- o New York: Lebih ramai kanak-kanak berbanding sebelum ini tinggal di zon konflik atau telah dipindahkan secara paksa dari rumah mereka akibat pertempuran, kata Tabung Kanak-Kanak Pertubuhan Bangsa-Bangsa Bersatu (UNICEF), lapor agensi berita Jerman, dpa.
- o Kira-kira 473 juta kanak-kanak dianggarkan tinggal di kawasan konflik - lebih satu daripada enam kanak-kanak di seluruh dunia, kata agensi itu dalam satu laporan yang dikeluarkan pada Sabtu.
- o Peratusan kanak-kanak yang tinggal di kawasan konflik telah meningkat dua kali ganda - daripada sekitar 10 peratus pada 1990-an kepada hampir 19 peratus hari ini, kata UNICEF.
- o Mereka terbunuh dan cedera, terpaksa berhenti sekolah, kekurangan vaksinasi penting atau mengalami kekurangan zat makanan yang teruk.

**Topik:** 2024 'one of the worst years in history for children in conflict'

Kajian yang dikeluarkan pada hari Jumaat mendapati bahawa hak kanak-kanak dalam jumlah yang mencatat rekod telah dilanggar, termasuk dengan menjadi mangsa pembunuhan dan kecederaan, ketinggalan dalam pendidikan dan vaksin menyelamatkan nyawa, serta mengalami kekurangan zat makanan yang kritikal; jumlah ini dijangka terus meningkat.

Dari Palestin ke Myanmar, Haiti ke Sudan, dunia sedang mengalami jumlah konflik tertinggi sejak Perang Dunia Kedua. Hampir 19 peratus kanak-kanak di dunia – lebih 473 juta – kini tinggal di zon konflik, dan 47.2 juta telah dipindahkan akibat konflik dan keganasan.

Ribuan kanak-kanak telah dibunuh dan cedera di Gaza, manakala di Ukraine, PBB mengesahkan lebih banyak kanak-kanak menjadi mangsa sepanjang 9 bulan pertama tahun 2024 berbanding sepanjang tahun 2023.

Terdapat laporan meluas mengenai kes rogol dan keganasan seksual terhadap wanita dan kanak-kanak perempuan di kawasan konflik.

Di Haiti, setakat tahun ini, terdapat peningkatan 1,000 peratus dalam laporan insiden keganasan seksual terhadap kanak-kanak. Dalam situasi konflik bersenjata, kanak-kanak kurang upaya juga cenderung menjadi lebih terdedah kepada keganasan dan pelanggaran hak.

New York: Lebih ramai kanak-kanak berbanding sebelum ini tinggal di zon konflik atau telah dipindahkan secara paksa dari rumah mereka akibat pertempuran, kata Tabung Kanak-Kanak Pertubuhan Bangsa-Bangsa Bersatu (UNICEF), lapor agensi berita Jerman, dpa.

Kira-kira 473 juta kanak-kanak dianggarkan tinggal di kawasan konflik - lebih satu daripada enam kanak-kanak di seluruh dunia, kata agensi itu dalam satu laporan yang dikeluarkan pada Sabtu.

Peratusan kanak-kanak yang tinggal di kawasan konflik telah meningkat dua kali ganda - daripada sekitar 10 peratus pada 1990-an kepada hampir 19 peratus hari ini, kata UNICEF.

Mereka terbunuh dan cedera, terpaksa berhenti sekolah, kekurangan vaksinasi penting atau mengalami kekurangan zat makanan yang teruk.

"Tahun 2024 merupakan salah satu tahun paling teruk dalam rekod bagi kanak-kanak yang berkonflik dalam sejarah UNICEF, baik dari segi bilangan kanak-kanak yang terjejas dan tahap kesan ke atas kehidupan mereka," kata pengarah eksekutif UNICEF Catherine Russell dalam satu kenyataan.

"Seorang kanak-kanak yang membesar dalam zon konflik lebih berkemungkinan tidak bersekolah, kekurangan zat makanan, atau dipaksa keluar dari rumah.

"Ini tidak sepatutnya menjadi kebiasaan baharu. Kami tidak boleh membenarkan generasi kanak-kanak menjadi cagaran kepada peperangan dunia yang tidak terkawal."

Menurut UNICEF, 47.2 juta kanak-kanak kehilangan tempat tinggal akibat konflik dan keganasan menjelang akhir tahun 2023.

Trend untuk tahun 2024 menunjukkan peningkatan dalam perpindahan kerana pelbagai konflik telah meningkat, termasuk di Haiti, Lubnan, Myanmar, Palestin dan Sudan.

## 124 kids rescued from GISB remain under Welfare Dept care

**KLANG:** Of the 424 children rescued from Global Ikhwan Services and Business Holdings (GISB) care centres, only 124 remain under the care of the Welfare Department, while the rest have been reunited with their parents. Selangor Women's Development and Social Welfare Committee chairman Anfaal Saari said the children were returned to their families following investigations by the police and Welfare Department, and the submission of assessment reports from the Education and Health Departments.

She added that both able-bodied and disabled children under the age of six have also been sent back to their respective parents.

According to Anfaal, the 124 children still under the care of the Welfare Department are afflicted with various problems.

"Based on observation and examination, these children have educational and psychological issues," she said.

The children will remain in the department's interim care until next month, with a court hearing scheduled from Jan 21 to 24 to determine whether they will stay in the department's care or be returned to their parents.

For the children who have already been returned to their families, Anfaal gave an assurance that periodic monitoring will be conducted by the department to ensure their safety and

wellbeing.

Last month, Selangor Menteri Besar Datuk Seri Amirudin Shari revealed that some of the children rescued from GISB care centres were suffering from stunted growth, learning problems, depression, anxiety and speech problems.

The children were rescued from 20 GISB care homes, mostly in Selangor and some in Negri Sembilan, in September when the authorities raided the organisation linked to the defunct Al-Arqam movement.

Meanwhile, Childline Foundation executive director Datin PH Wong praised the Welfare Department for doing a good job in caring for the troubled children.

"The Health Ministry has arranged for psychiatrists, psychologists and counsellors to tend to the children, while those with severe issues are undergoing therapy.

"The Welfare Department has also arranged many things for the children, such as play activities, as some children simply need that to heal," she said.

Wong said she was informed that the Education Ministry has also been involved in supporting the children's educational needs.

As for those who were malnourished and undernourished, they are now being fed six times a day and have already gained weight and their health is improving, she noted.

"So, it is crucial for the courts to extend the time for the relevant



ministries and agencies to continue their care for these children," she said.

On those released to their families, Selangor executive councillor for Islamic affairs and innovation Dr Mohammad Fahmi Ngah said the families had met the required criteria to get their children back.

"A Children's Court had convened and all the requirements for release met the legal requirements," he said.

Mohammad Fahmi and Anfaal jointly chaired the special task force set up by the Selangor government to examine the required rehabilitation programmes for the children.

The children, he said, were returned to their parents and rightful guardians because their *akidah* (creed) has also been restored.

"Those were the key criteria," he added.

## Hujan berterusan tahap waspada dijangka landa 3 negeri

**Kuala Lumpur:** Jabatan Meteorologi Malaysia (MetMalaysia) mengeluarkan amaran, hujan berterusan tahap waspada dijangka melanda Kelantan, Terengganu dan Pahang bermula hari ini hingga 31 Disember.

Sepanjang tempoh sama, cuaca ekstrem membabitkan angin kencang dan laut bergelora yang dijangka membadai beberapa kawasan perairan negara.

Dalam kenyataannya, MetMalaysia menyatakan, hujan berterusan tahap waspada dijangka dialami sembilan jajahan di Kelantan, membabitkan Tumpat, Pasir Mas, Kota Bharu, Jeli, Tanah Merah, Bachok, Ma-

chang, Pasir Puteh dan Kuala Krai.

Selain itu, seluruh Terengganu dan daerah Kuantan, Pekan dan Rompin, Pahang juga berdepan situasi sama sepanjang tempoh terbabit.

Sementara itu di **Sabah**, Pedalaman (Tambunan), Pantai Barat, Tawau (Lahad Datu), Sandakan (Telupid, Kinabatangan, Beluran dan Sandakan) serta Kudat juga mengalami hujan sama sehingga esok.

MetMalaysia menyatakan, angin timur laut yang berkelajuan di antara 40 hingga 50 kilometer sejam (km/j) dijangka membadai kawasan perairan Johor

Timur, Pahang, Terengganu dan Kelantan, dengan ombak mencecah ketinggian 3.5 meter.

Ia memberi amaran, keadaan laut yang bergelora itu berpotensi membahayakan bot kecil, aktiviti rekreasi laut serta sukan air.

Selain itu, kenaikan paras air laut turut dijangka berlaku di pesisir pantai di kawasan yang terjejas, membawa risiko limpahan air laut dari Ahad hingga Isnin.

Angin kencang yang sama turut dijangka membadai perairan selatan Samui, Tioman, selatan Bunguran serta kawasan sekitar Reef North, Reef South, Layang-Layang, Labuan dan Palawan,

sehingga Selasa depan.

Ombak di kawasan itu boleh mencapai ketinggian sehingga 3.5 meter, menambah risiko terhadap keselamatan aktiviti laut.

Bagi perairan Condore dan barat laut Reef North, MetMalaysia mengeluarkan amaran kategori ketiga, di mana angin dijangka melebihi 60 km/j dengan ombak lebih 4.5 meter.

Keadaan itu berpotensi membahayakan semua aktiviti perkapalan dan pantai, termasuk pekerja di pelantar minyak.

MetMalaysia turut mengeluarkan amaran kategori kedua untuk perairan utara Bunguran serta timur laut dan barat daya

Reef North.

Angin berkelajuan 50 hingga 60 km/j dan ombak mencapai ketinggian 4.5 meter dijangka melanda kawasan tersebut, memberi ancaman kepada aktiviti perkapalan, menangkap ikan, serta perkhidmatan feri.

MetMalaysia mengingatkan orang ramai untuk sentiasa peka dengan perkembangan cuaca terkini dan mengambil langkah berjaga-jaga, terutama mereka yang terbabit dengan aktiviti luar serta perkapalan.

Keadaan itu dijangka berlarutan sehingga awal minggu depan dan pemantauan cuaca akan terus dilakukan.

## Seven measures ensuring a safe environment for children

LETTER The Alliance for a Safe Community is deeply concerned by the rising incidents of missing children and the harrowing issue of child sex abuse.

These alarming trends represent a grave threat to the safety and wellbeing of our children — the most vulnerable members of our society.

Every missing child is a tragedy that leaves families devastated and communities shaken.

Statistics show that many missing children are at risk of falling victim to exploitation, including human trafficking and sexual abuse.

The urgency to address this issue cannot be overstated.

Child sex abuse, whether committed by strangers or individuals known to the child, is a heinous crime with long-lasting psychological and physical effects.

As a society, we have a shared responsibility to protect our children and ensure they grow up in safe and nurturing environments.

Seven key measures to address these issues include:

### 1. Enhance Public Awareness

Parents, guardians, and caregivers must be educated about the risks that children face and equipped with knowledge to identify signs of grooming or abuse.

Community campaigns should emphasise the importance of vigilance in public spaces and online.

### 2. Strengthen Legislation and Enforcement

Laws protecting children must be robust and rigorously enforced.

Stiffer penalties should be imposed on perpetrators of child sex abuse and human trafficking.

Additionally, law enforcement agencies need enhanced tools and training to locate missing children swiftly and handle abuse cases with sensitivity.

### 3. Mandatory Reporting Mechanisms

All institutions, including schools, religious organisations, and recreational centres, must adopt mandatory reporting protocols for suspected child abuse. Hotlines and digital platforms for anonymous reporting should be widely promoted.

### 4. Digital Safety and Online Monitoring

With many predators operating online, it is essential to strengthen cybersecurity measures to detect and shut down illicit activities.

Parents must also be educated on how to monitor their children's online activities effectively.

### 5. Comprehensive Sex Education

Schools should implement age-appropriate sex education programmes that teach children about personal boundaries, recognising inappropriate behaviour, and reporting abuse without fear.

### 6. Dedicated Task Forces and Resources

Governments should establish specialised units to handle missing children cases and combat child sex abuse.

Adequate funding must be allocated for shelter homes, counselling services, and rehabilitation programmes for victims.

### 7. Foster Community Participation

Neighbourhood watch programmes, community patrols, and volunteer initiatives can act as a first line of defence in safeguarding children. We must encourage a collective commitment to child safety at all levels of society.

In conclusion, every child deserves to live free from fear, harm, and exploitation.

**KUALA TERENGGANU:** Kerajaan negeri telah meminta laporan lengkap daripada Jabatan Kesihatan Negeri Terengganu (JKNT) berhubung dakwaan kes kecuai terhadap seorang bayi perempuan berusia dua hari, November lalu.

Pengerusi Jawatankuasa Kerajaan Tempatan Perumahan dan Kesihatan Negeri, Datuk Wan Sukairi Wan Abdullah berkata, buat masa ini pihaknya masih menunggu laporan tersebut.

“Kita perlu meneliti laporan dengan lebih terperinci sebelum mengambil apa-apa tindakan susulan. JKNT sudah dimaklumkan mengenai perkara ini dan kita tunggu sahaja laporan yang bakal diberi nanti,” katanya hari ini,

Khamis lalu, seorang bapa melahirkan rasa terkilan dan kecewa apabila bayinya yang berusia dua hari didakwa terjatuh dari katil hospital pada 17 November lepas.

Akibat kejadian itu, bayi sulungnya itu kerap mengalami sawan dan dimasukkan ke hospital beberapa kali untuk menerima rawatan.

Susulan itu, Muhammad Syarifuddin Manan, 24, tampil membuat laporan di Ibu pejabat Polis Daerah (IPD) Kuala Terengganu di sini agar tindakan lanjut dapat diambil terhadap pihak pengurusan hospital yang didakwanya cuai dalam insiden tersebut. – **UTUSAN**
