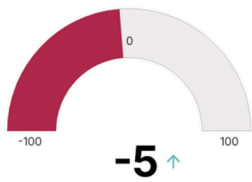

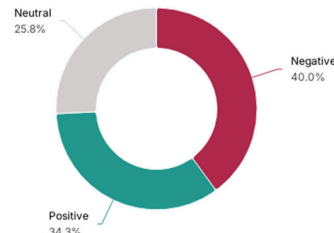


LIPUTAN PECAHAN SENTIMEN

This is +3 points compared to the previous period.

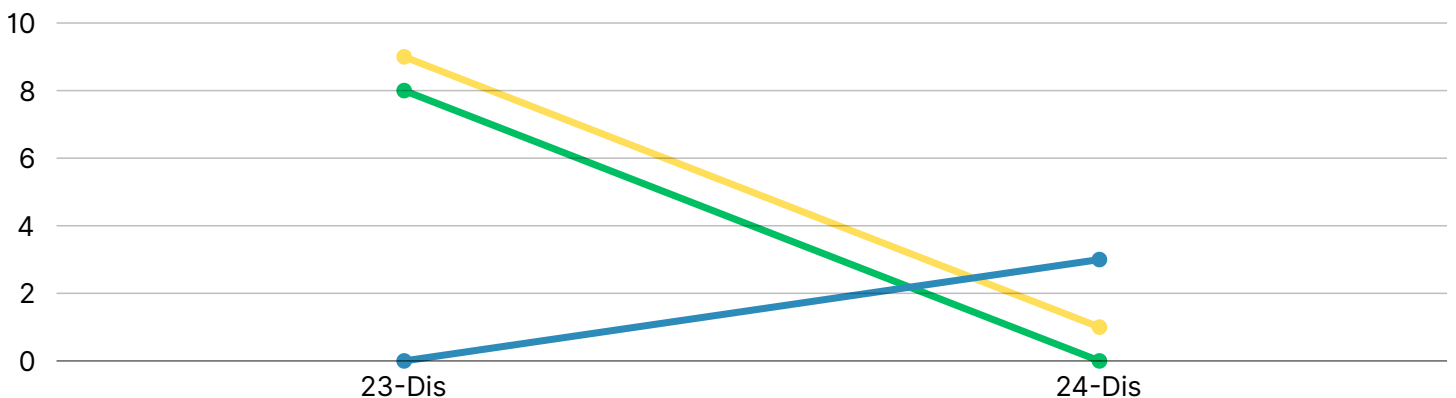

Steps taken to curb sexual harassment

Several initiatives set up to raise awareness, provide assistance to victims: Minister

PETALING JAYA: Women, Family, and Community Development Minister Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri told theSun that 1,842 sexual harassment cases have been reported in the country from January to October, with Selangor having the most, at 426 cases.

"Victims aged 18 to 30 made up the majority, accounting for 1,145 cases, while obscene humour emerged as the most common form of harassment, at 951 cases," she said.

Speaking in response to the growing concern among the public about such cases, Nancy acknowledged her ministry's challenges, such as limited resources in rural areas, underreporting by victims due to stigma and fear of retaliation, and a lack of public awareness.

However, she also highlighted several initiatives implemented by her ministry to address sexual harassment at workplaces and public spaces.

"The Tribunal for Anti-Sexual Harassment provides an alternative to civil courts, offering a swift, affordable and simplified process for resolving complaints, with a filing cost of just RM30.

"Advocacy programmes such as Toleransi Sifar Keganasan@Advokasi Antingangguan Seksual help raise awareness among key groups, including university students, employees, and the public."

Additionally, the Advokasi Kasih Kanak-Kanak programme protects children by educating them, parents and guardians about their rights and measures to prevent harassment.

"The ministry also collaborates with stakeholders to promote zero-tolerance policies at workplaces and provides support platforms like Talian Kasih 15999, which offer victims counselling and guidance on filing complaints."

Rekindle Centre for Systemic Therapy, which began operations in 2010, provides treatment for expatriates and locals, including individuals, couples and families ranging from children to the elderly.

Its counsellor and sexologist, Andrea Koh, said sexual harassment has profound psychological impacts on victims, often leading to anxiety, depression, post-traumatic stress disorder, shame, guilt and anger.

"Such emotional burdens can result in isolation, loss of trust and a diminished sense of safety, with many sexual harassment victims remaining silent due to the power dynamics in which the perpetrators are often in positions of authority or close acquaintances.

"Psychological barriers such as self-blame, fear of judgment and uncertainty about reporting procedures further deter victims from speaking out," she said.

Koh added that misconceptions like "silence means consent" or trivialising harassment as "just a joke" perpetuate the issue by undermining boundaries and personal autonomy.

Koh also said spending time with nature and connecting with trusted individuals or support groups can aid in recovery. Bystanders play a pivotal role in addressing sexual harassment as their actions can further perpetuate or disrupt the cycle of abuse.

A victim, who wanted to be known only as Aya, said on Oct 16, she was accompanied by a friend to the Wangsa Maju police station to report a case of sexual harassment and assault by a repeat perpetrator.

However, she claimed that the police initially refused to accept her report, dismissing it as an old case lacking evidence.

"A lance corporal (name withheld) was assigned to my case. On Oct 20, he contacted me at inappropriate hours, claiming it was to discuss the case.

"During the calls, he made sexually inappropriate remarks, asked invasive questions about my body, and suggested explicit acts. He claimed this was standard procedure, which I knew was untrue.

"Despite my attempts to end the calls, he continued harassing me, repeatedly calling and making unrelated, inappropriate comments," Aya said.

Frustrated and fearful, she withdrew her report, claiming the police failed to handle the case professionally.

"His behaviour was deeply traumatising, and I feel betrayed by the very policemen who are meant to protect victims. I'm afraid to return to the police station after experiencing victim-blaming and harassment.

"I hope no one else has to endure this mistreatment from those entrusted with (facilitating) justice," she said.

Closeness does not equate with safety, says minister

Women, Family and Community Development Minister Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri said parents must be aware that "closeness does not necessarily equate with safety".

KUALA LUMPUR: Survivors of sexual abuse often have to deal with the harsh reality of their abusers not being strangers, but those within their trusted circle.

Women, Family and Community Development Minister Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri said parents must be aware that "closeness does not necessarily equate with safety".

Parents, she said, need to play a bigger role in gaining their children's trust and ensuring that they don't suffer in silence.

Confronting the normalisation of abuse is crucial to ensure that the trauma is never accepted as a part of any child's life, said Nancy.

She added that cultural stigma and fear of disrupting familial or societal harmony often perpetuated the silence in such incidents.

"This reluctance to address the issue leaves children to suffer in silence, depriving them of their right to a safe and happy childhood.

"We cannot overlook the fact that abuse often stems from people the child knows well. Parents and guardians must not assume closeness equates with safety," she said.

Nancy also highlighted the importance of education in addressing sexual abuse, noting that awareness must begin at an early age.

"Education is key. Children must be equipped to identify unsafe situations and empowered to report them without fear," she said.

On the rising threat of child sexual exploitation via social media, she said the government was committed to combating the issue.

She said this required "a whole-of-government approach".

"We collaborate with state religious departments to address root causes and ensure protection for children. We also collaborate with the Communications Ministry to ensure social media platforms remain safe for users," she said.

Nancy said the ministry was collaborating with the National Population and Family Development Board to establish initiatives like Cafe@Teen, which provides young people with safe spaces to engage in positive activities and gain access to counsellors.

"These efforts represent a comprehensive strategy to safeguard the vulnerable and foster a society that prioritises the safety and wellbeing of its children."

Penginapan percuma Anjung Kasih YKN-TNB santuni waris pesakit

PETALING JAYA – Sejak tahun 2018, Tenaga Nasional Berhad (TNB) telah menaja tiga buah Better Brighter Anjung Kasih hasil kolaborasi bersama Yayasan Kebajikan Negara (YKN).

Ia merangkumi Better Brighter Anjung Kasih YKN-TNB di Hospital Serdang, Selangor; Hospital Raja Perempuan Zainab II, Kota Bharu, Kelantan dan di Hospital Melaka.

Pengerusi TNB, Tan Sri Abdul Razak Abdul Majid berkata, kolaborasi berkenaan bertujuan untuk memperkuatkan sokongan terhadap program kesihatan kerajaan serta kebajikan sosial masyarakat, terutamanya daripada golongan yang kurang bernasib baik.

Jelasnya, ia diharap dapat membantu waris pesakit yang tidak berkemampuan menyewa penginapan atau menanggung kos ulang-alik ke hospital secara harian.

"Kita mungkin pernah mendengar cerita tentang cabaran yang dihadapi oleh waris pesakit yang menemani pesakit untuk mendapatkan rawatan di hospital.

"Menyedari keadaan ini, TNB melalui penajaan Anjung Kasih YKN, telah cuba menyahut cabaran untuk menyediakan rumah transit secara percuma untuk keluarga pesakit, terutamanya keluarga pesakit kritikal yang datang dari kawasan luar bandar.

"Kemudahan ini memberikan sokongan penting kepada keluarga pesakit berpendapatan rendah, membantu mereka mendapatkan akses kepada rawatan kesihatan," katanya semasa berucap pada Majlis Perasmian Projek Better Brighter Anjung Kasih YKN-TNB di Hospital Melaka, baru-baru ini.

Majlis tersebut telah dirasmikan oleh Menteri Pembangunan Wanita, Keluarga dan Masyarakat, Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri bersama Menteri Kesihatan, Datuk Seri Zulkifly Ahmad.

Brighter Brighter Anjung Kasih YKN-TNB Hospital Melaka mula ditubuhkan pada 2019 dan ia mendapat tajaan sepenuhnya daripada TNB.

TNB melalui platform tanggungjawab sosial korporat (CSR) telah menaja sejumlah RM1,279,200 bagi kerja naik taraf bangunan, kelengkapan perabot, kemudahan fasiliti, dan kos penyelenggara rumah transit berkenaan selama lima tahun.

Anjung Kasih YKN merupakan tempat penginapan sementara untuk golongan memerlukan khususnya keluarga atau waris pesakit yang tidak berkemampuan menyewa penginapan, namun perlu mengiringi dan menjaga pesakit yang sedang mendapatkan rawatan di hospital kerajaan.

Ia dibina dengan konsep selesa, selamat dan berkualiti demi memastikan kebajikan golongan sasar terjamin.

Sejak penubuhan Anjung Kasih YKN yang pertama pada tahun 2006, seramai 107,633 orang telah mendapat manfaat daripada 19 buah Anjung Kasih yang telah beroperasi di seluruh negara.

Sementara itu, Better, Brighter pula merupakan slogan TNB yang diperkenalkan pada 2013 sebagai usaha untuk menjenamakan semula syarikat, sambil menekankan komitmen mereka dalam menyediakan perkhidmatan lebih baik.

Selangor plans stronger collaboration with nurseries for child safety

SHAH ALAM, Dec 23 — The state government will intensify engagement sessions and child protection education programmes with nursery owners next year to ensure better safety and care standards for children.

State executive councillor for welfare Anfaal Saari said the programme involving 1,028 nursery operators across the state is part of ongoing efforts to enhance service quality, including childcare, while ensuring compliance with established regulations.

“This programme will be carried out in collaboration with the National Population and Family Development Board (LPPKN).

“We recently concluded an engagement session with 250 nursery operators, and, God willing, we plan to hold several more sessions next year.

“These sessions provide an opportunity to address areas for improvement, with our ultimate goal being to ensure all nurseries operate at the highest standards.”

She said this when met after the Batik Family Fun Run in conjunction with the state-level Children’s Day 2024 celebration at Laman Budaya, Persiaran Tasik Seksyen 14, here yesterday.

Anfaal also announced plans to organise a Family Day celebration next year to highlight the importance of family roles within the community.

On a separate note, she shared that the Yayasan Insan Istimewa Selangor (Yanis), established to safeguard the welfare and future of children with disabilities, is set to begin operations next January.

“We propose to appoint Tengku Permaisuri of Selangor Tengku Permaisuri Norashikin as the patron,” she said.

During the tabling of the 2024 Selangor Budget, Menteri Besar Dato’ Seri Amirudin Shari announced that Yanis would be established to extend services to the disabled community regardless of age, unlike the previous focus on those under 18.

Amirudin said Yanis is established in line with the second goal of the First Selangor Plan (RS-1), which aims to enhance social inclusivity and community well-being with a focus on targeted groups.

Authorities can reclaim custody of GISBH children if issues arise at home — Exco

SHAH ALAM, Dec 23 — Regular checks will be conducted by relevant agencies on children rescued from Global Ikhwan Services and Business Holdings Sdn Bhd (GISBH) shelters who have since been released from rehabilitation centres to their parents or legal guardians.

State executive councillor for Islamic affairs and innovation Dr Mohammad Fahmi Ngah said the Social Welfare Department (JKM) and the Selangor Islamic Religious Department (Jais) have the authority to reclaim custody of the children if any issues arise.

“We rescued 434 children, but today only 61 remain in rehabilitation centres. Those released home are subject to conditions and periodic reviews.

“For those still in the rehabilitation centres, we are still tracing their parents and have extended the care period for these children until the end of January,” he told *Media Selangor*.

When asked about the children’s progress, Fahmi said those remaining in the centres are still undergoing rehabilitation due to trauma, which will take some time.

In October, Selangor established a special task force to examine specific rehabilitation programmes for children rescued from GISBH charity homes in the state.

The task force is jointly chaired by Fahmi and the state executive councillor for women empowerment and social welfare Anfaal Saari.

It includes representatives from the police, JKM, Jais, the Selangor State Education Department, the Selangor Zakat Board, the Selangor Islamic Religious Council, the Menteri Besar Selangor (Incorporated) Foundation, Yayasan Selgate, as well as child psychologists and education experts.

The team aims to restore the children’s faith, while ensuring their welfare and health are taken care of.

Teens learn about impact of sexting and pornography in talk by NGO

Exposure to pornography can lead to unrealistic expectations about body image and intimacy, says Yeap Yen Ying, community outreach lead at Women's Centre for Change (WCC) Penang.

"Teenagers who engage in pornography or sexting may develop skewed perceptions of relationships, prioritising physical attributes over emotional intimacy, communication and mutual respect," she explains. "This can hinder the development of healthy, long-lasting relationships."

The WCC-run Respect Programme, now in its 15th year, aims to help teenagers navigate relationships alongside modern challenges. And one of its key components is the Respect Talk for Teenagers, conducted recently at SMK Westlands in Pulau Pinang for 55 boys from Forms Three and Four. The session explored the negative effects of pornography and sexting on teenage relationships, and offering instead, tips for building healthy connections.

The programme also includes the Respect Manual, a resource available for free on WCC's website or as a purchasable hardcopy.

"Pornography often portrays sex unrealistically, creating false beliefs about body image, sexual performance and behaviour," says Yeap. "Sexting, meanwhile, can pressure teens into prioritising physical intimacy over emotional connection, limiting open communication."

"The psychological, emotional and social effects of these practices are far-reaching," she adds.

Therefore, parents, guardians and counsellors play a critical role in guiding teenagers on the healthy use of technology and fostering respectful relationships, Yeap stresses.

According to the Ministry of Health's National Health and Morbidity Survey 2022: Adolescent Health Survey, 154,646 adolescents reported having had sex, with 33% starting before the age of 14. Alarmingly, 88% did not use condoms or other contraception, and 11% have had more than one partner.

A 2022 survey by the Ministry of Women, Family and Community Development revealed that one-third of teenagers access pornography, primarily online. The survey also revealed that 68.8% of youth aged 16-24, and 31.2% of teenagers aged 13-15, have had sex.

These findings highlight a significant rise in teenage sexual activity over the years, increasing from 0.9% in 1994 to 7.6% in 2022.

The Respect Programme hopes to equip teenagers with tools to foster healthy relationships, negotiate boundaries and challenge gender stereotypes. The initiative focuses on topics like friendships, dating, managing conflict and understanding sexual assault. It also raises awareness of gender equality to reduce vulnerability towards exploitation.

"By addressing misconceptions and raising gender awareness, teenagers can make healthier choices in their relationships," says Yeap.

In 2024, the Respect Programme was conducted at five schools, reaching 420 students. While the numbers might seem small, Yeap believes each participant can influence their peers, amplifying the impact and message.

Each 90-minute session is tailored to address the unique challenges faced by different schools or communities. Common issues observed and addressed include the easy access to pornography and online dating.

In addition, WCC also runs a Cybersafety Programme to combat online violence, which has become increasingly prevalent with rising Internet use.

Through these efforts, WCC aims to empower teenagers to form respectful relationships, ensuring they are better equipped to navigate the complexities of modern life, concludes Yeap.

Perkasa pendidikan, kesedaran keselamatan wanita

TELUK INTAN: Pendidikan dan kesedaran mengenai keselamatan wanita perlu diperkasakan bagi menangani isu keganasan dan penderaan terhadap wanita di Malaysia. Timbalan Ketua Dewan Muslimat PAS Malaysia, Dr Rosni Adam menekankan bahawa usaha-usaha ini perlu bersifat holistik dan melibatkan pelbagai pihak.

KUALA LUMPUR: Ibu bapa dinasihatkan memainkan peranan penting dalam mengawal penggunaan media sosial anak-anak terutama yang dibawah umur bagi memastikan keselamatan mereka terjamin.

Speak out, sexual harassment victims advised

KUCHING: An academician Dr Muzaffar Syah Mallow has urged victims of sexual harassment to speak out and report incidents to the relevant authorities.

The Universiti Sains Islam Malaysia's Faculty of Syariah and Law associate professor says it is crucial for the victims to protect their rights and prevent the perpetrators from targeting others.

"Victims of sexual harassment or any other forms of harassment should not be afraid over the special status or position the culprit might have in the society.

"Regardless of the culprit's status, victims have the right to make a complaint or report to protect themselves," he said in a statement yesterday.

Muzaffar Syah pointed out that with Malaysia being governed by the rule of law, the victims should make use of the existing legal frameworks laws to protect their rights and seek justice.

"Victims must play an active role in stopping any bad behaviour or wrongdoing, regardless of the culprit's social status or position," he said.

Muzaffar Syah emphasised that sexual harassment could happen to anyone regardless of gender. He added that it encompassed a range of actions, from mild transgressions to sexual abuse or sexual assault, and could occur in various settings such as at the workplace or one's home, schools, universities, restaurants, shopping complexes and even at the bus stops.

"Victims of sexual harassment often keep the problem to themselves as the nature of such offence is very sensitive, especially for Eastern societies

like Malaysia. As such, serious steps must be taken to reduce and stop the problem before it goes out of control in the country," he said.

Muzaffar Syah highlighted that among the existing legislations that regulate sexual harassment are the Penal Code, the Employment Act 1955, Industrial Relations Act 1967 and Occupational Safety and Health Act 1994, as well administrative laws like the Code of Conduct of the Public Officers (Conduct and Discipline) Regulations 1993 and the Government Circular

Guidelines for Handling Sexual Harassment in the Workplace No.5, 2018.

In 2022, he said Malaysia enacted Anti-Sexual Harassment Act 2022 to address these issues more effectively.

In this respect, Muzaffar Syah said Section 2 of the Act defines sexual harassment as "any unwanted conduct of a sexual nature, in any form, whether verbal, non-verbal, visual, gestural or physical, directed at a person which is reasonably offensive or humiliating or is a threat to his well-being". He

detailed the various forms of sexual harassment, including verbal harassment (offensive or suggestive remarks, comments, and jokes), non-verbal harassment (leering, suggestive gestures, provocative eating), visual harassment (showing pornographic materials, drawing sexual sketches), psychological harassment (repeated unwanted social invitations, proposals for dates or intimacy), and physical harassment (inappropriate touching, patting, pinching, hugging, kissing, fondling, and sexual assault).

UM lecturer suspended for sexual harassment

KUALA LUMPUR: The Universiti Malaya (UM) lecturer alleged to have shared sexually explicit messages has been suspended.

The university said the action was taken in accordance with the Statutory Bodies (Discipline and Surcharge) Act 2000.

"UM will continue to ensure that its campus environment is safe and conducive, including taking strict action against any party who commits misconduct, regardless of position or status," it said in a statement, according to Bernama.

Last Saturday, Higher Education Minister Datuk Seri Dr Zambry Abdul Kadir ordered UM to conduct an immediate investigation into two allegations of sexual harassment that tarnished the university's reputation.

Zambry said the order was also issued so that UM would not take the case lightly, to ensure that the case truly received justice.

He added that the ministry had no tolerance for misconduct that was against the country's laws.

Previously, the UM Feminism Club alleged in a statement that a professor had sexually harassed his students by sending inappropriate pictures of himself.

The statement added that while reports had been lodged against the lecturer, no action was taken.

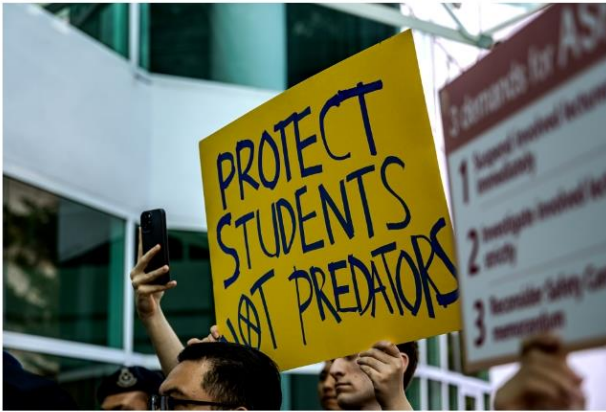
Later, in a separate statement, UM vice-chancellor Prof Datuk Seri Dr Noor Azuan Abu Osman stressed the university's commitment to handling the case swiftly, regardless of the individual's position or status.

UM sex harassment controversy: What do Malaysia's laws say about obscenity and unsolicited nudes?

KUALA LUMPUR, Dec 23 — The controversy surrounding a Universiti Malaya professor who allegedly sent nude pictures to students has ignited debate on Malaysian laws and institutional policies on sexual harassment and images.

What happened?

The professor is accused of sending unsolicited explicit photos of himself to students.

In November, some of these were printed and posted on the university campus to warn students about him. The matter gained more attention when the matter was also shared on social media.

The university said on December 18 that it was investigating, without disclosing if any action has been taken.

On December 20, the UM Feminism Club held a demonstration to demand fair and transparent action, alleging that there was a history of such sexual harassment on campus that regularly went unpunished and unreported.

To support its allegations of reprisals for publicising such behaviour, the club also said the professor in question has lodged a police report against them for criminal defamation.

The club also said the university removed the post warning students about the professor on December 15.

What does the law say?

Malaysian laws are patent on the matter of nude images, regardless of whether these were solicited or not.

Among laws that would come into play include

Communications and Multimedia Act 1998

Section 211 of this law prohibits content that is indecent, obscene, or offensive, particularly if intended to harass or annoy.

Punishment: A fine of up to RM50,000, imprisonment of up to one year, or both, with an additional fine of RM1,000 for each day the offence continues after conviction.

Section 233 is a controversial section due to its amorphous nature. It criminalises using communication networks to transmit obscene or offensive messages with intent to harass.

Punishment: A fine of up to RM50,000, imprisonment of up to one year, or both, with an additional fine of RM1,000 for each day the offence continues after conviction.

Penal Code

Section 292 of the Penal Code prohibits creating, distributing, or possessing obscene material, including pornography.

Punishment: Imprisonment of up to three years, a fine, or both.

Is consensual sexting legal?

Sexting, or text messaging of a sexual nature, between consenting adults is not explicitly prohibited, but the creation, distribution, or possession of obscene material remains illegal under Section 292 of the Penal Code. Publicly displaying or advertising such material is also a crime, punishable by imprisonment, fines, or both.

In short, any form of pornography is illegal and prohibited.

What about UM's regulations?

According to UM's Code of Free From Sexual Exploitation, Abuse and Harassment, any form of sexual exploitation, abuse, coercion and annoyance is prohibited.

Section 4.2 and its subsections define sexual harassment as any form of sexual attention spoken or otherwise that is unwelcome including cause and intent to produce an environment full of stress, threats or hostility

Section 4.3.2 states that sexual annoyance is sexual conduct that is insulting or embarrassing, threatens personal safety and is displeasing to the person who is harassed, but has no direct bearing on one's employment opportunities or benefits.

Section 4.43 on visual harassment states that any act of sending notes, letters, email, pictures (photos) posters, objects, reading materials or any message through various types of mediums such as short messaging system (SMS), multimedia messaging system (MMS), WhatsApp, Telegram or any chat room in social media that contain sexual elements through the use of any form of media equipment, electronic equipment or communication equipment to the complainant that causes the complainant to feel offended, insulted or intimidated is a form of sexual harassment.

Where are we now?

The Higher Education Ministry said on December 21 that UM was investigating the allegations against the professor.

However, it also highlighted the police report lodged by the accused professor, saying that "measures that violate legal procedures would undermine the ongoing investigation process."

Batu Pahat: "Bertaubatlah, jadikan hukuman ini untuk kamu bermuhasabah diri," nasihat Majistret Suhaila Shafi'uddin sebelum menjatuhkan hukuman ke atas pelajar berusia 17 tahun atas 63 pertuduhan amang seksual dan memiliki video pornografi juniornya.

Pesalah juvana itu diperintah menjalani hukuman di Sekolah Henry Gurney, Melaka selama tiga tahun oleh Mahkamah Majistret di sini, berkuat kuasa hari ini, selari dengan Seksyen 91 (1) (f) Akta Kanak-Kanak 2001.

Mengikut pertuduhan pertama hingga ke-62, remaja itu didakwa melakukan amang seksual bukan fizikal terhadap tujuh pelajar junior lelaki dengan meminta mangsa menunjukkan tubuh supaya dilihat oleh tertuduh.

Perbuatan dilakukan di beberapa lokasi berasingan antaranya tandas surau dan sekolah serta rumah mangsa di daerah ini, Kluang dan Tangkak.

Kesemua kejadian itu berlaku antara 10 pagi hingga 11 malam, bermula Disember 2023 hingga hujung bulan lalu, membabitkan mangsa berusia antara 13 hingga 17 tahun.

Tertuduh didakwa mengikut Seksyen 15 (a) (ii) Akta Kesalahan-Kesalahan Seksual Terhadap Kanak-Kanak (AKKSKK) 2017 yang memperuntukkan penjara sehingga 10 tahun atau denda RM20,000 atau kedua-dua, bagi setiap pertuduhan dikenakan terhadapnya.

Bagi pertuduhan ke-63, dia didakwa memiliki video pornografi kanak-kanak dalam komputer riba di sebuah rumah pada 2.30 pagi, 11 November lalu dan kesalahan didakwa mengikut Seksyen 10 AKKSTKK.

Pendakwaan dikendalikan Timbalan Pendakwa Raya Farah Wahidah Mohd Sharif, manakala tertuduh diwakili peguam Mohd Razak Sharif.

Terdahulu, Pegawai Akhlak Jabatan Kebajikan Malaysia (JKM) Batu Pahat, Silanoraismawati Mhd Zain ketika pembentangan laporan akhlak mencadangkan agar tertuduh ditempatkan di Sekolah Henry Gurney.

Mahkamah turut memerintahkan tertuduh menjalani pengawasan polis selama setahun serta melapor diri di balai polis berhampiran sebaik selesai menjalani hukuman dan ibu bapanya dibenar melawat sebulan sekali.

PLEADED NOT GUILTY

Groom-to-be among 6 charged with sexual assault on teen

MUAR: A man, 23, set to get engaged this Saturday and another scheduled to marry next year were among six people jointly charged at the Sessions Court here yesterday with committing physical sexual assault against a teenager five years ago.

Hafsyal Sufian Kamaluddin and Muhammad Azizi Shamsor Kamar, 23, along with four others, pleaded not guilty when the charges were read to them before Judge Sayani Mohd Nor.

Also charged were Azizi's twin brother, Muhammad Azizan, as well as Muhammad Asraf Rosli,

23; Muhammad Hafize Abd Rahim, 21; and Muhammad Amirul Aiman Sharrol, 21.

According to the charge sheet, all of the accused were charged with committing the offence against the girl, who was 16 at the time of the incident, in a house in Tangkak between 1.30am and 2am on Jan 20, 2019.

Deputy public prosecutors Darnial Munir and Diyana Najihah Muhamed Fauzi prosecuted while all of the accused were not represented.

Earlier, the prosecution proposed bail of RM20,000 for each

of the accused and requested the court to impose two additional conditions.

The court granted bail of RM10,000 with one surety for each accused. The court ordered the six accused to report to the nearest police station once a

month and prohibited them from contacting the victim or prosecution witnesses.

The case has been set for mention on Jan 27 to facilitate the submission of documents and the appointment of lawyers for all of the accused.

Berdasarkan fakta kes, polis menerima laporan daripada pihak Hospital Sultanah Nora Ismail (HSNI) memaklumkan seorang pesakit bawah umur didapati hamil ketika menerima rawatan.

Siasatan polis mendapati mangsa sebelum itu mengalami sakit perut sebelum dibawa tertuduh menjalani pemeriksaan di hospital terbabit.

Hasil siasatan polis mendapati mangsa dirogol bapa kandung sejak berusia sembilan tahun dan kali terakhir tertuduh melakukan perbuatan itu pada Ogos lalu.

Ketika kejadian, mangsa sedang tidur dalam bilik dan tertuduh menyelinap masuk seterusnya melakukan perbuatan terkutuk itu.

Namun, tertuduh berhenti melakukan perbuatan itu selepas mangsa kerap muntah dan sakit perut.

Selain itu, mangsa turut memberitahu dia dirogol antara empat hingga lima kali seminggu tanpa menceritakan kepada sesiapa pun.

Tertuduh yang juga pemegang kad pengenalan sementara, berkahwin dengan warga tempatan, namun terpaksa berjauhan dengan isterinya yang kini bekerja dan menetap di Australia sejak tujuh tahun lalu.

Susulan laporan diterima HSNI, polis membuat tangkapan terhadap tertuduh di rumahnya pada jam 4 pagi, 17 Disember lalu untuk membantu siasatan.

Pendakwaan dikendalikan Timbalan Pendakwaan Raya, Darnial Munir dan Diyana Najihah Muhamed Fauzi, manakala tertuduh tidak diwakili peguam.

Selain dipenjarakan dan sebatan, mahkamah juga memerintahkan tertuduh menjalani sesi kaunseling ketika dalam penjara serta pengawasan polis dua tahun sebaik selesai hukuman, selari dengan Seksyen 26 dan 27 Akta Kesalahan-Kesalahan Seksual Terhadap Kanak-Kanak (AKKSTKK) 2017.
