send their children to care centres and are willing to sacrifice their careers." She said these women would consider returning to the workforce if their children were under the care of professionals. "If the focus is on empowering women in the industry, then the quality of childcare centres is paramount."

## Body of missing child at Teluk Senangin beach found

**IPOH:** The body of a 10-year-old boy who was reported missing in the Teluk Senangin Beach area in Lumut on Saturday was found by a fisherman yesterday morning.

Perak Fire and Rescue Department (Bomba) Operations Division assistant director, Sabarodzi Nor Ahmad said the victim, identified as Muhammad Faris Irfan, was found at 8.20am.

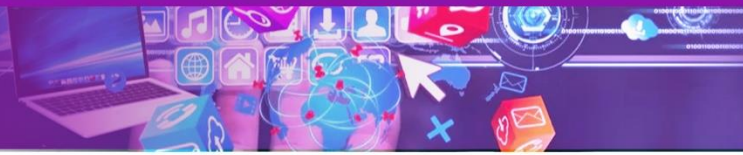
"The body was found about two nautical miles near Tanjung Hantu from where he was believed to have disappeared," he said in a statement, adding that the body has been handed over to the police.

On Saturday, Sabarodzi said the department was alerted of the incident at 3.19pm after family members lodged a police report when they realised the victim missing at about 1pm.

The search operation was called off at 6.30pm after failing to find clues to the child's disappearance.

However, the search continued Saturday night after someone reported seeing the child walking aimlessly at 3.15pm around the chalets near the beach area.

## Eight in family rendered homeless after fire breaks out

**SIBU:** Eight people were made homeless after their house at Kampung Jeriah here was razed Saturday afternoon.

The victims comprised three adults and five children. No injuries or casualties were reported in the incident.

The Fire and Rescue Fire (Bomba) in a statement said teams from the Sungai Merah and Sibu Jaya fire stations were rushed to the scene following a distress call.

"The house was already completely razed by the time

firefighters arrived. The house was located about 270 metres through a rundown wooden walkway from the main access route," said Bomba.

It added that the house owner was not at home at the time of the incident.

"The fire was brought under control within five minutes, and fully doused not long after that," it said.

Bomba said the cause of the fire is under investigation, and that losses suffered by the family have yet to be ascertained.

## Teen boys nabbed during traffic ops for reckless riding

**SIBU:** A traffic operation conducted by police here last Friday saw the arrest of two teenagers for riding their motorcycles in reckless fashion.

Sibu police chief ACP Zulkipli Suhaili said the boys, aged 15 and 17, were among three individuals stopped by police during the Op Samseng Jalanan operation at Jalan Awang Ramli Amit and Sibu Town Square.

"The teenagers were detained under Section 42(1) of the Road Transport Act 1987 for riding in a dangerous and reckless manner," he said in a statement.

The operation, he added, was carried out from 10pm on July 28 to 3.30am the next day.

He said summonses were also issued for various offences such as driving without a licence, illegal vehicle modification, not having a vehicle licence plate, having fancy licence plate, no side mirrors, and modified exhaust pipe.

"I call on members of the public to obey the traffic laws. Parents should also monitor their children's movements to prevent them from getting involved in unlawful activities," said Zulkipli.

# A truly happy family is a healthy family

## Kong: Friend-raising more important than fund-raising

**PETALING JAYA:** Strong family bonds are an important component of society – a non-profit organisation was founded on this principle in 1997 and remains committed to it.

Focus on the Family Malaysia has been striving to help families realise their potential, foster unbreakable bonds and make meaningful contributions to the nation.

Apart from offering free counselling, it organises events aimed at strengthening family ties.

These events serve as platforms for families to connect, interact and create lasting memories together, its executive director Benny Kong (*pic*) said in an interview.

He said by focusing on building supportive and nurturing environments, Focus on the Family hopes to empower families to overcome challenges

and grow together.

“While some Asians may prefer to keep family matters private, there has been a growing acceptance of seeking help to preserve and strengthen family bonds.

“Family and marriage issues are personal to some individuals; however, we have received a positive response from the public,” he said.

In keeping with the cultural norms here, Kong said the organisation has adapted its communications approach to deliver messages in a sensitive and understanding manner.

The impact of Focus on the Family’s services is evident with approximately 85% of individuals seeking assistance seeing positive changes in their lives, he said.

He added that even amid the



challenges posed by the Covid-19 pandemic, the organisation continued its counselling services online, conducting over 700 sessions – the highest number to date.

“The pandemic brought to light the crucial role of counselling, especially for married couples, as it magnified existing issues, emphasising the significance of seeking timely support,” he said.

Focus on the Family not only focuses on supporting married couples but also provides activities and events catering to the youth.

Kong said as with most non-profit organisations, public donations play a vital role in sustaining its cause.

However, instead of directly soliciting donations, he said it prioritises providing quality services

to the public first.

“Contributions are voluntary as an emphasis is placed on building a network of support through ‘friend-raising’.

“We want them to use the service or come to our events first. For example, the counselling sessions are free but if they want to contribute, it’s entirely up to them.

“We want them to introduce us to their friends and family. We call it ‘friend-raising’ as opposed to fund-raising.

“It’s challenging but we’re thankful for the support,” he added.

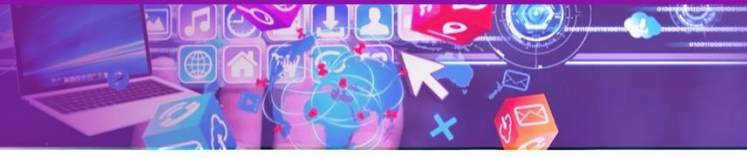
To expand its outreach, Focus on the Family has formed partnerships with various government agencies, including the Women, Family and Community Development Ministry through the National Population and Family Development Board, the Education Ministry and private firms.

The organisation also actively

## Boy left without papers after mum absconded

A CHANCE encounter with a pregnant woman led to Siti Rahanim Jaimon eventually caring for the newborn child when the mother disappeared, *Kosmo!* reported.

Siti Rahanim, 54, said the boy is now four years old.

"I first met the pregnant woman at a Bandar Simpang Renggam bus stop (in Kluang, Johor) where she suddenly offered me to care for her unborn baby," she recounted the 2019 encounter.

"I was very surprised at the time as I had just met her but I also sympathised with her after listening to the story of her acci-

dental pregnancy."

She said the then 23-year-old woman handed her infant over to her a day after giving birth at Hospital Enche' Besar Hajjah Khalsom in Kluang.

Siti Rahanim said the young mother had not been contactable since then despite her earlier promises to provide documentation for her son.

This meant the boy had no documentation, she added.

"I am no longer healthy, so I have handed over the boy to my (adult) daughter, who is without a child since getting married seven

years ago," she said.

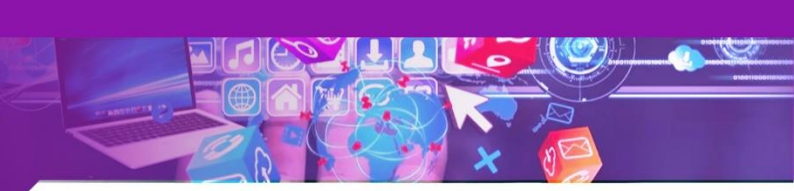
This comes after efforts to clear the overgrown bush at the site of the house began in July last year with the aim of reconstructing Mat Kilau's home to be used as a historical landmark.

Baby abandonment in public spaces frequently makes the news and, in most cases, involves unwed teenage mothers. A survey has shown an increasing number of teenagers in the country engaging in sex before the age of 14, with experts pleading for the root causes of the issue to be tackled.

## A growing need for sex ed

Practical solutions required for teen pregnancies, baby dumping, STDs

**PETALING JAYA:** With the number of abandoned babies in the country on the rise, experts are pleading for the root causes to be addressed.

Top of the list is a comprehensive sexual education framework to create awareness on the issue and amendments to relevant laws, said the Malaysian Medical Association. Its president Dr Murgua Raj Rajahmuni said creating a proper sex education structure was key in ensuring that adolescents were equipped with the right knowledge.

"For decades, we have failed to implement this. We need to look at this issue in a holistic manner, providing practical solutions that are in tandem with the realities of what all our teenagers are facing."

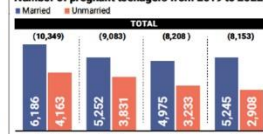
"Amendments to the law must be considered for adolescents who are in need of sexual and reproductive health services, including the provision of contraceptives."

"Adolescent sexual activity and unprotected sex, in particular, is an issue of great concern to all stakeholders working towards the well-being of the young," he said.

The Star in response to the findings from the Health Ministry's Adolescent Health Survey (AHS) 2022. The survey revealed that 59% of teenagers in the country had engaged in sexual activities before reaching the age of 14.

This was in line with the key findings of the Institute for Public Health's National Health and Morbidity Survey (NHMS) Adolescent Health Survey (AHS) 2022, which involved secondary students aged between 13 and 17. Dr Murgua Raj said failure to

ecampnia (seizures that occur in pregnant women), puerperal endometritis (inflammation and infection of the uterus) and synechia infections, while their babies face higher risks of low birth weight, preterm birth and severe neonatal conditions," he added.

Parents of such adolescents should acknowledge these issues openly, he said, adding that they should not be judgmental in discussing this with their children.

OrphanCare Foundation advocacy, communications and fundraising manager Riza Abul said the NGO had noticed a rising number of girls below the age of 18 engaging in sexual activities. She said the remedy should not just be about abstinence but include prevention methods, setting boundaries and safe sex.

"We have to acknowledge that there are things beyond our con-

trol, but what we can do to prevent unwanted pregnancies. We have to start talking about relationships beyond the sperm and ovum stage in biology class. Boys and girls need awareness on what to do and how to be safe."

"This is where parents can play a role by talking to them and discussing these matters," she added. Riza said OrphanCare has been conducting talks on preventive reproduction in schools and universities around the Klang Valley since 2019.

"Many girls would approach us in private later to say they did not even know they had been a victim of rape, sexual harassment or molestation. This is why we have to talk to them about prevention and setting boundaries," she added.

OrphanCare, which advocates and works to give children in institutions and unplanned newborn babies the opportunity to grow in the care of a family, has saved 326 babies since 2009. Of this number, 332 were eventually adopted, 179 parented by their mothers after counselling and 15 referred to the Welfare Department. In 2022, it received 46 babies, and up to June 26 this year, has already taken in 23 babies.

"The ones who have not been adopted have Down Syndrome or HIV. The cases usually involve university students and young adults, but we have received cases involving the underaged who were not aware of sexual repercussions," said Riza.

Recently, Women, Family and Community Development Minister Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri told Parliament that 268 cases of abandoned babies were recorded from 2009 to 2022, based on police statistics.

A total of 57,435 teenagers have benefited from the Reproductive Health Advisory Service while 19,228 teenagers have sought social counselling services at KafeTeen Youth Centres," the ministry said in a statement to The Star, adding that the National Population and Family Development Programme has also collaborated with the Education Ministry to run KafeTeen with the Peer Mentor Programme focusing on reproductive and social health education for secondary students.

A collaboration with the Malaysian Communications and Multimedia Commission (MCMC) was also implemented to spread awareness on reproductive and social health among target teenage groups in rural communities.

The KafeTeen Youth Centre programme is conducted physically at its premises, but is also available through the myKafeTeen mobile app, social media, various outreach programmes and KafeTeen Trucks, especially in rural areas.

KafeTeen Youth Centres also encourage teenagers to register as a Sabahat KafeTeen. To date, 127,482 teenagers have registered.

## Ongoing reproductive and social health ed necessary

**PETALING JAYA:** In an effort to raise awareness on reproductive health and prevent "risk behaviour" as many as 5,864 Reproductive and Social Health Education (Pekert) programmes were carried out from 2011 to 2022.

The Women, Family and Community Development Ministry, through the National Population and Family Development Board, said it has set up 18 KafeTeen Youth Centres to increase access to Pekerti, which has benefited 256,211 teenagers and parents.

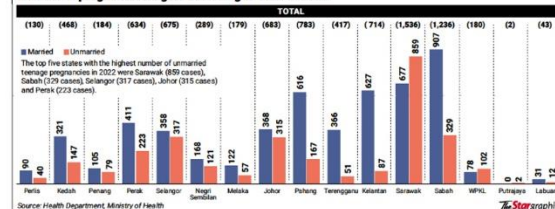
The Pekerti programme targets those aged between 13 and 24, as well as the parents, guardians and educators of special needs children. The ministry said the programme has been expanded to schools, special education schools, Kelurga Malaysia Digital Economic Centres (KD3) and local communities.

Information on health reproductive services, psychosocial counselling services, education programmes and skills development are also available to teenagers via KafeTeen Youth Centres.

The ministry also said that from 2009 to 2022, a total of 843,222 teenagers throughout the country participated in the Education and Skills Development Programme implemented through KafeTeen Youth Centres.

"A total of 57,435 teenagers have benefited from the Reproductive Health Advisory Service while 19,228 teenagers have sought social counselling services at KafeTeen Youth Centres," the ministry said in a statement to The Star, adding that the National Population and Family Development Programme has also collaborated with the Education Ministry to run KafeTeen with the Peer Mentor Programme focusing on reproductive and social health education for secondary students.

## Sarawak still has highest number of unmarried teen pregnancy cases

**PETALING JAYA:** Sarawak continues to have the highest number of unmarried teen pregnancies with 859 cases recorded last year. This is followed by Sabah (329), Selangor (317), Johor (315) and Perak (223), the Health Ministry's (MOH) family health development division revealed.

Although the number of adolescent new antenatal cases registered at the primary healthcare facilities reduced from 10,349 cases in 2019 to 8,153 in 2022, the number of unmarried teen pregnancies were still prevalent.

In 2019, there were 4,163 such pregnancies, followed by 3,831

(2020), 3,233 (2021) and 2,908 (2022).

The MOH National Health and Morbidity Survey (NHMS): Adolescent Health Survey (AHS) 2022 revealed that 154,646 adolescents in the country had engaged in sexual activities, with 33% having engaged in sexual

activity before the age of 14.

The age of consent for sex in Malaysia is 16.

The survey was conducted from June 12 to July 8, 2022, involving secondary students aged between 13 and 17.

Even more shocking was that 75% of them reported having sex

recently, with 88% not using condoms or birth control options. Equally disturbing was that 11% of the teens had more than one sexual partner.

Parliament was told last year that on average, 10,000 pregnant teens opted for services at government health facilities every year.

## Teacher and manager lose RM360,000 to fake job scams

**JOHOR BARU:** A teacher, who wanted to earn extra money for her family, lost RM110,000 in savings to a fake job scam.

She was among more than 70 teachers or retired teachers who have been cheated of almost RM3mil in various kinds of scams in the past seven months.

In this latest case, it is learnt that the teacher, who is in her 30s,

received a WhatsApp message about a part-time job selling products for men and women via an online platform.

The teacher was also asked to make some purchases using her own money to be eligible for a commission.

According to sources, the syndicate would use terms such as "Amazon" to convince victims that it was a genuine platform that paid out good commission.

Syndicate members would

communicate with the teacher via social media, telling her to carry out the purchases by transferring money to various accounts within a period of four days.

It is learnt that the teacher withdrew all her savings totalling RM110,000 to execute the transactions.

She realised that she was duped when she was unable to withdraw her money. She subsequently lodged a police report.

*The Star* had earlier reported

that teachers in Johor were falling victim to scammers who impersonated as enforcement personnel.

Sources said the scammers would usually pretend to be policemen, court officials, insurance officers, Bank Negara officials, prosecutors or income tax officers.

Meanwhile, in another case, a factory manager in her 40s, who also wanted to get a part-time job, lost more than RM250,000.

It is learnt that the woman had come across an advertisement via social media.

Sources said the woman was promised lucrative returns if she spent her own money first to make some bookings and that she would later be reimbursed along with a commission.

"They lured her by promising almost 20% commission. The victim carried out numerous transactions totalling more than RM250,000," the source said.

## When angels come bearing gifts for refugee kids

**PETALING JAYA:** The smiles on the children's faces said it all when bags of used toys were brought before them.

Carefully, but excitedly, they looked at the toys and were unsure if they could play with them until volunteers told them that they could do so.

The saying "one man's trash is another man's treasure" holds true for these stateless children, who live with their refugee families in Pudu.

Recently, volunteers from ShareAngel paid them a visit, to bridge the gap between "waste and want".

The non-governmental organisation (NGO) works by turning pre-loved toys and other essential items into meaningful gifts and aid for underprivileged children and families.

The idea was mooted during the

height of the Covid-19 pandemic in March 2020 when co-founder Angie Lee Hooi Chie saw many single mothers losing their jobs and ending up in dire need to provide for their children.

"Moved by their plight, I took it upon myself to provide these mothers with essential food provisions to ease their immediate

hardship," said Lee. The 36-year-old said she soon realised that their children were also in need of books and toys for their emotional well-being and development, which prompted her and a friend to take further action.

"We began collecting pre-loved toys and other items to give to these families, hoping to bring

them some joy and comfort.

"Seeing the happiness and gratitude on their faces was incredibly rewarding, and it inspired us to formalise our efforts into what is now known as ShareAngel," she said.

Relying on the generosity of individuals and businesses, Lee said donations of pre-loved toys, books and essential items were collected through drop-off points and donation drives.

The items would then go through sorting and quality checks before they are matched with underprivileged children and families with the help of local communities, schools and other NGOs.

To keep the initiative going, ShareAngel also operates a social enterprise, selling carefully selected pre-loved items.

From baby's cots, children's books, toddler's swimsuits and car seats to coolers, breast pumps and pregnancy pillows, Lee said all items were cleaned, sanitised,

inspected and tuned to excellent condition.

It also encourages people to barter-trade - exchanging a pre-loved item for another.

However, Lee said the efforts were not easy as many still tend to perceive second-hand items as "dirty".

"This perception is not unique to Malaysia and can be attributed to various factors.

"However, barter trading and 're-loving' pre-loved items drive positive change in our society.

"When more people practise this, we collectively contribute to reducing waste, conserving resources, promoting responsible consumer behaviour, and fostering a culture of sustainability," she added.

"Share more, waste no more. We hope to create a ripple effect of positive change, including policy-makers, to adopt sustainable practices and support underprivileged communities."

## Fisherman finds body of missing boy

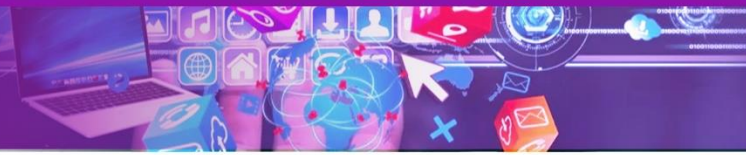
**IPOH:** A fisherman yesterday found the body of a boy, 10, who was reported missing the day before near Teluk Senangin Beach in Lumut.

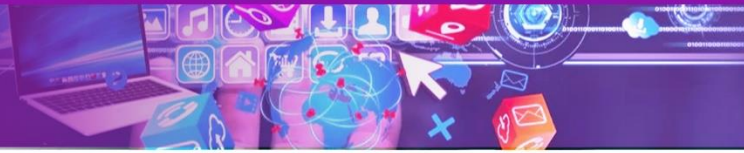

Juppri turut menekankan kepentingan pendidikan awal termasuklah prasekolah yang dapat membantu kanak-kanak menguasai 4M (membaca, menulis, mengira, dan menaakul) sebagai asas persediaan sebelum mereka ke sekolah rendah.

“Pendidikan salah satu hak yang perlu diberikan kepada semua kanak-kanak demi menjamin masa depan mereka. Ini perlu bermula sejak awal umur kanak-kanak lagi

sama ada bermula di rumah, taska, mahupun di prasekolah atau tadika,” katanya.

Sementara itu, Pengarah Program Muhammad Ehsan Kamba berkata, program itu adalah kerjasama FPP bersama Suruhanjaya Hak Asasi Manusia (SUHAKAM) Sabah.

“Peserta program terdiri daripada ibu bapa dan kanak-kanak prasekolah yang disajikan dengan pelbagai aktiviti bermanfaat seperti ceramah keibubapaan, sesi pengajaran, pembelajaran serta sukaneka.

“Selain itu juga, terdapat aktiviti bersama kanak-kanak yang dijalankan oleh pelajar Program Ijazah Sarjana Muda Pendidikan Awal Kanak-kanak iaitu membuat kraf

diorama bertemakan hidupan laut di kelas prasekolah.

“Aktiviti ini dapat memupuk minat kanak-kanak terhadap seni dan kraf, seterusnya meningkatkan kreativiti serta imaginasi mereka,” katanya.

Pada program itu, turut diadakan ceramah keibubapaan yang menjelaskan tentang hak kanak-kanak merangkumi Hak Kehidupan, Hak Perlindungan, Hak Perkembangan serta Hak Penyertaan yang disampaikan oleh wakil SUHAKAM, Mohd Irsyad Hamilin dan Qalista S. Dohny.

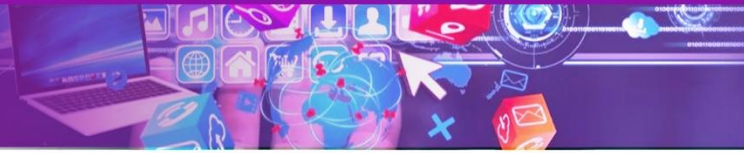
“Mangsa ditemui kira-kira dua batu nautika berhampiran Tanjung Hantu dari lokasi mangsa dipercayai hilang.

kejadian, rumah kayu berstruktur tidak kekal itu sudah musnah sepenuhnya.

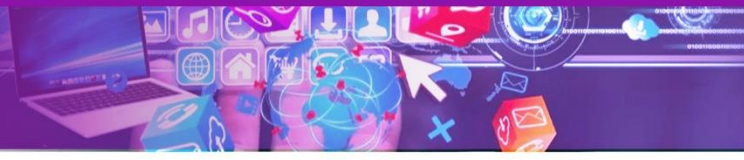
“Rumah musnah itu terletak kira-kira 270 meter melalui laluan pejalan kaki

“Keadaan ini merugikan pihak sekolah yang benar-benar inginkan pembangunan,” jelasnya.

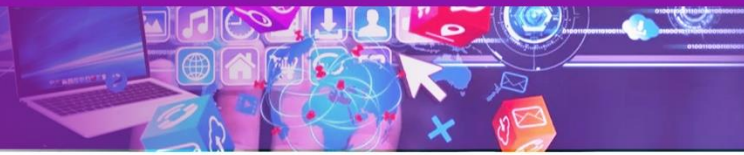

Insha-Allah, lepas ini di tempat lain pula,” katanya kepada pemberita selepas program Ziarah Kasih di dua buah rumah di Kampung Bukit Badong, Bestari Jaya dekat sini yang turut disertai calon PH-BN Dun Ijok Amidi Abdul Manan.

Katanya, program serupa akan diadakan di Sabah dan Sarawak, masing-masing pada 25 Ogos serta 2 September ini.

“Sekitar tempoh itu kita akan ambil kesempatan untuk ziarah wartawan (pengamal

media) atau orang awam yang menghadapi isu kesihatan atau kebajikan, sambil teliti masalah Internet yang mereka hadapi,” katanya.

Sementara itu, warga emas Sawiah Adam, 72, menyifatkan kehadiran Fahmi di

kediamannya membuktikan menteri itu seorang yang berjiwa rakyat serta prihatin dengan nasib masyarakat.

Sawiah berkata bantuan yang diberikan oleh Ahli Parlimen Lembah Pantai itu akan dimanfaatkan dengan

sebaiknya.

“Makcik ada (menghidap) pelbagai jenis penyakit antaranya gout, buah pinggang dan jantung menyebabkan pergerakan juga terjejas. Dengan adanya kerusi roda baharu ini akan mempermudah pergerakan makcik,” katanya.

Selain itu, mengulas mengenai kelajuan Internet di kampung tersebut, Fahmi berkata beliau telah mengarahkan pihak Suruhanjaya Komunikasi dan Multimedia Malaysia (MCMC) menyelesaikan masalah berkenaan dengan kadar segera.

“Saya difahamkan penduduk kampung telah lapor (masalah Internet) sejak 2020 pada MCMC, saya tidak faham mengapa ada kelewatan dan masalah Internet berlarutan.

“Kita tengok di sini satu bar (kelajuan internet) sahaja, memang ada masalah yang kronik, saya cuba selesaikan. Namun bergantung kepada isu, jika melibatkan pembinaan menara ia akan mengambil masa, kita akan semak menara sedia ada,” katanya. — Bernama
