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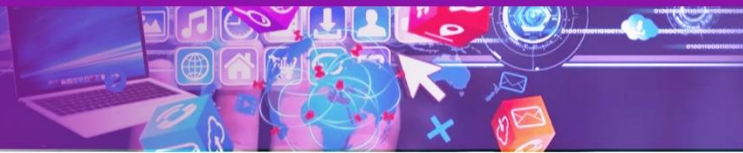

KUCHING: Buat julung kalinya, pelajar lelaki sekolah menengah di bandar raya ini dibawa untuk menyertai program kesedaran mengenai haid.

Menteri Pembangunan Wanita, Keluarga dan Masyarakat, Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri, ia antara langkah bagi menamatkan stigma yang sekian lama menyelubungi masyarakat berhubung haid.

Beliau berkata, sebelum ini program kesedaran mengenai haid hanya membabitkan pelajar perempuan namun bagi mengikis stigma itu, pelajar lelaki perlu dididik agar mereka memahami mengenai haid dan kesihatan reproduktif.

"Ini pertama kali kita anjurkan bersama program kesedaran haid dengan pelajar lelaki dan kita berharap akan teruskannya dalam program lain seluruh negara.

"Penyertaan pelajar lelaki penting dalam usaha kita mengikis stigma mengenai haid supaya mereka memahami kenapa rakan perempuan sekelas mereka sakit perut atau tidak datang sekolah ketika mengalami haid," katanya.

Beliau berkata demikian kepada media selepas Majlis pelancaran Program Kasih Remaja Kotex #SheCan Project di Hikmah Exchange, di sini, hari ini.

Seramai 1,000 pelajar dari beberapa sekolah sekitar bandar raya ini dengan 300 daripadanya pelajar lelaki menyertai program anjuran Kementerian Pembangunan Wanita, Keluarga dan Masyarakat (KPWKM), Kementerian Pendidikan dan Kimberly-Clark itu.

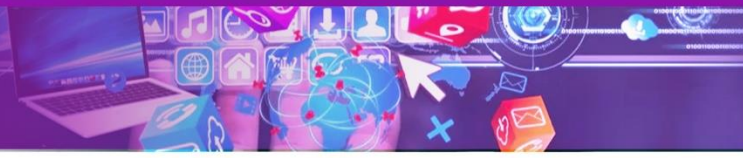
Menerusi program itu, katanya, seramai 600,000 pelajar wanita sekolah di seluruh negara diperkasa dengan akses kepada alat kebersihan haid yang sesuai dan juga didedahkan dengan pendidikan tentang kesihatan reproduktif.

"Ini bukan hanya soal sanitasi, tetapi berkaitan maruah, keyakinan, dan potensi penuh mereka dan kami juga mengambil inisiatif untuk memperkasakan pelajar lelaki dengan pengetahuan dan kesedaran tentang isu haid .

"Ini adalah langkah penting dalam membentuk generasi yang lebih berempati dan memahami," katanya.

Nancy berkata, berdasarkan Laporan Kajian Status Pengurusan Haid yang dikeluarkan oleh Lembaga Penduduk dan Pembangunan Keluarga Negara (LPPKN) tahun lalu, sebanyak 9.9 peratus daripada 130,000 pelajar perempuan mempunyai masalah untuk mendapatkan produk pengurusan haid.

Justeru katanya, peruntukan sebanyak RM5.3 juta disediakan KPWKM bagi menjayakan program untuk membantu pelajar yang menghadapi masalah itu.



'Back To School' programme in Santubong enriches educational path for 271 Lundu students

LUNDU: The 'Back To School P193 Santubong' programme has brought an educational boost to the Lundu district, as 271 students from 16 schools in the Tanjong Datu area received contributions including bags, shoes, and school supplies.

A report by the Sarawak Public Communications Unit revealed that the programme was a collaborative effort involving various NGOs like the Malay Vehicle Importers and Traders Association of Malaysia (Pekema) and the National Welfare Foundation (Yayasan Kebajikan Negara).

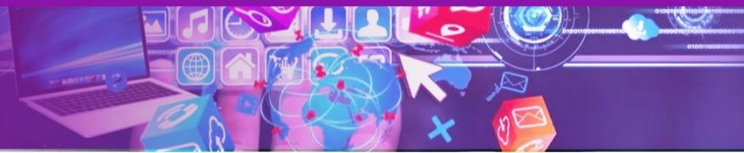
Women, Family, and Community Development Minister Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri officiated the distribution ceremony at the auditorium of the Sarawak Land Consolidation and Rehabilitation Authority (SALCRA) Training Centre in Bajo.

During the event, she emphasised the crucial role of education in nurturing knowledgeable future generations and developing families.

Considering that the programme represented a significant investment in the region's educational development, Nancy expressed gratitude to these organisations for their substantial contributions.

"We understand that not everyone can afford to buy school supplies. Through this programme, we hope to relieve some of the burden on parents, especially in providing school necessities for their children," Nancy later said in a Facebook post.

Further strengthening community support at a Community and Village Heads (KMKK) session, Nancy announced federal government aid ranging from RM50,000 to RM100,000 for each registered village.



Counselling for perpetrators and victims of child abuse vital

LETTERS: From 2020 to 2022, the Social Welfare Department (JKM) documented 18,750 cases of child abuse, including physical, sexual and emotional abuse, as well as neglect, abandonment and parental absence.

Selangor had the highest incidence of child abuse at 4,256 cases, said Rantau Panjang member of parliament Siti Zailah Mohd Yusoff in 2022.

She was deputy women, family and community development minister at the time.

Tackling child abuse requires careful attention and immediate action from the government, civil society and the people. Seven measures are recommended to address the issue.

First, allocate the nation's wealth equitably among the people. Child abuse can be minimised when there is no financial crisis.

Second, launch national campaigns to raise public awareness of warning signs and consequences of such abuse.

Third, increase the resources available to child welfare organisations. Educate law enforcement, social workers and medical professionals on how to identify and respond to child abuse.

Fourth, educate parents with the skills and knowledge to raise their children in a safe environment.

Offer crisis intervention services and additional resources to underprivileged families.

Fifth, include instruction on child safety in school curricula. Educators and other school personnel should receive training on how to spot abuse symptoms and create a safe space where kids can talk about their worries.

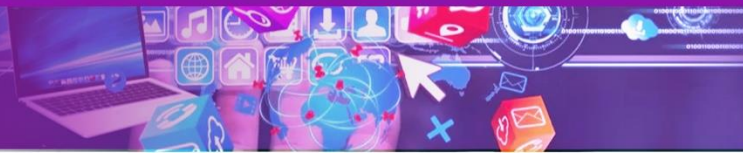
Sixth, encourage community involvement and networks of family support.

Seventh, provide easy access to mental health support services and counselling for perpetrators and victims of child abuse.

Through raising awareness, encouraging education and engaging the community, we enable people to break the cycle of abuse, support victims and advocate for laws that put the welfare of the youngest and most vulnerable members first.

KLANG: Polis menahan enam lagi wanita bagi membantu siasatan berhubung kes seorang lelaki tempatan mempromosi video seks melibatkan lebih 20 wanita, melalui media sosial.

Pengarah Jabatan Siasatan Jenayah Bukit Aman Datuk Seri Mohd Shuhaily Mohd Zain berkata kesemua suspek berusia 21 hingga 36 tahun itu, diberkas pada minggu lepas menerusi fasa kedua Op Daddy.

"Siasatan mendapati kesemua wanita itu melakukan hubungan seks secara sukarela, tiada paksaan dan ada yang bermotifkan keuntungan. Kesemua mereka telah direman bagi membantu siasatan, bagi mengesan individu lain yang terlibat dalam penghasilan video seks," katanya pada sidang akhbar selepas program Dialog Awam bersamanya di sini, hari ini.

Mohd Shuhaily turut mengingatkan orang awam bahawa, tindakan undang-undang boleh diambil kepada mana-mana individu yang menyimpan bahan-bahan pornografi di dalam gajet termasuk telefon bimbit, mengikut Seksyen 292 Kanun Keseksaan.

Pada Jumaat lepas, Bernama melaporkan seorang lelaki dan dua rakan wanitanya mengaku tidak bersalah di Mahkamah Sesyen Kuala Lumpur, atas pertuduhan membuat pengiklanan khidmat persundalan menggunakan aplikasi X.

Sementara itu, mengulas mengenai Op Pintas Mega di seluruh negara, beliau berkata hasil 42 serbuan dengan kerjasama oleh 14 kontinjen polis bersama Jabatan Imigresen, Jabatan Tenaga Kerja, Jabatan Alam Sekitar, Tenaga Nasional Berhad dan Air Selangor, seramai 285 warga asing telah ditahan.

"Seramai 64 mangsa telah diselamatkan dengan empat daripadanya Orang Kurang Upaya di bawah Seksyen 44 Akta Anti Pamerdagangan Orang dan Anti Penyeludupan Migran 2007 (ATIPSOM 2007).

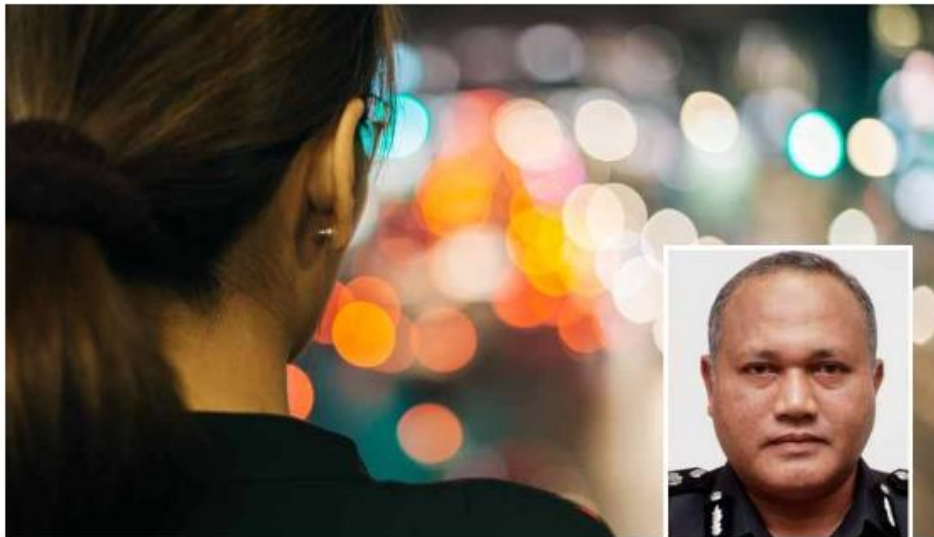
"Ini melibatkan secara pecahannya 22 wanita, lelaki (12), kanak-kanak perempuan (20) dan 10 kanak-kanak lelaki yang terdiri daripada pelbagai warga termasuk Filipina, Indonesia, Bangladesh, Kemboja dan Myanmar," katanya.

Mohd Shuhaily berkata siasatan dijalankan di bawah Seksyen 12 dan 14 Akta ATIPSOM 2007 selain Seksyen 55B, Seksyen 15 (1) (C) dan Seksyen 6 (1) (C) Akta Imigresen 1959/1963.

IPOH - Seorang pembantu kedai runcit ditahan polis selepas disyaki mencabul pelancong wanita warga Sepanyol di Lorong Seni @ Lorong Panglima Ipoh di sini pada Khamis.

Tangkapan dilakukan selepas pihak polis menerima laporan daripada mangsa berusia 22 tahun itu pada jam 9.25 malam pada Rabu.

Ketua Polis Daerah Ipoh, Asisten Komisioner Yahaya Hassan berkata, kejadian sekitar jam 7 malam itu berlaku ketika mangsa bersama rakannya diekori suspek berusia 21 tahun dari sebuah hotel ke lokasi kejadian.

“Berdasarkan keterangan, suspek mula mengekori mangsa dan setibanya di lokasi, suspek telah meminta untuk bergambar bersama mangsa.

“Suspek kemudian bertindak memeluk erat bahu wanita itu dan terus mencabul. Mangsa yang terkejut menolak dan menjerit menyebabkan lelaki itu terus melarikan diri,” katanya pada Isnin.

Menurut beliau, rakan mangsa bagaimanapun berjaya merakam gambar suspek.

“Kejadian itu disifatkan mangsa sebagai pantas dan tiada saksi lain kerana keadaan persekitaran yang gelap selain hujan renyai.

“Suspek ditahan reman untuk siasatan dilakukan mengikut Seksyen 354 Kanun Keseksaan. Suspek akan didakwa di mahkamah esok,” katanya.

MELAKA, Jan 29 — An elderly woman was punched during an argument with her neighbour's grandson as he took offence when she reprimanded him for open burning of garbage at the glamping homestay in Tanjung Kling here yesterday.

Melaka police chief ACP Christopher Patit said during the 1.20 am incident yesterday, the victim, who is a 76-year-old woman, went to confront the elderly owner of the homestay to knock some sense into his 26-year-old grandson for burning rubbish.

He said police were alerted of the incident after a 29-second video went viral on social media today.

“The victim reprimanded the suspect since the open burning of garbage on his land caused her to choke in the acrid smoke that drifted over.

“A verbal argument then ensued between the victim and the suspect before the young man rushed to the victim and punched her in the face several times,” Christopher said in a statement here today.

He said when the victim tried to flee, the suspect hit her on the back of the head causing her to fall.

Christopher said the suspect also threatened to hit her with a stick before the woman scurried back into her house and as a result of the assault trauma, the victim apparently suffered soft tissue injuries and pain in the back of her head, body, face and neck.

He said following the viral video, police arrested the suspect just after midnight yesterday (12.10 am) to assist investigations under Section 506 and Section 323 of the Penal Code for criminal intimidation and causing hurt.

He said the public is also advised to not stoke the incident with speculation that could cause unnecessary predicament to the community. — Bernama



Sarjan wanita didakwa terima suapan RM3,000 bagi tutup kes cabul

KUALA LUMPUR: Seorang polis wanita berpangkat Sarjan mengaku tidak bersalah di Mahkamah Sesyen hari ini atas tuduhan menerima suapan RM3,000 daripada seorang lelaki sebagai dorongan tidak mengambil tindakan terhadap anaknya bagi kesalahan cabul, dua tahun lalu.

Tertuduh, Nur Mastisha Maidinsha, 39, membuat pengakuan itu selepas pertuduhan terhadapnya dibacakan di hadapan Hakim Azura Alwi.

Dia didakwa sebagai penolong pegawai penyiasat di Bahagian Siasatan Seksual Wanita & Kanak-Kanak, Jabatan Siasatan Jenayah Kuala Lumpur, telah secara rasuah bersetuju menerima wang berkenaan daripada pengadu.

Perbuatan itu didakwa dilakukan di Ibu Pejabat Polis Kontinjen (IPK) Kuala Lumpur pada jam 8 malam, 1 Oktober 2022.

Pertuduhan dijalankan mengikut Seksyen 17(a) Akta Suruhanjaya Pencegahan Rasuah Malaysia (SPRM) 2009 dan boleh dihukum di bawah Seksyen 24 akta sama.

Jika sabit kesalahan boleh dipenjarakan tidak lebih 20 tahun dan denda tidak kurang lima kali ganda nilai suapan atau RM10,000, mengikut mana-mana yang lebih tinggi.

Terdahulu, Timbalan Pendakwa Raya, Nurul Atiqah Mohamad Alias mencadangkan jaminan RM2,000 berserta syarat tambahan pasport tertuduh diserahkan kepada mahkamah dan melaporkan diri sebulan sekali di pejabat SPRM berhampiran.

Nur Mastisha yang tidak diwakili peguam merayu jaminan rendah dengan alasan dia telah digantung kerja, selain mempunyai tanggungan dua anak.

Mahkamah membenarkan tertuduh diikat jamin RM2,000 dengan seorang penjamin berserta syarat tambahan melaporkan diri sebulan sekali di pejabat SPRM berdekatan.

Mahkamah menetapkan 7 Mac ini sebagai tarikh sebutan semula kes dan lantikan peguam. – BERNAMA

Ketua Polis Perak, Datuk Seri Mohd Yusri Hassan Basri, berkata suspek berusia 42 tahun dan bertugas di daerah Perak Tengah itu sedang direman selama empat hari sehingga 31 Januari ini untuk membantu siasatan mengikut Seksyen 376 Kanun Keseksaan.

Beliau turut memberi jaminan bahawa siasatan terhadap pegawai polis terbabit akan dijalankan secara telus dan menyeluruh.

"Kita akan jalankan siasatan dengan telus dan terbaik untuk pastikan keadilan pihak mangsa, waima suspek ialah warga kerja kita sekali pun.

"Selain itu, Jabatan Integriti dan Pematuhan Standard (JIPS) juga akan mengambil tindakan dalaman terhadap pegawai terbabit," katanya kepada pemberita pada Program Kesedaran Kesihatan, Pemakanan dan Gaya Hidup Aktif (HEAL) di pekarangan Ibu Pejabat Polis Kontinjen (IPK) Perak, di sini, hari ini.

Terdahulu, akhbar ini melaporkan seorang pelajar perempuan berusia 16 tahun mendakwa dirogol oleh sarjan polis sebanyak dua kali di dalam kereta, masing-masing di hadapan balai polis dan di kawasan parkir pasaraya dalam daerah Perak Tengah, pada Julai dan Oktober tahun lalu.

Perbuatan terkutuk suspek yang juga Timbalan Ketua Balai itu terbongkar selepas mangsa bertindak memberitahu ibunya, baru-baru ini.

Mohd Yusri berkata, mangsa bersama ahli keluarganya sudah dipanggil ke Ibu Pejabat Polis Daerah (IPD) Perak Tengah untuk dirakam keterangan mengikut Seksyen 112 kanun Prosedur Jenayah (KPJ).

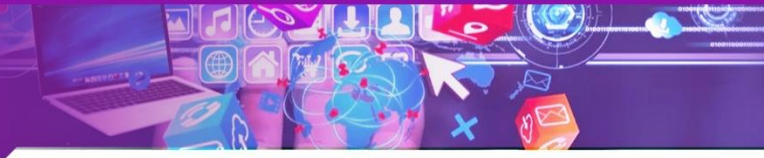
Mengulas mengenai program HEAL, beliau berkata, program terbabit dianjurkan lantaran peningkatan rekod kematian dalam kalangan warga PDRM Perak disebabkan komplikasi penyakit pada tahun lalu dan 2022.

"Pada 2022, seramai 17 orang warga PDRM Perak membabitkan seorang pegawai kanan, 13 orang pegawai rendah polis dan tiga orang pegawai awam meninggal dunia.

"Pada tahun lalu berlaku peningkatan iaitu sebanyak 26 kematian dicatatkan, melibatkan dua pegawai kanan, 19 pegawai rendah polis dan lima pegawai awam.

"Kebanyakannya membabitkan penyakit jantung, misalnya tiga kematian pada 2022 dan angka itu meningkat kepada 10 kematian pada tahun lalu. Ini diikuti masalah buah pinggang, barah kanser dan juga masalah paru-paru," katanya.

Mohd Yusri berkata, penganjuran program berkenaan diharapkan dalam memupuk kesedaran dalam warga PDRM berhubung kepentingan penjagaan kesihatan agar pasukan itu mampu memberi perkhidmatan terbaik kepada usaha memelihara keselamatan dan ketenteraman masyarakat serta negara.



‘Many grey areas’: Malaysian lawyers weigh on Bar Council’s strict sexual harassment circular on legal professionals

KUALA LUMPUR, Jan 29 — Winking, path-blocking, wolf-whistling and certain gestures can now constitute sexual harassment in the legal profession.

This was made clear by the Bar Council in its recent circular to safeguard legal fraternity.

Among the listed offences are offering promotions for a date or a hug, making unwanted advances and engaging in sexual coercion.

The circular also listed certain acts such as inappropriate verbal, visual and physical conduct as sexual harassment offences.

“Wolf-whistling, blocking your path, patting your head or sitting at your desk for no reason are all inappropriate,” reads the circular.

While the circular aims at curbing sexual harassment among legal professionals, it may raise some questions in terms of enforcement and whether such rules can be misused by a complainant.

To better understand the potential grey areas in the circular, *Malay Mail* asked legal professionals about the practicality of such strict rules.

It’s a good move, but...

Lawyer Dinesh Muthal welcomed the council’s move to address the issues of sexual harassment that have been happening for ages.

“It’s good for it to be taken more seriously. Timely as well.”

He, however, said there must be a proper investigation methodology.

“We need proper parties or entities to investigate the complaint.

“The Bar Council needs to treat it akin to an act of proving a criminal offence and not merely take action just because there is a complaint.

“There must be a proper task force and detailed investigation.”

Echoing similar sentiment, another lawyer, David Mathew said the circular certainly is intended to create awareness that even actions that ordinarily seem so innocuous could amount to sexual harassment.

He, however, said it all comes down to context.

“We do have to be careful not to ignore context.

“To my mind, an appropriate collegial wink when the judge rules in your favour or an appropriate hand signal when your opponent talks nonsense in court certainly must keep its place within the profession. It is all about context.”

Can the rules be misused?

According to Dinesh, such strict rules may be misused should there be no proper investigation methodology.

“Imagine a scenario of three employees who don’t like their employer for giving them too much work and scolded like rain and thunder.

“Yes, that is a form of mental harassment or act that affects the mental health of the staff. But what happens if such complaints are fabricated against the person?

“There must be a failsafe to fall onto.”

Dinesh said there may also be incidents where the complainant misunderstood or misinterpreted the actions.

“There must be a clear and precise understanding of what falls under the definition of sexual harassment to avoid false claims.”

Mathew also said proving such claims will never be an easy task.

“It will ultimately boil down to credibility having taken the context into account.

“We must be extremely wary of misuse or abuse. I want to think that a false report will be found out eventually.”

Are there any loopholes?

According to Mathew, the circular must be read in the context of Rule 14.29 of the Bar Council rulings which defines sexual harassment as “any unwanted conduct of a sexual nature, whether verbal, non-verbal, visual, gestural or physical, made directly or indirectly at a person or physically communicated in person or through the use of any medium or physical conduct, which a reasonable person would consider to be offensive or humiliating or a threat to their well-being or comfort.”

“The keywords or phrases here are ‘unwanted’ and ‘a reasonable person’.

“The action must not only be something ‘unwanted’ but a ‘reasonable person’ or disinterested member of the public must also consider it to be offensive.”

Two years ago, the Bar Council approved a clause in its rules which states sexual harassment constituted misconduct under Section 94(2) of the Legal Profession Act.

It states that any act of sexual harassment by an advocate and solicitor or a pupil in a professional capacity or a professional setting amounts to misconduct.

Dinesh said it was very timely and needed.

“But, it is still new and there aren’t enough precedents and case studies to show its strength or weakness.”

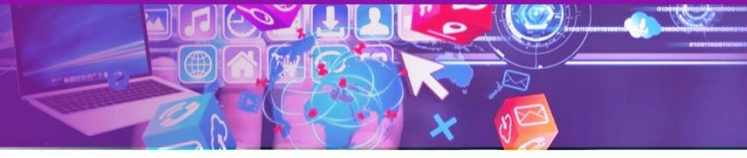

REMANDED UNTIL THURSDAY

Cop held on suspicion of raping student

IPOH: A 42-year-old police sergeant has been arrested for allegedly raping a 16-year-old student between July and October last year.

Perak police chief Datuk Seri Mohd Yusri Hassan Basri said the man was arrested at the Perak Tengah district police headquarters on Sunday.

On Jan 24, a source said a crime was allegedly committed in front of a police station and the parking lot of a supermarket in the Perak Tengah district between July and October last year.

The case came to light after the victim told her mother about what happened.

The source also said that the victim, who was accompanied by a family member, had her statement recorded at the Perak Tengah district police headquarters.

"We arrested the suspect on Sunday and the man has been

remanded for four days until this Thursday," Yusri said.

"We will carry out the investigation transparently to ensure justice for the victim. It doesn't matter who the suspect is, even if they come from our force."

He said police had taken statements from the victim and several witnesses to complete the investigation papers.

Yusri said this at a press conference after attending the Healthy Eating Active Living programme organised by the Perak Lions Club at the Perak police contingent headquarters, here, yesterday.

During the programme, he revealed that 1,062 police personnel in Perak were admitted to hospital wards last year, compared with 724 in 2022.

In a separate case, four policemen attached to the Brickfields district police headquarters in

Kuala Lumpur were detained for consuming ketum at a house in Taman Tan Yew Lai.

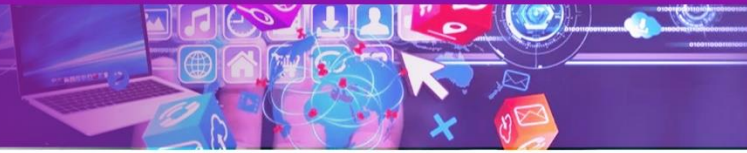
A team of officers from Bukit Aman's Integrity and Standards Compliance Department raided the house at Jalan 9B, Off Batu 6 Jalan Puchong at 2.15am last Thursday.

Checks showed that three of the four policemen were attached to the Petaling police station, while the fourth was attached to the serious crimes investigation unit, D9 Brickfields.

All four suspects, aged between 25 to 50, are being investigated under Section 30 (3) of the Poisons Act 1952.

Kuala Lumpur police chief Datuk Allaudeen Abdul Majid confirmed the arrests.

It is learnt that the suspects may face disciplinary action from the department or suspension if found guilty of the offence.

"Worse, little Juwanda also has chronic lung disease," said Hope Place in a press release yesterday.

The welfare-focused non-

governmental organisation (NGO) also said the boy's father, Riyawandi, 43, works as a daily-wage construction worker, earning about RM55 a day.

Aida, 39, who takes care of Juwanda at home, has been resourceful by working part-time cleaning bird's nests at home.

It is learnt that Juwanda's eldest brother, aged 21, sells

chicken at the market, earning RM40 daily. All combined, the household income barely reaches RM1,000 a month.

"With financial burdens like rent, utilities bills and medical bills, the family struggles to survive.

"However, for Aida and her husband, money is not the utmost worry since their

youngest boy's life and future are at stake.

"Not knowing what the future may hold, the family is hoping for the best.

"Juwanda's 13-year-old sister is also not schooling," said Hope Place, adding that it would do its best to make arrangements for Juwanda's sister to go back to school.

Currently, Hope Place is supporting Juwanda with supplies of diapers and milk powder.

Minister: Important for schoolboys to gain better understanding about menstruation

Menstrual awareness' goal out to empower 600,000 schoolgirls nationwide — Nancy

KUCHING: For the first time, an awareness programme about menstruation has involved schoolboys.

The 'Program Kasih Remaja Kotex #SheCan Project', which took place at Hikmah Exchange here yesterday, involved a total of 1,000 students, of whom 300 were boys.

Federal Women, Family and Community Development Minister Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri, who officiated at the event, said the programme's primary objective was to dispel the long-standing stigma surrounding menstruation in society.

She had observed that in similar events held previously, they only involved female students.

"This is the first time we've organised this event involving male students.

"Out of a total 1,000 school students participating in this event today, 300 of them are boys.

"We're doing this because we

want to give the boys awareness of menstruation, so that they understand that menstruation is normal, and also for them to better understand the symptoms that their female classmates may

experience during a menstrual cycle," she told reporters later.

Nancy said the stigma surrounding menstruation must be broken.

"This is why awareness must

be put forth to society, including the men. Such a stigma is still going strong, especially in the rural areas."

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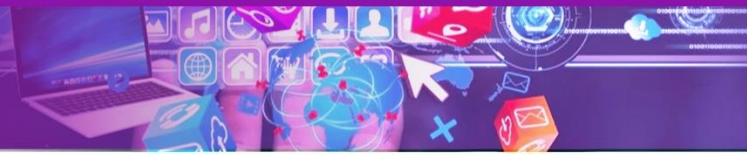
"This has led to girls not going to school because they are ashamed of having their periods," she added.

In her speech for the programme, Nancy said the goal was to empower 600,000 female school students nationwide by providing them with access to appropriate menstrual hygiene products and also educating them about reproductive health.

This initiative, she added, would go beyond sanitation, as it would also address 'dignity, confidence and the full potential of female students'.

"At the same time, the male students are also empowered with the knowledge and awareness of menstruation," she remarked.

Citing the Menstrual Management Status Study Report issued by the National Population and Family Development Board (LPPKN) last year, the federal minister said 9.9 per cent out of 130,000 female students nationwide faced difficulties in obtaining menstrual management products. As such, Nancy said to address this issue, an allocation of RM5.3 million had been allocated by her ministry to ensure the success of the programme and also to support students facing challenges related to menstrual hygiene.

More arrested in probe into paid sex videos on Telegram

KLANG: Six women have been arrested as part of the police's probe into the case of sex videos peddled for profit.

Bukit Aman CID director Comm Datuk Seri Mohd Shuhaily Mohd Zain said that the arrests were part of their second phase of investigations.

The women, aged 21 to 36, were arrested last week.

"Investigations showed that the six had engaged in sexual activities willingly, with no coercion. There were also those who did it for profit.

"All have been remanded to assist investigations," he told reporters after a townhall meeting at the Hokkien Association building here yesterday.

Previously, Comm Mohd

Shuhaily said the pornographic videos were sold via three channels on Telegram since last July.

It was found that 2,051 subscribers paid RM100 per month for a 200-video package, while 622 subscribed to a 13-video package for RM20 per month.

The police also found that subscribers comprised both men and women, some of whom were pro-

fessionals such as doctors and entrepreneurs.

A father of three, infamously known as "Hot Daddy", and his two girlfriends were charged with offering sexual services on X.

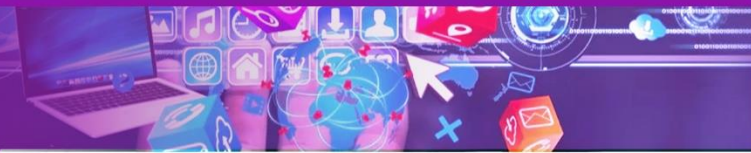

Policeman remanded over rape complaint

Initiative to address menstruation stigma
