## 142 mangsa kebakaran Putra Heights dapatkan khidmat kaunseling

**KUALA LUMPUR:** Sebanyak 142 mangsa kebakaran saluran gas di Putra Heights, Subang Jaya telah mendapatkan khidmat kaunseling di Pusat Sokongan Sosial Setempat (PSSS) sejak ia mula beroperasi di pusat pemindahan sementara (PPS) Masjid Putra Heights, Selasa lepas.

Penyelaras PSSS Noor Amira Mohamed Yatim berkata inisiatif yang digerakkan oleh Yayasan Kebajikan Negara di bawah Kementerian Pembangunan Wanita, Keluarga dan Masyarakat itu bukan sahaja menawarkan perkhidmatan kaunseling, malah turut memberi sokongan emosi kepada mangsa yang mengalami trauma akibat insiden itu.

“Kebanyakan mangsa yang berjumpa kami meluahkan kebimbangan mengenai keadaan rumah mereka dan persekolahan anak-anak sehingga menimbulkan tekanan emosi seperti kemurungan dan keresahan.

“Menerusi sesi bersama kaunselor, mereka dibimbing untuk menyelesaikan masalah dihadapi,” katanya kepada Bernama semalam.

Beliau berkata selain memberikan sokongan emosi bagi mengurangkan trauma, PSSS juga membantu menyelar-

askan bantuan yang disumbangkan oleh pelbagai pihak.

Noor Amira berkata sebanyak 16 kaunselor bertugas secara bergilir di PSSS yang beroperasi 24 jam.

Sehubungan itu, beliau menggalakkan lebih ramai mangsa yang memerlukan sokongan emosi termasuk

yang tidak berunding di PPS untuk hadir mendapatkan perkhidmatan disediakan.

Kebakaran melibatkan saluran gas Petronas di Jalan Putra Harmoni, Putra Heights pada 8.10 pagi Selasa lepas, secara keseluruhannya melibatkan 1,254 mangsa daripada 308 keluarga.

Sebanyak 87 rumah men-

galami kerosakan total dan tidak boleh didiami manakala 148 rumah terjejas serta mengalami kerosakan tetapi boleh didiami setelah melalui proses pembaikan.

Setakat 12 tengah hari, 379 mangsa daripada 97 keluarga masih berunding di PPS Masjid Putra Heights. — Bernama

## 99 Speedmart Continues Tradition Of Brightening Ramadan, Syawal For Underprivileged Muslims

KUALA LUMPUR, April 4 (Bernama) -- The 99 Speed Mart Sdn Bhd, one of Malaysia's leading mini-market chains, once again reached out to underprivileged Muslims by distributing 10,000 Aidilfitri food baskets worth RM500,000.

In a statement, 99 Speed Mart said the food baskets were handed over to the Department of Social Welfare (JKM) in collaboration with the Ministry of Women, Family, and Community Development (KPWK).

A symbolic handover ceremony of the food baskets was held on March 24 at Dewan Perdana Nur, Putrajaya, by Women, Family, and Community Development Minister Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri.

Also in attendance was the deputy minister, Datuk Seri Dr Noraini Ahmad.

Meanwhile, 99 Speedmart Chief Operating Officer Yong Eng Kwang said that the Aidilfitri food basket distribution programme has become its signature initiative to ease the burden of targeted communities.

"This is our way of expressing gratitude to our customers for choosing 99 Speedmart as their preferred store for household necessities. We are committed to continuing this annual initiative as part of our corporate social responsibility to the people of Malaysia," he said in the same statement.

He said the Aidilfitri food basket contained essential household items, particularly for Aidilfitri preparations, such as biscuits, rice vermicelli, beverages, wheat flour, dates, and "ketupat".

According to Yong, similar food baskets were also distributed during Chinese New Year, Deepavali, and Christmas celebrations.

"This marks the 9th time the mini-market chain, which operates 2,833 outlets nationwide, has organised this initiative, staying true to its slogan 'Near n' Save' (Dekat Lagi Murah)," he said, hoping that the food basket programme brings joy to the 1st Syawal celebration while fostering closer community ties.

## Rising threat of forced criminality

ONE of the fastest-growing forms of human trafficking in Southeast Asia, and particularly in Malaysia over the past three years, is trafficking for forced criminality.

This involves the coercion and deception of individuals into large-scale financial fraud operations, often linked to cybercrimes such as online scams, extortion and money laundering.

Trafficking for forced criminality refers to the exploitation of individuals through coercion, force or deception to compel them into criminal activities for the financial gain or benefit of traffickers.

Victims are often forced to become online scammers, drug couriers, money mules or are coerced into acts of terrorism or activities that facilitate terrorism, among other crimes.

Reports indicate that these criminal operations occur in legal and illegal establishments, including casinos, hotels, entertainment centres and businesses registered as legitimate entities.

Many of these sites are secured within enclosed or fenced-off areas where victims are confined and forced to engage in cybercrimes, such as international financial fraud.

Currently, Section 2 of the Anti-Trafficking in Persons and Anti-Smuggling of Migrants Act 2007 (Atipsom) does not explicitly recognise forced criminality as a specific form of exploitation. However, it does mention “any illegal activity”, which can be interpreted to cover such acts.

Nonetheless, clearer provisions and amendments are urgently needed, especially in light of the increasingly complex and technologically advanced nature of these crimes, which often involve tools like artificial intelligence (AI) within organised criminal networks.

According to Datuk Fadil Marsus, deputy director (Intelligence and Operations) of the Criminal Investigation Department at Bukit Aman, the police recently rescued 504 Malaysian nationals from Thailand, Myanmar, Cambodia and other countries who were at risk of becoming victims of forced criminality.

However, only around 10% were confirmed as genuine trafficking victims. The majority had voluntarily joined scam syndicates and only sought rescue after facing threats or abuse for failing to meet the syndicate’s profit targets.

Some of these individuals also acted as agents, recruiting other Malaysians into similar scams abroad, and many have reportedly been uncooperative with authorities upon their return.

These syndicates exploit people’s vulnerabilities, targeting those easily enticed by promises of high-paying overseas jobs. They typically seek individuals fluent in languages such as English and Chinese to carry out cyber fraud.

Victims are forced to engage in a range of online crimes, including romance scams (also known as “pig butchering”), crypto fraud, money laundering and illegal gambling.

While some willingly enter these syndicates, they often find themselves trapped in exploitative cycles, unable to leave unless ransom payments are made by their families.

Survivors who have managed to escape have reported enduring severe torture at the hands of these syndicates.

Two common patterns emerge from these cases. First, individuals who were initially deceived and exploited later become agents or recruiters themselves. After witnessing the lucrative returns from scam operations, some choose to remain and actively participate in recruiting others, transitioning from victim to perpetrator.

Second, those lured by legitimate job offers are then forced into criminal activities, such as online fraud, without any means to escape the cycle of exploitation.

Under Atipsom, individuals officially identified as trafficking victims are eligible for Interim Protection Order and may be placed in a shelter for up to 21 days while investigations are ongoing.

Malaysia currently operates 10 such shelters, providing refuge for Malaysian and foreign victims. The programmes at these facilities focus on psychosocial support, spiritual well-being, education and physical recovery.

The Women, Family and Community Development Ministry, along with other NGOs, plays a crucial role in addressing the psychological trauma endured by victims.

However, there is an urgent need for more specialised programmes tailored to the unique experiences of victims of forced criminality whose trauma may differ significantly from that of those trafficked for sexual exploitation or forced labour.

Psychosocial interventions could also be administered at victims’ homes or alternative safe spaces for those who decline placement in shelters, facilitating their recovery and reintegration into society. Despite concerted regional efforts to combat forced criminality, three major challenges persist. First, there is a prevailing misconception that limits human trafficking to forced labour and sexual exploitation, overlooking the globally recognised element of criminal exploitation.

Second, the investigation and prosecution of these crimes are hampered by syndicates’ cross-border operations, sophisticated structures and advanced technologies, all of which impede law enforcement efforts.

Third, international legal cooperation remains inadequate. Although Malaysia is a member of the Bali Process, addressing this crime effectively requires stronger transnational collaboration, particularly in areas such as mutual legal assistance and extradition.

In conclusion, tackling forced criminality demands a comprehensive approach that combines holistic law enforcement strategies, a nuanced understanding of trafficking dynamics related to criminal exploitation and enhanced international cooperation.

Only through such coordinated action can Southeast Asia begin to dismantle the expanding networks of forced criminal exploitation.

## Kawalan keselamatan PPS di Putra Heights dipertingkatkan, elak gangguan pihak luar, pempengaruh

Difahamkan, hanya kakitangan Jabatan Kebajikan Masyarakat (JKM) dan Kementerian Kesihatan (KKM) dibenarkan masuk ke PPS berkenaan, selain pihak luar termasuk Jemaah Menteri perlu mendapatkan kebenaran untuk masuk ke premis terbabit.

Mengulas perkembangan itu, Menteri Besar, Datuk Seri Amirudin Shari berkata, ketetapan sedemikian terpaksa dibuat, bertujuan menjaga privasi mangsa insiden letupan gas bawah tanah di Putra Heights di sini, Selasa lalu.

Keputusan itu, katanya, dibuat selepas pihaknya malam tadi menerima aduan mangsa tidak 'selesa' dengan kehadiran pelbagai pihak di PPS berkenaan sejak premis itu mula beroperasi.

Beliau berkata, keputusan itu antara lain dibuat selepas mengambil kira faktor kesihatan, selain meminimumkan risiko jangkitan penyakit berjangkit sepanjang mangsa ditempatkan di PPS berkenaan.

"Kita dapat laporan sebahagian penghuni sudah 'jenuh' dan letih membuka tirai (khemah) masing-masing, jadi kita hadkan sedikit.

SUBANG JAYA – Golongan anak-anak orang kurang upaya (OKU) yang terjejas akibat insiden letupan dan kebakaran saluran paip gas di Putra Heights menerima perhatian khas daripada kerajaan negeri bagi memastikan kebajikan mereka tidak terabai.

Pengerusi Majlis Tindakan OKU Selangor (MTOS), Danial Al-Rashid Haron berkata, beliau sendiri turun padang ke pusat pemindahan sementara (PPS) Masjid Putra Heights untuk meninjau keadaan mangsa, khususnya golongan OKU yang memerlukan intervensi awal dan sokongan psikososial.

“Berdasarkan rekod Jabatan Kebajikan Masyarakat (JKM), seramai 14 individu OKU dikenal pasti, namun hanya tiga orang berada di PPS.

“Justeru, saya hadir semula ke lokasi pada 4 April bersama pakar terapi pertuturan dan audiologi, pasukan terapi cara kerja (occupational therapist) dan pegawai intervensi daripada Jabatan ANIS Selangor,” katanya dalam kenyataan pada Jumaat.

Menurutnya, pasukan intervensi tersebut menziarahi tiga khemah yang menempatkan anak-anak OKU dengan keperluan khas, dan hasil lawatan itu satu pelan intervensi berkala telah dirangka bagi membantu mereka sepanjang tempoh di PPS.

“Antara keperluan yang disediakan termasuk permainan berbentuk terapi seperti Lego dan puzzle, bagi merangsang perkembangan sensori dan motor kasar mereka,” ujarnya.

Tambahnya, Jabatan ANIS juga akan menyediakan Bantuan Khas ANIS untuk memastikan keluarga yang terjejas, termasuk bukan asnaf, menerima bantuan secukupnya.

Danial turut merakamkan penghargaan kepada Bahagian Pendidikan Khas, Kementerian Pendidikan Malaysia (KPM) atas kehadiran dan keprihatinan mereka terhadap nasib warga OKU yang terjejas dalam tragedi tersebut.

“Saya menyeru lebih banyak agensi tampil menghulurkan bantuan kepada kumpulan minoriti ini. Dalam keadaan krisis seperti ini, tiada golongan harus tercicir,” tegasnya.

Dalam lawatan itu juga, pihaknya turut mengedarkan kit permainan kepada anak-anak di PPS bagi memberikan sedikit kegembiraan dalam situasi sukar yang sedang dihadapi.

## Woman lodges report against abusive husband after third assault

**SEREMBAN:** A 31-year-old woman in Kuala Pilah lodged a police report after being the victim of her husband's abuse for the third time since 2022.

The woman, who wished to be identified only as Low, said in the latest incident, her drunk husband suddenly scolded her at their home around 3am on Tuesday, and hit and bit her left shoulder and right arm until there were wounds.

According to her, she first became a victim of domestic violence in 2022 when she was pregnant, with the next incident happening last year.

"I was determined to lodge a police report this time because I could not stand my husband's attitude.

"I had previously reported it to the police but withdrew the report after being persuaded by my mother and mother-in-law.

"But this time, my drunk husband scolded and pushed me until I fell, then he bit and hit me several times," she told reporters at the Bukit Kepayang service centre, here yesterday.

Also present was Bukit Kepayang assemblywoman Nicole Tan.

Low said she lodged the police report on the latest abuse at around 4.13am on the same day before going to a nearby clinic for treatment.

She added she is temporarily living with her brother in Seremban, while their two-year-old daughter is being cared for by a caretaker in Kuala Pilah.

Meanwhile, Bukit Kepayang assemblywoman Nicole Tan said they would help the victim obtain legal services. — Bernama

## 4 NABBED IN CHILD PORN CRACKDOWN

Over 50,000 images, videos found in their possession in series of police raids

A CIVIL servant, a web designer and an accountant were among four people arrested following a joint crackdown on the possession and sharing of child sexual abuse material (CSAM).

Deputy Inspector-General of Police Datuk Seri Ayob Khan Mydin Pitchay said investigations revealed the four had more than 50,000 images and videos in their possession collectively.

"These arrests were made following a joint operation led by the Singapore Police Force between Feb 24 and March 28 involving Singapore, Malaysia, Thailand, South Korea, Hong Kong and Japan," he said at a press conference yesterday.

Present were Federal Criminal Investigation Department (CID) director Datuk Seri Mohd Shuhaily Mohd Zain and Federal CID Sexual, Women and Child Investigation Division's (D11) principal assistant director Senior As-

sistant Commissioner Siti Kamariah Hassan.

He said 46 personnel involving 17 officers and 29 rank-and-file personnel assisted by four strategic partners from the Malaysian Communications and Multimedia Commission participated in the operation.

"A police K9 unit trained in electronic storage detection was also deployed to find electronic gadgets that may have been hidden.

"On our end, we checked six residential units simultaneously in Kajang, Ampang Jaya, Petaling Jaya, Shah Alam and Timur Laut in Penang.

"The raids led to the arrest of four men, aged between 26 and 49, in Kajang, Ampang Jaya, Petaling Jaya and Shah Alam," he said, adding that checks revealed the four suspects involved were a civil servant, an accountant, a web designer and a Wifi equipment installer trainer.

Ayob said initially, Singapore Police had shared 20 Internet Protocol (IP) addresses for them to take action, but only four were actionable.

"We managed to track down four of these addresses because they were static addresses and the remaining ones were either dynamic addresses or had used virtual private networks.

"Since some of the IPs were dynamic, the Internet service

provider does not keep the data stored beyond six months, which added to the difficulty in tracking down those involved."

Ayob suggested making it mandatory for Internet service providers to store data pertaining to dynamic IPs beyond the six-month period.

"This will greatly help us in identifying and taking down those involved in the possession and distribution of CSAM."

He said the arrests in Malaysia were part of 435 arrests made by the six nations throughout the joint operation.

Meanwhile, the Singapore Police Force, in a Facebook post, said raids were conducted in 269 locations in Singapore, Hong Kong, Japan, Malaysia, South Korea and Thailand.

It said electronic devices, including 84 computers, 279 hand-phones, 32 tablets, 150 storage devices and nine routers, as well as CSAM created by Generative Artificial Intelligence (AI) tools, were seized.

It added that 21 men, aged between 23 and 61, were arrested in Singapore for their suspected involvement in producing, possessing, gaining access and distributing CSAM materials, sexual

assault involving penetration, threatening to distribute intimate images or recordings, sexual communication with minors, and transmission and sale of obscene materials.

"They were also investigated for the offence of possession of obscene films.

"Preliminary investigations revealed that a 43-year-old man allegedly paid a young female victim over the span of several years in exchange for her live-streamed sexual acts.

"Another 24-year-old man allegedly engaged in sexual communication with another young female victim and they had exchanged intimate photographs with each other," it said, adding that the man also allegedly threatened to publish her photographs online if she refused to share more intimate materials of herself.

It also said police investigations have established the two victims to be foreigners based overseas.

## Ayob: 2 of 4 suspects detained charged, fined

KUALA LUMPUR: Two of four people arrested following a massive cross-border crackdown on the possession and sharing of child sexual abuse material (CSAM) have been charged in court.

Deputy Inspector-General of Police Datuk Seri Ayob Khan Mydin Pitchay said one of the suspects, who was arrested in Petaling Jaya, pleaded guilty to charges under Section 292 of the Penal Code for possession of lewd material and was fined RM3,000.

"The other suspect, arrested in

Shah Alam, was also charged under Section 292 of the Penal Code and was fined RM6,000," he said.

He said the suspect arrested in Petaling Jaya is also expected to face charges at a later date under Section 10 of the Sexual Offences Against Children Act for accessing child pornography.

"Two other investigation papers, also being probed under Section 10 of the Sexual Offences Against Children Act, are awaiting the outcome of forensic reports," he said at Bukit Aman yesterday.

Ayob said those convicted under Section 20 of the Sexual Offences Against Children Act could face a maximum imprisonment of five years or a fine of not more than RM10,000 or both.

"Under Section 292, those found guilty are liable to a maximum of five years jail or a fine or both upon conviction," he said.

The four suspects were arrested by Bukit Aman operatives as part of a joint operation dubbed "Cyber Guardian" led by Singapore police.

## Op Cyber Guardian: 4 arrested in Malaysia in int'l CSAM sting

**KUALA LUMPUR:** Four individuals including a civil servant were arrested, and over 50,000 pieces of child sexual abuse material (CSAM) were seized during Operation Cyber Guardian.

Deputy Inspector-General of Police Datuk Seri Ayob Khan Mydin Pitchay said the operation took place between Feb 24 and March 28 across various locations in Selangor and Penang.

He said the operation was conducted with authorities from several countries, including Japan, Hong Kong, South Korea, Thailand, and Singapore.

"In Malaysia, the operation occurred in Kajang, Ampang Jaya, Petaling Jaya, and Shah Alam in Selangor, where four arrests were made, including one involving a civil servant.

"In Penang, the operation was carried out in the Timur Laut district," he said in a press conference at Bukit Aman yesterday.

The operation involved 46 Royal Malaysia Police (PDRM) personnel, with assistance from the Malaysian Communications and Multimedia Commission and technical support from the PDRM K9 Detection Unit to trace electronic devices.

Ayob Khan said the suspects, aged between 26 and 49, included an accountant, a web designer, and a trainee at a telecommunications company.

He said preliminary investigations revealed that the

suspects used electronic devices to access and obtain CSAM online through peer-to-peer (P2P) sharing before distributing the material via Telegram groups and storing it for personal use.

He added that most of the CSAM content were downloaded and stored on electronic devices, including hard drives, mobile phones, desktop computers, laptops, and tablets.

"The case is being investigated under the Child Act 2001, the Sexual Offences Against Children Act 2017, the Penal Code, and other relevant laws," he said.

He said that four investigation papers were opened under Section 10 of the Sexual Offences Against Children Act 2017 for accessing CSAM, and Section 293 of the Penal Code for possessing obscene materials.

He added that one of the suspects was recently charged in Petaling Jaya under Section 292 of the Penal Code and fined RM3,000 after pleading guilty, and will also face charges under Section 10 of the Sexual Offences Against Children Act.

"In Shah Alam, another suspect was fined RM6,000 after pleading guilty under the same Section, while two other investigation papers are pending forensic reports," he said, adding that the joint operation across six countries led to the arrest of 435 individuals involved in the distribution of CSAM. — Bernama

## Child porn lands four in custody

Civil servant among suspects nabbed in global op

**KUALA LUMPUR:** A civil servant was among four people detained for possession and distribution of 50,000 child sexual abuse materials in an international police operation.

Deputy Inspector-General of Police Datuk Seri Ayob Khan Mydin Pitchay said the other three were an accountant, a web designer and a telecommunications company trainer.

The suspects are aged between 26 and 49.

They were detained in a joint operation involving six countries and headed by a team of police from Singapore in Ampang Jaya, Kajang and Shah Alam in Selangor, and Penang.

The other countries involved were Thailand, Japan, South Korea and China (Hong Kong).

The operation took place between Feb 24 and March 28.

"In total, 435 individuals were detained under the suspicion of distributing child sexual abuse

materials," Ayob Khan told reporters during a press conference on the Cyber Guardian operation at Bukit Aman yesterday.

"Their modus operandi was to use electronic devices to access, store and distribute these materials via online, including using the Telegram app," he said.

All suspects are being investigated under the Child Act and the Sexual Offences Against Children Act.

So far, four investigation papers have been opened and two cases have been brought to court.

Separately, Bukit Aman Criminal Investigation Department Director Comm Datuk Seri Mohd Shuhaily Mohd Zain told reporters that two of the three investigation papers initiated following the altercation between a balloon vendor and Kuala Lumpur City Hall (DBKL) officers in Jalan Tuanku Abdul Rahman have been referred to the Attorney General's Chambers.

The investigation papers are under Sections 186 and 325 of the Penal Code for obstructing a public officer in the discharge of their duties and causing grievous bodily harm.

"We are still waiting for feedback from the MCMC (Malaysian Communications and Multimedia Commission) regarding a website linked to the investigation under Section 506 of the Penal Code for criminal intimidation," he was quoted as saying by Bernama.

Comm Mohd Shuhaily urged the public to remain level-headed and not be influenced by emotionally charged issues.

He advised them to act with maturity, adhere to the law and work together to uphold national harmony.

Meanwhile, sources revealed that the balloon vendor, known as "Abang Belon" by netizens, has 13 prior cases, mostly related to narcotics.

"The suspect has been charged

in connection with six of these cases," a source said.

On March 28, chaos ensued in Jalan Tuanku Abdul Rahman here when a raid by the DBKL enforcement team on an unlicensed vendor escalated into a fight.

Kuala Lumpur deputy police chief Deputy Comm Datuk Azry Akmar Ayob previously confirmed that three reports had been filed regarding the incident.

The first was lodged by a DBKL enforcement officer for obstructing a civil servant from discharging their duties.

The second report was filed by another DBKL officer regarding the circulation of his image on Facebook, along with accompanying threatening statements, while the third was made by balloon vendor Muhammad Zaimuddin Azlan's mother.

# LABOURER PLEADS GUILTY TO CAR THEFT, KIDNAPPING

He faces up to seven years in prison and a fine for each charge

**A** MAN arrested for stealing a car with the owner's 5-year-old autistic child inside was charged with kidnapping

and motor vehicle theft at the Sessions Court yesterday.

Jasri Ismail, 36, pleaded guilty to both offences before judge Ooi Sheow Yean, who set April 30 for facts and sentencing.

On the first charge, Jasri, a labourer, admitted to kidnapping Muhammad Hadif Mohd

Nazrul from his father, Mohd Nazrul Mohd Nor, 42, at the Kampung Banggol Pokok Sena Mosque parking area in Kepala Batas at 8.20pm on March 30.

He faces up to seven years' imprisonment and a fine under Section 363 of the Penal Code.

On the second charge, he pleaded guilty to stealing a grey Honda BRV from Nazrul at the same time and place.

He faces between one and seven years in prison and a fine

under Section 379A of the Penal Code.

Deputy public prosecutor Nur Fazliyana Ahmad handled the prosecution, while Jasri was represented by Anas Hakimi Mat @ Ahmad from the National Legal Aid Council.

No bail was granted.

Earlier reports indicated that the car was stolen at Masjid Kampung Banggol, Pokok Sena, Tasek Gelugor, around 8pm on March 30.

Police later located the car at a petrol station at the Behrang R&R area of the North-South Expressway at 3.45am the following day.

The suspect was found sleeping in the vehicle, with the engine running.

When police approached, the suspect attempted to flee by reversing the car but crashed into a police vehicle.

Officers arrested the man and rescued the child unharmed.
