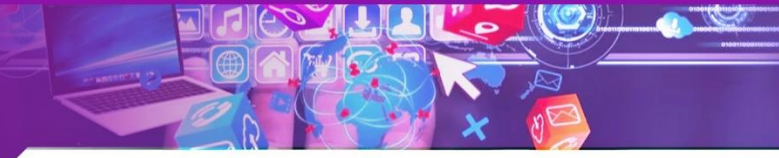

Kids preying on kids

Children are becoming perpetrators of sexual abuse against other children, with police revealing that misuse of smart devices by the young is a major contributor to the problem. With almost 1,000 sexual crime cases involving minors recorded last year, experts are calling for a holistic approach to the problem while the government ponders an Online Safety Act. > See reports on page 5 by AUSTIN CAMOENS and JUNAID IBRAHIM



From victims to sex predators

Police: Misuse of social media a gateway for abused kids to become the aggressor

PETALING JAYA: Cases of children falling victim to sexual crimes from smartphone and social media exposure are well known, but there is an added twist to it now.

Police data show that these youngsters are becoming the predators of such crimes. Bukit Aman CID Sexual, Women and Children Crime Investigation Division (D11) principal assistant director Senior Asst Comm Siti Kamariah Hassan (pic) said misuse of mobile gadgets and social media was a gateway for children to also become perpetrators of sexual crimes.

With the sophistication of the latest gadgets and technology she said it was not impossible for children to turn into the aggressor.

"It is feared that crimes involving victims and perpetrators among children occur especially involving those under the age of 10 who are considered as persons who can bear no criminal responsibility under the law."

"We fear that the crimes committed by these perpetrators go unreported and are resolved at the level of the affected families only," she told The Star.

SAC Siti Kamariah said the early introduction of social media or digital platforms to children could encourage sexual crimes, both physical and non-physical in nature, citing rape and grooming.

"It can happen even with new acquaintances and feelings of love do not even need

held on criminal charges, only a police report could lead to an investigation to identify the problem.

She said this would help identify what motivated the child to go to such an extent and help in early intervention and rehabilitation by the relevant agencies and the family concerned.

"If the sexual behaviour of a child goes unreported and the family does not take initial steps to identify the cause and remedy it, it is feared that the child would consider this behaviour to be normal within society," she said.

In 2022, 1,096 sexual crimes cases involving suspects below the age of 18 were recorded, which included 779 rape cases, outraging modesty (21), sexual harassment (eight) and distribution or possession of obscene materials (five).

"Three underaged suspects were also involved in attempting to produce and make, exchange, sell, access and use a child for child pornography," she said, adding that police also recorded 190 physical sexual assault on children cases involving underaged suspects that year.

In 2021, police recorded 731 sexual crimes involving suspects below the age of 18. These included 552 rape cases, outraging modesty (five), sexual harassment (eight) and distribution or possession of obscene materials cases (two).

Six underaged suspects were involved in attempting to use a child for the purpose of child pornography, SAC Siti Kamariah said, with 154 cases of physical sexual assault, two non-physical sexual assault cases and two grooming cases involving such suspects.

Caution advised for any law that tackles child perpetrators

PETALING JAYA: While experts differ on whether there is a need for stricter laws to curb online sexual crimes among children, all agree that education and prevention are paramount in handling the issue.

By My Protector engagement and partnership director Roland Edward said any proposed law or amendment aimed at penalising child perpetrators should be studied holistically.

"This is because most of the children involved in online sexual exploitation were manipulated by certain people or syndicates," he said.

He added that if the government wanted to enact a new law, it must ensure that it is up to date with current technology trends. "Technology is changing rapidly and if there is any law to protect children, the government must ensure it will be future-proof too."

"Now, the government should mobilise aggressive campaigns to raise awareness on child online safety," he said.

Edward said most social media platforms had policies which stipulate the minimum age of users.

However, some parents were not aware of the dangers of posting photos of their children online, he added.

"The minimum age should be increased, from 13 years to at least between 15 and 17, when the child can make wiser decisions."

"Parents must be made aware that it is not always safe to post their children's photos online as predators would take advantage of them," he said, adding that a whole-of-society approach was needed to address the problem.

He was responding to the police findings that not only are children and other minors victims of online sexual exploitation but there have been cases of them being perpetrators as well.

Childline Foundation executive director Datin Wong Poo Hong suggested that the

government amend existing legislation by adding new regulations.

"We already have the laws, introducing a new one will take too long. What we need is regulations through the existing laws."

"Some countries do have specific laws on protecting children online, which is better, but for now, it will be more imperative to strengthen existing laws," she said.

Wong said there was no need for a new punitive law as educating society would be more effective.

"If we introduce a new law with heavier punishments for parents, the burden of proof would be hard. How do you prove parents are negligent (about their children's activities online)?"

"There is no one way to protect all children at once; prevention and education are the keys," she added.

Wong said digital literacy must start as early as the preschool level.

"There is a lot of concern about the exploitation of children online, but not much is being done. We are not educating kids to be resilient (when online), on what

they should do if they get into trouble," she added.

Consultant paediatrician Datin Dr Amar Singh said there was no effective way for parents and communities to protect children from online abuse or involvement in online sexualised content.

To curb the problem, he called for a concerted government approach, which would include expediting the proposed Online Safety Act.

"Social media platforms, applications and sites have always prioritised their financial interests over the well-being of children and adolescents. Hence, the single most useful initiative is the introduction of a comprehensive and effective Online Safety Act (or Kids Online Safety Act)."

"This will put the responsibility on the industry to shield and protect children from online abuse and age-inappropriate online content," he said.

Dr Amar said what was needed was a multipronged approach that included education, parental oversight, and stringent online safety measures.

"Parents have a crucial role to support and train their children on how to use social media wisely and to develop discernment regarding online safety, as well as respect for others."

"All of society also has a role to report inappropriate online content, behaviour and sites," he added.

Last month, Deputy Communications Minister Teo Nie Ching announced in Parliament that the government was studying the introduction of an Online Safety Act.

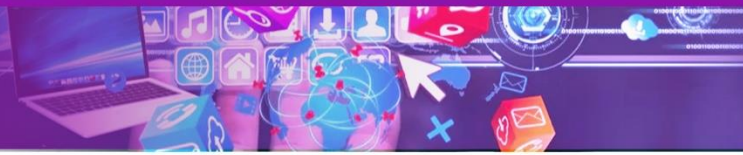
She said the Cabinet had directed the ministry and Legal Affairs Division of the Prime Minister's Department to carry out a study to enact the Act.

In the United States, the US Congress in 2023 tabled the Kids Online Safety Act, which is expected to be passed this year.

The Act is designed to protect minors when using social media.

In Asia, China issued the Provisions on Online Protection of Children's Personal Information in 2019, emphasising the requirement of parental consent before the manipulation of children's personal information.

The provision is stipulated under its Personal Information Protection Law.

Menurutnya, suspek juga didakwa ada memukul di bahagian dada mangsa.

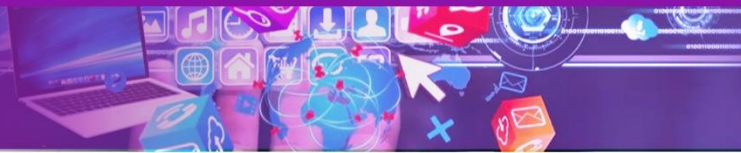
"Ibu mangsa yang mengetahui kejadian itu kemudian tampil membuat laporan polis.

"Susulan itu, pada jam 7.35 malam kelmarin, sepasukan polis dari Bahagian Siasatan Jenayah, Ibu Pejabat Polis Daerah (IPD) Ampang Jaya menahan suspek berusia 37 tahun yang bekerja sebagai pengawal keselamatan," katanya dalam kenyataan hari ini.

Mohd Azam berkata, ujian air kencing yang dijalankan mendapati suspek positif dadah jenis AMP, Methamphetamine dan THC.

"Suspek direman seminggu bermula semalam hingga 12 April ini bagi membantu siasatan mengikut Seksyen 14 (a) Akta Kesalahan seksual terhadap kanak-kanak 2017," katanya.

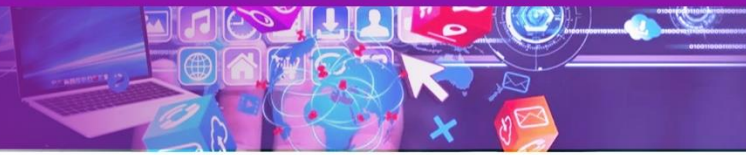
Ketua Polis Daerah Petaling Jaya, Asisten Komisioner Shahrulnizam Jaafar@Ismail berkata, kejadian itu berlaku pada 22 Mac lalu di sebuah tandas awam di pusat beli-belah apabila suspek berusia 27 tahun melakukan perbuatan itu kepada mangsa berusia 14 tahun.

Menurutnya, mangsa yang trauma tampil membuat laporan polis kelmarin untuk tindakan selanjutnya.

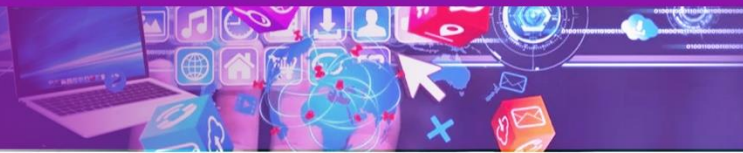
