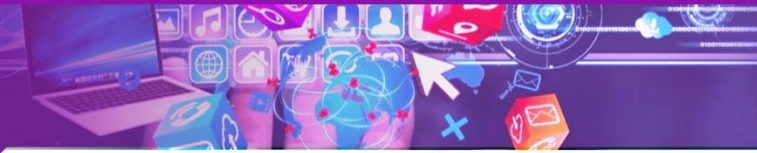

TUMPAT: Social welfare, tourism sector empowerment, and population safety are the primary factors that have resulted in the selection of Kampung Pasir Pekan Tengah as the Madani Adopted Village under the Ministry of Women, Family, and Community Development (KPWKM).

KPWKM secretary-general Datuk Dr Maziah Che Yusoff said around 1,800 residents would benefit from programmes implemented in the village, leading to various positive impacts.

"The residents have initiated tourist boats to explore the scenery around the Kelantan River and nearby islands. Therefore, the Madani Adopted Village programme will explore the need to construct permanent

boat jetties in the area to boost their economy.

"Additionally, road improvement projects will enhance the villagers' safety, ensuring they remain connected to essential facilities, as well as have access to Kota Bharu even during floods," she said at a media briefing in Kampung Pasir Pekan Tengah, here yesterday.

Maziah said a survey conducted yesterday aimed to identify the facilities and social issues, as well as assess the level of community welfare, and to pinpoint the programmes and services required by the villagers.

"RM2.5 million has been allocated to ensure the success of this programme, which will be monitored by the Ministry of Finance from Jan 1 to Dec 31, 2024," she said. — Bernama

"Therefore, the MADANI Adopted Village programme will explore the need to construct permanent boat jetties in the area to boost their economy.

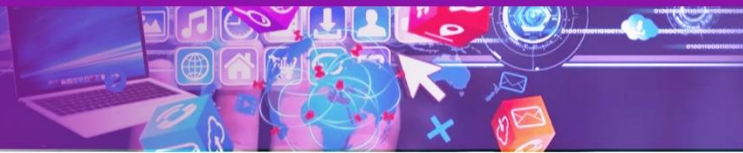

GEORGE TOWN: Siri sambutan keceriaan tahunan Kumpulan Sunway (Sunway) kembali dengan #SunwayforGood Sinar Ramadan bagi berkongsi kegembiraan kepada lebih 4,000 komuniti masyarakat kurang bernasib baik di seluruh negara.

More than just housewives: Ministry encourages women to embrace leadership, financial independence

SHAH ALAM – Women, Family and Community Development Minister Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri encourages women to create their own opportunities, achieve financial independence, and take on leadership roles.

She said it was important to nurture a culture where women feel empowered to express themselves, undergo leadership training and acknowledge their remarkable abilities across all domains.

Citing the gender disparity in the job market, she said that men comprised 81 per cent compared to women which stood at 56.2 per cent.

She stressed that women were not seeking competition with men but strived to close the gender gap.

"I always emphasise this point (closing the gender gap) because women typically prioritise their families, often choosing not to work. There is a need for training to empower them.

"How do we address this gap in terms of fostering leadership among women and within families and communities? My goal is to provide them with the necessary training and support to become confident leaders.

"I encourage them to voice their opinions and take on leadership roles," she said.

Despite initial apprehension from the women, Nancy said she witnessed the women were willing to step up to speak even if they were nervous, which was commendable.

"I believe in acknowledging and applauding their courage when they overcome their fears to speak up.

"This is an essential aspect of leadership that requires nurturing and encouragement." She said when met recently.

Nancy also highlighted the significant number of women in rural areas who considered it their duty to care for their families but only deemed themselves as mere housewives.

Disputing this notion, Nancy emphasised the vital role of housewives, noting that their responsibilities started from the moment they woke up until they slept, without compensation.

She pointed out that many were either underpaid or unpaid, despite the essential nature of their work.

She said her organisation's goal of empowering women to earn their livelihoods and stressed her longstanding commitment to this and this was one of the reasons why she had been fought for it ever since she was in a non-governmental organisation (NGO).

While volunteering for the NGO, she faced financial constraints and had to seek assistance from agencies to identify target groups.

When determining whom to train, the focus was on women and she readily offered the organisation's female members for such programmes.

She stressed by taking on leadership roles, women could inspire admiration within their families, motivating younger relatives to aspire to similar achievements in the future.

"I aim to instil a spirit of empowerment among women, urging them to embrace roles beyond just being women, including those of mothers and wives.

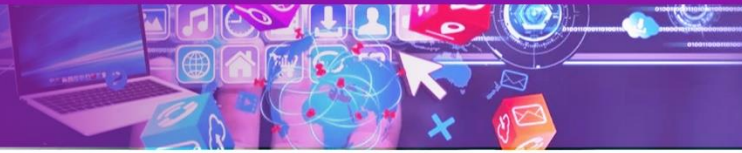
"Some men may belittle their wives due to their dependency and it is something we strive to change," she added.

Nancy urged husbands to show respect towards their wives and at the same time encouraged women to be financially independent, asserting that this independence commands respect from both spouses and sets an example for their children.

Additionally, Nancy highlighted the importance of addressing economic and security issues alongside leadership development programmes for women.

She said their efforts in organising economic initiatives, aimed to stress the significance of women's participation in the workforce, which doesn't necessarily entail leaving their homes.

Under the ministry, various programmes such as Wanita Bangkit, Two-Year Exit Program, Mama Care, and NGO initiatives like Skwad Waja are implemented to support women's development.

SHAH ALAM – Envision the corridors of power teeming with activity. Now, imagine a radiant beacon piercing through the solemnity – that is the country's Women, Family, and Community Development Minister Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri.

Nancy possesses a heart as vast as her responsibilities, emerging as a champion for families nationwide. She ardently advocates for domestic causes and the betterment of our entire nation. For Nancy, the cornerstone of everything lies within the family unit.

Recognising that a strong nation stems from sturdy households, she places significant emphasis on fortifying familial bonds. However, Nancy's dedication transcends her own doorstep.

Tirelessly, she labours to elevate all, ensuring every voice resonates and every family's needs are met. True leadership, she believes, lies in serving the people you care about.

"As a leader, I know what my priorities are. So, for me, my main priority is still my children, my family. However, to have a very good family and good children who will live happily, I must work.

"To secure a comfortable life, I supported my husband in earning income by initially working myself and eventually I transitioned to entrepreneurship to have more flexibility and control over my time," she said.

She opened up about how she worked to have a comfortable life instead of depending on only her husband as the breadwinner for the family, and this was what she taught her daughter: "Do not depend on some rich boyfriend or husband."

Just like the women in the country, Nancy wanted her daughter to be strong and independent so that women could plan for their own future and take care of themselves and their family.

It was more than being able to be there for the children, she said, but it also meant that mothers would be able to provide for them too.

Aside from her family, Nancy outlined that her constituency was her second priority and she always made sure that she would be with the people every week to ensure that she could help them with their needs.

"Now, as a politician, I balance the responsibilities of my constituency with my family commitments. I make it a point to return to Sarawak almost every weekend to ensure my constituents receive the attention they deserve.

"I need to go on the ground because the thing, is you cannot just work from the desk. You need to be there to understand the situation fully," she added.

"In essence, my priorities revolve around family, constituency, and ministry," she told Sinar Daily.

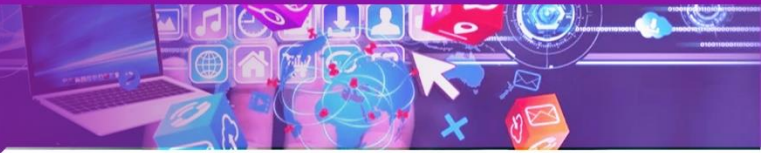
On her dedication to the ministry, Nancy would review long-standing traditions that might have stagnated progress and dismantled them with steady reforms, determined to improve their effectiveness.

"Empowering women is a cause close to my heart," she said.

This could be seen when Nancy championed the plight of women including abuse cases, aid for upcoming entrepreneurs under the ministry's purview and educated women trapped by childcare, demanding investment to break these invisible chains.

During a cabinet meeting, her voice rang with conviction as she spoke of the causes for women including countless women forced to choose between career and family due to the country's working system and infrastructure which have yet to support working mothers.

Her suggested initiatives to the Prime Minister, though not fully mirrored yet, planted a seed of hope but the fight for women's empowerment, she knew, was far from over.



From mother's apron strings to political rings: Nancy Shukri's path to politics

SHAH ALAM – We all have heroes, those guiding lights who illuminate our path and for Women, Family, and Community Development Minister Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri, her hero wore an apron, not a cape.

As a young girl, she never envisioned herself on the political stage but politics found her, courtesy of her remarkable mother, the late Bibi MacPherson @ McPherson, who was the women's chief for a political party in a small village in Sarawak.

In a recent interview with Sinar Daily, Nancy revealed that while politics wasn't a career she actively pursued, she had always found joy in political discourse, even during her school days.

Reflecting on her journey, Nancy credited her mother for inadvertently introducing her to politics.

"Politics was not a path I actively pursued. It was my mother who brought me to it. It all goes back to my mother, she was there, making a real difference in the community.

"I was indirectly involved because, as the youngest daughter, mothers often bring you along wherever they go. So, I observed and listened to people, although I didn't realise it was politics at the time.

"My mother was leading the political party, overseeing the entire area, including Petrajaya. So, I was inadvertently exposed to politics through her.

"My mother had a natural inclination to help others. She is kind," she said.

Being there with her mother as she helped the community sparked a desire for her to serve and make the world a better place.

Back in the "old days," before official titles, Nancy said her mother led the women across the river, overseeing countless villages.

Each village had its own leader, but it her mother was one of those who truly guided the women.

Recalling her childhood, Nancy said her house was nestled near the village's surau and whenever her mom held meetings at the building, she could hear her voice booming through the microphone.

It wasn't just the words, though. Nancy marvelled at the way her mom spoke – no prepared speeches, just sentences from pure heart and wisdom.

These were the women leaders Nancy admired, the ones who spoke from the soul, not from a script.

"It's a reminder that heroes come in comfy clothes and inspiration can bloom in the most ordinary places – like a loving mom showing you how to change the world, one step at a time," she said.

Nancy further reflected on her mother's people-centric nature, describing their home as a place where anyone could stop by for anything, even for the youths.

She recounted how her mother would encourage guests to help themselves from the fridge, illustrating her kindness.

In many ways, Nancy feels she has been following in her mother's footsteps, although circumstances have evolved over time.

"My parents could not afford much. My father was an independent (politician), an opposition. He had to find his own way, taking on odd jobs to make ends meet.

"Meanwhile my mother did not earn anything but she had willingly pawned her jewellery if she needed to, in order to help those in need," she said.

Nancy said families in need would come to her doorstep and they would sought help with things like buying land, which was not cheap and her mother would take out her purse and gave what she could to help the people.

"I know this because I was the 'record-keeper' – meticulously logging down every request. My mother however would always say it's not a loan, it's charity," she said.

Aside from the adults, Nancy said her mother would often offer money to buy ice cream for children who gathered near their house.

Similarly, whenever youngsters looked famished, her mother would point them towards the fridge – a silent invitation to help themselves.

"My mother's actions instilled in me a deep sense of service, a way to truly connect with people and put their needs first. Looking back, I realised that is where her flames for people-centricity comes from.

"I enjoy politics, thrive on conversation, but the question of qualifications for being a politician always lingered. Maybe, like my mother, all it takes is a big heart and a willingness to help," she said.

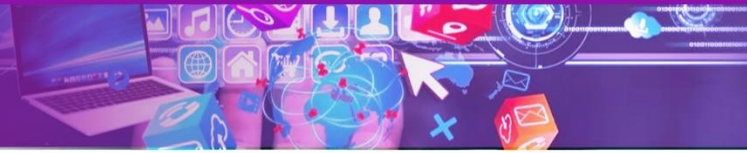
Nancy also slowly found herself naturally following her mother's footsteps when she joined a non-governmental organisation – the same one her mother frequented – where she knew she could help even more people.

Her first official step into politics? Nancy said it was when she was offered a role as the late former Sarawak Governor Tun Taib Mahmud's political secretary.

Though unfamiliar with the position, she thrived on political discussions by observing, debating, and sometimes offering a healthy dose of criticism.

"Good criticism. It is how you push for better things for your people. It doesn't mean you're against the government, just that you care," she added.

This marked her formal entry into the world of politics, focusing on families, communities, and women – a world she was uniquely qualified for thanks to her mother's spirit.

She said the evolving landscape, with discussions now focusing on Artificial Intelligence (AI), the Internet of Things (IoT), and the Fourth Industrial Revolution, aspects that were previously unimaginable.

"Previously, I anticipated that in a few years, we would witness the rise of internet connectivity, artificial intelligence and various innovative technologies but how it will happen, I don't know.

"Until Covid-19 hit, we saw a rapid acceleration of digitalisation, even in rural areas, where QR code usage became widespread for online transactions in online food businesses like selling Nasi Lemak and Laksa.

"There was also a surge in online food businesses because people cannot go out and from here, it has been accelerated. So, for young people, by the time you want to be a leader, the situation will change," she added.

Nancy advised the next generation of leaders not to merely criticise the past, as those who came before them had already laid the groundwork.

She also urged them to enact reforms to improve the situation and become effective politicians.

In Malaysia, Nancy said, politicians were generally not well-compensated, particularly at the federal level where their salaries have been subject to a 20 per cent deduction since the onset of Covid-19.

However, Nancy highlighted politicians did not complained because they understood that political service transcends monetary rewards.

She said personally for her, serving the people was paramount and some aspects of the service were best kept in one's heart rather than expressed in words.

She emphasised the importance of genuine assistance and highlights the need for the younger generation to possess strong spiritual resilience, especially in navigating the complexities of media and social platforms.

"In politics, it's crucial to possess strong spiritual resilience. It's not about being popular. Popularity can manifest in various ways, whether positive or negative, so be strong to face this, especially spiritually.

"For young individuals, the government encourages their participation and values their input. I really want to hear and would like to engage with them.

"I welcome their ideas; however, they need to ensure what they suggest to you is easily applicable or accessible," she said.

Using Sarawak as an example, she stressed how perceptions have shifted.

Previously criticised, Sarawak is now at the forefront due to its progressive initiatives. Those who once condemned the state now recognise its efforts.

Nancy said Sarawak's focus on development and the economy has drawn attention and engagement.

While politics is inherent, she said stability is crucial for progress.

She urged young people to assess current leadership and strive for improvements for the benefit of both the people and the nation.

SHAH ALAM - Women, Family, and Community Development Minister Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri emphasised the importance of aspiring politicians moving beyond mere ambition, advocating for active engagement in observation and idea formulation.

She urged young Malaysians aspiring for leadership roles to anticipate and adapt to evolving agendas and priorities in politics, encouraging them to contribute positively to the country if they believe they could bring about change.

"There is a need for young leaders to innovate, aspiring politicians to observe and introduce fresh ideas to better serve the increasingly sophisticated new generation and prepare the country for their future.

"When engaging in politics, genuine interest requires more than mere status as a political figure; keen observation is paramount. Rather than merely criticising, offering constructive suggestions is crucial to drive positive change.

"Instead of solely depending on social media, which reliability may be questionable, it is crucial to assess government policies to ensure they genuinely serve your interests.

"If you think that you can do better, okay, be in politics and do it for the country," she said in an interview with Sinar Daily.

She said the younger generation should take note of the practices of previous generations, acknowledging that what was once deemed appropriate might not hold true today.

Highlighting the need for innovation, she stressed that while past practices were once relevant, they might no longer suffice in the present context.

Hence, she urged young politicians to bring fresh perspectives and innovative ideas to the table and highlighted the importance of preparing the country for the challenges and opportunities of the future.

Reflecting on her tenure as a minister in the Prime Minister's Department, she recalled discussions envisioning a technologically advanced nation by 2020.

LUNDU: Jabatan Kebajikan Masyarakat Sarawak (JKMS) mengalu-alukan mana-mana individu yang berminat, prihatin, rela hati dan tidak mengharapkan balasan untuk menjadi Sukarelawan JKMS.

Menteri Pembangunan Wanita, Kanak-Kanak dan Kesejahteraan Komuniti, Datuk Sri Fatimah Abdullah berkata, ia susulan masih ramai lagi golongan kurang bernasib baik dan memerlukan masih belum dibantu terutama di kawasan sukar dijangkau kerana tiada maklumat serta sukar hadir ke pejabat untuk memohon bantuan.

'Lundu in need of more Welfare Dept officers'

KUCHING: The state Welfare Department lacks officers to provide comprehensive services in Lundu, said Minister for Women, Childhood and Community Wellbeing Development Dato Sri Fatimah Abdullah.

She said at present, there are only two officers from the department serving the community in Lundu.

"I believe there are still many people in need who have not been helped, especially in areas that are difficult for the department to reach.

"Given the large areas that Lundu district covers – all the way up to Sematan, our two officers are not able to provide comprehensive services," she said at a pre-Aidilfitri programme in Lundu yesterday.

The text of her speech was read by her deputy minister Datuk Rosey Yunus. Fatimah said volunteers would be required to

help resolve the lack of manpower faced by the department.

According to her, volunteers would be expected to assist people who need to apply for the monthly assistance from the department.

She also appealed to local community leaders to help refer those who need monthly welfare assistance to the department.

"The department will also continue its outreach programme to deliver comprehensive welfare services and assistance to those in

need," she said.

On yesterday's event, Fatimah said the Welfare Department had set aside RM1,662,400 for distribution to a total of 16,624 recipients throughout the state.

Recipients were given cash assistance of RM100 each and a hamper worth RM250 sponsored by Petrolim Nasional Berhad (Petronas).

Fatimah thanked Petronas for co-organising the programme by sponsoring the hampers.

"Petronas is our strategic partner in carrying out joint responsibilities and helping the department achieve the objectives of the programme," she said.

Additionally, she said Petronas has collaborated with the department in organising similar programmes to help make a positive impact on the needy during festive seasons such as Chinese New Year, Gawai Dayak and Deepavali.

KUCHING: Jabatan Kebajikan Masyarakat Sarawak (JKMS) sukar menyampaikan perkhidmatan kebajikan secara menyeluruh di Daerah Lundu kerana kekurangan pegawai kebajikan ditempatkan di situ.

Lundu hospital receives 2 haemodialysis machines from Welfare Department

KUCHING: The state Welfare Department yesterday handed over two haemodialysis machines worth RM82,300 to the Lundu Hospital yesterday.

On hand to present the machines was Deputy Minister of Women, Childhood and Community Wellbeing Development Datuk Rosey Yunus, who represented minister Dato Sri Fatimah Abdullah.

Fatimah, in a speech read by Rosey, said the two haemodialysis machines were part of the 24 that the department purchased last year for 14 hospitals across Sarawak.

"Each machine costs RM41,150 and the total costs for the 24 haemodialysis machines stood at RM987,600," she said.

Fatimah said Betong Hospital, Mukah Hospital and Bintulu Hospital were each given three haemodialysis machines, while Sarikei Hospital, Lawas Hospital and Tatau Health Clinic received two machines each.

Those receiving one haemodialysis machine each were Sarawak Heart Centre, Serian Hospital, Debak Health Clinic, Saratok Hospital, Kanowit Hospital, Dalat Hospital and Limbang Hospital.

Fatimah also said a total of 198 individuals had received

the special kidney patient assistance totalling over RM9.31 million between Jan 1, 2020 and Jan 31 this year.

On Lundu Hospital, she said this health facility started operation in August 2006 with four kidney patients receiving treatment.

Since then, she said the number of kidney patients at the hospital's Haemodialysis Unit had increased to 130.

"The number of haemodialysis machines has increased from four to 10 this year. The majority of kidney patients at Lundu Hospital hail from Lundu and Siburan districts," added Fatimah.

Sarawak biayai hampir RM10 juta untuk rawatan 198 pesakit buah pinggang

LUNDU: Kerajaan Sarawak membelanjakan hampir RM10 juta bagi membiayai sebanyak 198 pesakit buah pinggang di negeri ini menjalani rawatan sejak 1 Januari 2020.

Menteri Pembangunan Wanita, Kanak-Kanak dan Kesejahteraan Komuniti, Datuk Sri Fatimah Abdullah berkata, peruntukan tersebut disalurkan melalui Bantuan Khas Pesakit Buah Pinggang (BKPBP) yang dilaksanakan Jabatan Kebajikan Masyarakat Sarawak (JKMS).

"Sejak 1 Januari 2020 sehingga 31 Januari tahun ini, sebanyak 198 pesakit buah pinggang telah dibantu, melibatkan jumlah perbelanjaan sebanyak RM9,310,424.75.

"Inisiatif ini bertujuan meringankan beban serta meningkatkan kesejahteraan hidup pesakit buah pinggang di negeri ini," katanya.

Beliau berkata demikian dalam teks ucapannya yang dibacakan oleh Timbalan Menteri Pembangunan Wanita dan Kanak-Kanak, Datuk Rosey Yunus pada Majlis Penyerahan Mesin Hemodialisis kepada Hospital Lundu di Hospital Lundu, hari ini.

Ujarnya, untuk tahun ini sahaja sebanyak RM2,501,796 telah disalurkan kepada 13 pesakit yang layak, manakala RM2,037,264 kepada 45 pesakit pada 2023, RM2,367,836 untuk 11 pesakit (2022), RM1,983,076 bagi 67 (2021) dan RM420,452 kepada 62 pesakit (2020).

Mengulas lanjut ujarnya, dianggarkan seorang pesakit buah pinggang di bawah skim tersebut layak menerima maksima sebanyak RM1,820 sebulan untuk 14 sesi rawatan hemodialisis di pusat rawatan NGO dengan kos setahun sejumlah RM21,840.

"Bagi kos rawatan di pusat perubatan swasta, dianggarkan seorang pesakit mendapat bantuan sehingga RM2,800 sebulan dan RM33,600 setahun.

"Bantuan ini juga merangkumi sokongan pengangkutan sehingga RM700 sebulan melibatkan 14 sesi rawatan dan setahun menelan peruntukan RM8,400," jelasnya.

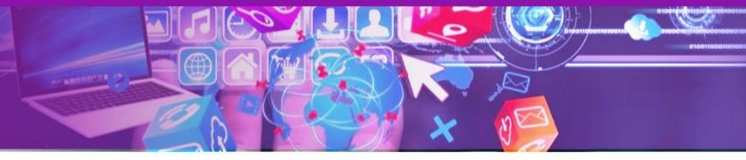
Tambahnya, antara kriteria ditetapkan untuk melayakkan menerima bantuan ialah pesakit mesti warga Sarawak; bukan penjawat awam, pesara atau pencarum PERKESO; golongan B40 dan M40 dengan pendapatan per kapita tidak melebihi RM1,020 sebulan, tidak mendapat subsidi rawatan atau bantuan pengangkutan dari mana-mana agensi kerajaan, swasta atau NGO.

Sementara mengenai majlis tersebut, ujarnya sebanyak dua buah mesin hemodialisis diserahkan kepada Hospital Lundu dengan masing-masing bernilai RM41,150.

"Sejak beroperasi pada Ogos 2006, bilangan mesin hemodialisis telah bertambah dari empat kepada 10 buah mesin pada tahun ini.

"Majoriti pesakit adalah dari Daerah Lundu sehingga Siburan melibatkan seramai 130 orang yang mendapatkan rawatan dialisis di sini," jelasnya.

Beliau turut memberitahu pada tahun lalu, Jabatan Kebajikan Masyarakat Sarawak membeli sebanyak 24 buah mesin hemodialisis secara tender melibatkan keseluruhan perbelanjaan sebanyak RM987,600.

Laksana pencegahan, intervensi holistik cegah gejala buli

Kita sering dimomokkan perbuatan membuli itu adalah perkara biasa terutama apabila memasuki asrama, sekolah atau tempat baharu. Bahkan wujud tanggapan kononnya buli perlu ada untuk meningkatkan sifat hormat junior kepada senior, membentuk sahsiah baik dan mengajar disiplin menghormati orang lebih tua.

Ada pula pelaksana dan pengurusan mengamalkan kaedah tradisional mengangap buli dapat membentuk belia kuat dan tidak lembik tetapi akan menjadi luar biasa apabila ada kematian berlaku. Apabila buli menyebabkan kematian, semua pihak akan mengambil jalan mudah menuding jari kepada pelaku.

Lazimnya pada minggu orientasi, semua pelajar diberitahu undang-undang sekolah atau institusi dan jika ada melakukan kesalahan, tindakan boleh diambil. Pelbagai peraturan, prosedur dan pelbagai undang-undang diwujudkan akan tetapi kenapa membuli hingga menyebabkan kematian masih wujud.

Tindakan membuli perlu diambil serius dan bukan perkara tradisi atau perkara biasa di sekolah, universiti atau kolej bahkan di tempat kerja. Pihak pengurusan dan kepimpinan perlu memandang perkara buli ini dengan lebih serius. Kita tidak mahu pemimpin masa depan, bakal bekerja satu hari nanti membawa budaya tidak sihat ini ke alam pekerjaan.

Buli menggunakan kuasa dan jawatan yang ada demi kepentingan diri, lebih memalukan apabila

membabitkan golongan bekerja dalam bidang profesional.

Buli adalah fenomena sosial serius sering berlaku di pelbagai kalangan masyarakat. Penyebab kejadian buli adalah hasil daripada faktor kompleks dan berbeza-beza. Perbezaan sosial seperti status ekonomi, kaum, agama dan orientasi seksual boleh mendorong kes buli.

Alami masalah identiti diri

Orang membuli mungkin mengalami masalah identiti diri dan menggunakan tingkah laku itu sebagai cara mencari pengiktirafan atau penerimaan dalam masyarakat.

Persekitaran sosial, budaya dan media juga mempengaruhi kejadian buli. Justeru, terdapat risiko serius terhadap kesihatan mental dan emosi membuli serta kesan jangka panjang terhadap mangsa buli.

Oleh itu, usaha pencegahan dan intervensi holistik adalah penting untuk mengurangkan keja-

dian buli termasuk pendidikan mengenai empati.

Penting untuk meningkatkan kesedaran bahaya dan kesan buli melalui pendidikan dan program kesedaran di sekolah, rumah, tempat kerja, komuniti dan masyarakat.

Ini termasuk memasukkan kurikulum antibuli dalam pendidikan serta menganjurkan ceramah dan bengkel untuk pelajar, guru, kakitangan dan ibu bapa mengenai akta dan undang-undang kesalahan buli.

Secara tuntasnya, buli bukan budaya kita. Belia Malaysia hebat dan berjaya bukan menjadi membuli di sekolah atau tempat kerja. Budaya rakyat Malaysia yang berjaya sentiasa memberikan sokongan dan bantuan kepada insan lemah dan serba kekurangan.

Golongan ini perlu didengari, dilindungi dan disokong secara emosi dan praktikal. Sekolah dan tempat kerja perlu menyediakan saluran komunikasi terbuka bagi mangsa buli untuk melaporkan kejadian buli dan mendapat bantuan diperlukan.

Menerusi pendekatan holistik dan kerjasama semua pihak, kita dapat mengatasi masalah buli dan membentuk persekitaran lebih selamat serta inklusif untuk semua individu.

Bagi mencipta masyarakat berkarisma dan berkualiti, penting untuk memberi perhatian kepada pendidikan, pembangunan kemahiran, kepemimpinan beretika, budaya kreativiti dan inovasi, keadilan dan kesetaraan serta penghargaan terhadap kepelbagaian budaya.

Dengan mengambil langkah ini, masyarakat dapat membentuk persekitaran membolehkan pertumbuhan individu secara menyeluruh dan pembangunan komuniti inklusif.





Makin ramai dera anak angkat

PUTRAJAYA – Sebanyak 74 kes penderaan dan pengabaian kanak-kanak yang dilakukan keluarga angkat serta keluarga peliharaan direkodkan di negara ini pada tahun lalu, meningkat empat kes berbanding 70 kes pada tahun sebelumnya.

Pengarah Jabatan Pembangunan Kanak-kanak Jabatan Kebajikan Masyarakat (JKM), Dr. Sopian Brahim berkata, sebanyak 211 kes penderaan dan pengabaian kanak-kanak angkat direkodkan sepanjang tempoh tiga tahun dari 2021 hingga 2023.

"Setiap tahun ada peningkatan kes, 2021 kami rekod sebanyak 67 kes, kemudian 2022 meningkat tiga kes lagi dan tahun lalu sekali lagi meningkat empat kes," katanya kepada Kosmo!.

Menurut Sopian, kecuaiannya ibu bapa angkat atau keluarga peliharaan sama ada secara sengaja atau tidak menjadi penyumbang kepada peningkatan kes keganasan terhadap kanak-kanak.

Antara kejadian yang jelas menunjukkan penjaga itu cuai apabila ada anak yang ditinggalkan di dalam kereta, terjatuh eskalator dan bangunan.

"Malah, ada yang hanya membiarkan kanak-kanak seawal 10 tahun keluar bersendirian ke pasar malam, taman permainan atau kedai runcit tanpa pengawasan orang dewasa," ujarnya.

Sopian memberitahu, berdasarkan statistik JKM, faktor lain kepada isu pengabaian dan penderaan anak jagaan itu adalah perbalahan yang timbul dalam kalangan keluarga angkat itu.

Katanya, terdapat ibu bapa yang mendera anak-anak angkat mereka disebabkan krisis rumah tangga dan mangsa dijadikan tempat pelepas marah.

"Selain itu, masalah kewangan yang melanda keluarga angkat atau keluarga peliharaan ini menyebabkan mereka bertindak ganas kepada anak angkat.

"Setiap tahun kos sara hidup naik, terutama di bandar, yang sebelum ini mampu, akhirnya terseksa dan yang jadi mangsa adalah anak angkat," ujarnya.

Sehubungan itu, JKM akan menjalankan sediaan berkala terhadap kes-kes di bawah jabatannya untuk memastikan kanak-kanak yang dijaga pihak ketiga ini berada dalam keadaan selamat.

"Sekiranya JKM menerima aduan berkaitan kes anak angkat atau anak peliharaan ini didera atau diabaikan, pihak pelindung, pembantu pelindung dan pihak polis akan siasat segera dan terus hadir ke lokasi kejadian atau hospital yang terlibat dalam tempoh 10 jam daripada aduan diterima.

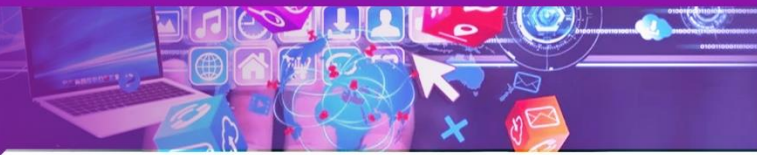
"Pihak terlibat akan kenal pasti kesahihan kes dan buat pemeriksaan ke atas kanak-kanak terbabit, dan jika memerlukan perlindungan, mereka akan diselamatkan di bawah Seksyen 18 Akta Kanak-Kanak 2001 dan diberikan penempatan sementara," jelasnya.

Tambahnya, kes kemudian akan dirujuk ke mahkamah untuk perintah jagaan sementara di bawah Seksyen 19 dalam tempoh 24 jam atau bawah Seksyen 25 dalam tempoh 24 jam selepas selesai pemeriksaan dan rawatan hospital.

Katanya, tindakan terhadap pendera pula akan dirujuk kepada polis untuk siasatan lanjut dan keputusan akan dibuat oleh Timbalan Pendakwa Raya.

Selasa lalu, Kosmo! melaporkan, permintaan untuk memelihara anak angkat di negara ini tinggi dan semakin popular dalam kalangan masyarakat terutama pasangan belum mendapat zuriat sehingga ada yang sanggup menunggu bertahun-tahun bagi tujuan itu.

Berdasarkan statistik JKM, lebih 600 pasangan mahu mengambil anak peliharaan dalam tempoh tiga tahun dari 2021 sehingga 2023, namun hanya 53 kanak-kanak yang dapat disediakan kepada mereka.

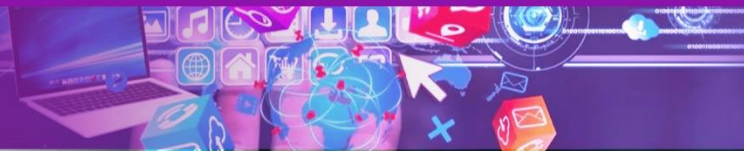
membuka pintu van ketika berhenti di kedai dalam perjalanan dari Taman Anggerik ke Taman Mayung, Telok Kemang.

MAN DETAINED IN CHILD NEGLECT CASE

SEREMBAN: Police apprehended a local man at a house in Bandar Sunggala, Port Dickson on Tuesday to facilitate investigations into the neglect of a three-year-old girl. Port Dickson district police chief Supt Aidi Sham Mohamed said they received a report from the Port Dickson Hospital on Sunday stating that the victim was in critical condition after falling from a vehicle. "Preliminary investigations revealed the incident took place at 8.30pm on March 15 when the suspect, purportedly the boyfriend of the victim's 38-year-old mother, attempted to open the vehicle door when he stopped in front of a shop. The child sustained bruises on several parts of her body and was pronounced dead at the Tuanku Ja'afar Hospital at 6.04pm on Tuesday," he said in a statement, adding that the suspect has three criminal records. He also said the suspect has been remanded for six days. – Bernama
