Malaysia anggota CPD bagi 2026-2030

Peranan aktif negara dalam isu penduduk, pembangunan dan taraf ECOSOC

Buletin: Malaysia berjaya pilih menganggotai Suruhanjaya Penduduk dan Pembangunan (CPD) bagi penggal 2026 hingga 2030 pada Mesyuarat Majlis Ekonomi dan Sosial Pertubuhan Bangsa-Bangsa Bersatu (ECOSOC) di New York pada 4 April, menurut kenyataan Kementerian Luar.

Menurut kenyataan itu, penggal keanggotaan empat tahun Malaysia akan bermula pada Scs k CPD pada 2026 dan berakhir pada Scs key CPD pada 2030.

CPD mencerminkan pengiktirafan komuniti antarabangsa terhadap peranan aktif negara dalam mempercepatkan tindakan ke arah pelaksanaan Program Tindakan Persidangan Antarabangsa.

"Mengenai Penduduk dan Pembangunan, selain komitmen berterusan untuk memajukan dasar penduduk yang lestari demi melindungi kesihatan dan kesejahteraan rakyatnya selaras prinsip keterangkuman, kesaksamaan dan penghormatan terhadap hak asasi manusia," menurut kenyataan itu.

Selaras Agenda Matlamat Pembangunan Mampan 2030, Malaysia menegaskan komitmennya untuk terus bekerjasama dengan Pertubuhan Bangsa-Bangsa Bersatu (PBB) dan semua rakan antarabangsa dalam menangani isu berkaitan penduduk melalui perkongsian pengalaman dan usaha pembangunan kapasiti.

Perkasa dasar gender

Kementerian Pembangunan Wanita, Keluarga dan Masyarakat (KPWK) memainkan peranan penting dalam menyokong penubuhan Malaysia di CPD, terutamanya dalam memperkasa dasar berkaitan kesaksamaan gender, perancangan keluarga dan pembangunan sosial, menurut kenyataan itu.

CPD adalah sebuah badan subsidiari kepada ECOSOC yang dianggotai 47 negara ahli yang dipilih ECOSOC untuk empat tahun berdasarkan pengagihan geografi.

CPD dipertanggungjawabkan untuk melaksanakan tugas khusus dan memberi nasihat kepada ECOSOC berkaitan isu penduduk dan pembangunan, menurut kenyataan itu. BERSAMA

KUALA LUMPUR: The Sungai Buloh Parliamentary Constituency Service Centre has been mobilised to provide assistance to the victims of the thunderstorms this evening.

Its member of Parliament, Datuk Seri R. Ramanan, in a statement, said the centre is also working closely with relevant authorities and government agencies, including the Petaling District and Land Office, the Fire and Rescue Department, the Social Welfare Department, and the police, to ensure that all forms of aid, such as logistics, food, shelter, and daily necessities, are delivered without delay.

"I was informed that several areas in the Sungai Buloh constituency, particularly Kampung Melayu Subang and Subang Perdana, have been struck by a storm, causing damage to several houses, property, and public facilities.

"Based on the latest information received, no fatalities have been reported, but I am aware that this incident has undoubtedly caused difficulties and concerns for the affected families, especially those who are celebrating Hari Raya.

"I deeply understand the feelings of the victims and the residents affected, and I stand with you during this difficult time," he said.

Ramanan, who is also the Entrepreneur and Cooperatives Development Deputy Minister, said he will be visiting the affected locations to assess the situation firsthand and listen to the concerns of the victims.

"In any disaster, togetherness and solidarity are our greatest strengths.

"As such, I urge everyone to continue helping one another and to follow safety advice from the authorities.

"We will rise and restore the situation together, just as we have always done before," he said.

Earlier, the Malaysian Meteorological Department (MetMalaysia) issued a warning for **thunderstorms** and heavy rain across most states until 7pm today.

MetMalaysia said the warning covers Selangor, the Federal Territories of Kuala Lumpur and Putrajaya, Negri Sembilan, Penang, Perak, and Melaka.

Establishment of Children's Commission proposed

>3 Body would monitor protection policies, investigate rights violations and offer advice: Alliance for a Safe Community

KUALA LUMPUR: The time has come for Malaysia to establish an independent Children's Commission, said Alliance for a Safe Community chairman Tan Sri Lee Lam Thye.

He stressed that such a commission would play a crucial role in monitoring and evaluating child protection policies, investigating rights violations and offering concrete recommendations or improvements.

"Setting up a Children's Commission would signal the government's unwavering commitment to child welfare and ensure sustained, focused advocacy for children's rights.

"Children are the future of our nation. Failing to protect them is not just a moral failing; it threatens the long-term wellbeing of

our society.

"It is our collective duty to ensure every child grows up in a safe, nurturing and empowering environment," Lee said in a statement yesterday.

He also urged for more robust child protection laws, enhanced digital safeguards and greater coordination across agencies to uphold and protect children's rights and welfare.

He stressed that every child has the right to safety, education, healthcare and a life free from harm and exploitation.

Lee warned that a growing list of duties continues to undermine those rights, ranging from abuse and online exploitation to trafficking and inadequate mental health support.

"Physical and emotional abuse, along with neglect, are on the rise, with many cases slipping through the cracks due to fear, stigma or insufficient protection mechanisms.

He added that the rapid expansion of digital platforms has left children increasingly vulnerable to online grooming, cyberbullying and exposure to harmful content such as pornography.

He said another major concern is the persistent issue of child trafficking and

forced labour.

Lee added that these problems continue unabated due to weak enforcement and poor inter-agency coordination.

He called on the government to act decisively in response to these escalating challenges, Bemama reported.

"We need stronger laws and far better enforcement to combat abuse, exploitation and trafficking. Matters must be dealt with swiftly and firmly?

He also highlighted the shared responsibility of parents, educators and communities in safeguarding children, especially in the digital age.

"Digital literacy programme and active monitoring of online content are essential steps in keeping our children safe.

Parents and educators must work hand in hand to protect children from the growing dangers of the online world?

He reiterated that the establishment of an independent Children's Commission would be a landmark move for Malaysia, a step that ensures children's voices are heard, their rights protected and futures secured.

He also said the time to act is now, adding that children in Malaysia deserve nothing less.

Women now better informed in planning for their retirement

PETALING JAYA: More women in the country are becoming financially aware and actively planning for their retirement, including contributing to the EPF even if they are not formally employed, says a women's group.

Malaysian Womens Development Organisation president Htg Ceok Chee said financial awareness among women varies by location and background, with urban women generally more informed due to better access to information.

Many are knowledgeable, even among retirees. They've made arrangements to ensure they are financially secure without relying on their children," she said.

Ng, who is also a lawyer, said women involved in social and community activities tend to be more proactive and better informed.

•One woman I spoke to had no

financial support from her husband for 10 years but still managed to care for her family.

"These women aren't financially helpless. They're just emotionally burdened but they do have plans for the future," she said.

However, big salary women in rural areas, especially those middle-aged and less educated, often lack access to information and support.

She urged more targeted outreach by the government and non-governmental organisations, including one-stop centres and public talks to help women understand their rights and financial options.

As of March 14, the savings trend among women showed an increase through the Suris scheme.

Finance Minister H Datuk Seri Amir Hamzah Azizan said the number of recipients increased by 77% compared with 42,759 members in 2023.

Amir Hainzah said 75,196 members had received government incentives totalling RM11.4 million under the scheme.

The incentive rate for i-Suri tri 2024 is 8% matching contribution of 50% for every ringgit contributed to the Employees Provident Fund (EPF) with a maximum incentive of RM3m per year.

"This incentive is subject to a lifetime limit of RM10 million per individual under the age of 55," he added.

Meanwhile, the Statistics Department (DOSM) revealed that Malaysian women continue to fall behind men in earnings and as a result have less capacity to save.

According to its latest Salaries and Wages Report 2023, it found that while overall working Malaysians are earning more across the board, the gender pay gap continues to persist, with women still earning less than men in their median and mean wages.

In 2023, the number of salary and wage recipients rose by 1.3% to 10.11 million people, up from 10 million in 2022.

The overall median monthly salary increased by 7.1% to RM2,602, compared to RM2,429 the previous year.

Similarly, the mean monthly salary grew by 6.6% to RM3,441, signalling improved earning potential for a large portion of the workforce.

However, a closer look at the data reveals that the wage gap between men and women remained.

The report indicated that male employees saw a 7.1% increase in their median monthly salary, rising from RM2,498 in 2022 to RM2,675 in 2023. The result is an increase of RM177.

In comparison, female employees recorded a 6.9% increase, or RM159, bringing their median monthly salary to RM2,464, up

from RM2,305 the year before.

The gap is also evident in mean salaries.

It said that the mean monthly wages for male employees increased by 7.4% to RM3,432.

For female employees, mean wages rose by 6.2% to RM3,411.

The wage difference of RM221 between male and female workers displayed a disparity in earnings between genders, even as both groups experience income growth.

While the rise in salaries is a positive development for the workforce, the data points to a continued imbalance in how income is distributed between men and women.

Although the gap is slightly narrower compared to previous years, it still translates to lower annual earnings for women, which could impact their ability to save, invest and prepare for retirement.

Son quits job to care for paralysed mum

A MAN in Kuala Kangsar, Perak, willingly sacrificed his income and livelihood to care for his beloved another, left partially paralysed due to a stroke, reported *Kosmo*.

Mohamad Zahid Maula Asa Rahmab 34, said he quit his job as a public toilet attendant eight months ago to look after his 72-year-old mother, Rohani Haliif, who has been wheelchair-bound for eight months.

The married man said he is the sole caregiver for his mother, as his wife is responsible for looking after their two young children.

"My daily routine now consists primarily of feeding my mother, changing her diapers and assisting her with other daily tasks."

Mohamad Zanid said the family relies heavily on his late father's pension of **RM1,500 per month**, which his mother receives.

However, this amount is insufficient to cover his children's expenses.

To supplement their income, he and his wife have started a small food business.

He takes orders for laksa and curry noodles and sells kuih-muih (traditional cakes) on a small scale through online and social media platforms to make ends meet.

He received numerous orders during Ramadan. I hope this effort will open up more opportunities for my family's livelihood in the future."

> Beloved local TV host and entrepreneur Neelofa is distressed after a new scam offering **fake umrah services used images of her immediate family to promote itself online**, reported *Harian Metro*.

The 36-year-old said she became aware of the scam after her mother received numerous messages from victims via her social media account.

Neelofa, whose full name is Noor Neelofa Mohd Noor, said the scammer used recent video footage of her mother and sisters in the Holy Land to advertise his fraudulent business through social media advertisements.

By her mother did use one of his

services last October, but the scammer has exploited my family's name to deceive others.

"I want to emphasize that my mother is not involved in any fraudulent activities or has any connection to this," she said.

She added that many victims had contacted her family, some of whom had lost hundreds of thousands of ringgit to the scam.

Neelofa urged the public to be wary of such scams or advertisements featuring her family and the individual involved.

"I feel sorry for those who have fallen victim to his deception. They worked hard to save that money, only to be tricked by such malicious individuals."

Time to establish an independent children commission

LETTERS Children are among the most vulnerable members of society, and protecting their rights must be a national priority.

The well-being of children is not just a moral obligation but a fundamental responsibility that determines the future of our nation.

Every child has the right to safety, education, healthcare, and an environment free from exploitation and harm. Unfortunately, numerous pressing issues continue to threaten the rights and welfare of children today.

Current pressing issues facing children include -

1. Child Abuse and Neglect:

Reports of child abuse, both physical and emotional, continue to rise. Many cases go unreported due to fear, lack of awareness, or inadequate child protection mechanisms. Neglect, especially among low-income families, also affects children's development and well-being.

2. Sexual Exploitation and Online Dangers:

The increasing use of digital platforms has made children more susceptible to online grooming, cyberbullying, and child pornography. There is an urgent need for stronger laws and digital safeguards to protect children from such exploitation.

3. Child Trafficking and Forced Labour:

Some children fall victim to human trafficking, where they are exploited for labour or sexual purposes. Weak enforcement and lack of coordination among agencies contribute to the persistence of this issue.

4. Lack of Access to Quality Education:

Despite improvements in school enrollment rates, many children – especially those from marginalised communities – face barriers to quality education due to poverty, lack of infrastructure, or disabilities. The digital divide further exacerbates educational inequality.

5. Mental Health Crisis Among Children:

Rising cases of depression, anxiety, and even suicide among children highlight the urgent need for better mental health support in schools and communities.

Academic pressure, social issues, and family problems are major contributing factors.

6. Children in Conflict with the Law:

Many minors, especially from vulnerable backgrounds, end up in the juvenile justice system instead of receiving rehabilitative support.

There is a need for better legal protection and social intervention for such children.

To effectively protect children's rights, the following measures must be prioritised:

- **Stronger Child Protection Laws & Enforcement:** Stricter laws and better enforcement are needed to combat child abuse, exploitation, and trafficking. Authorities must ensure swift action against offenders.
- **Better Digital Safeguards:** Parents, educators, and authorities must work together to enhance online safety for children through digital literacy programmes and stronger monitoring of online content.
- **Universal Access to Education:** Governments must ensure that all children, regardless of socioeconomic status, have access to quality education. Special support should be given to children with disabilities and those in remote areas.
- **Improved Mental Health Support:** More trained counselors should be placed in schools, and awareness campaigns should be conducted to encourage early intervention in mental health issues.
- **Community & Family Support Programmes:** Strengthening family and community-based support systems can help prevent child abuse and neglect. More child-friendly spaces and shelters should be established.
- **Reforming Juvenile Justice:** Alternatives to detention, such as community service and rehabilitation programmes, should be implemented for children in conflict with the law.

Thus, there is an urgent need for an independent Children's Commission dedicated to protecting and advocating for children's rights. Such a body would:

- Monitor and evaluate government policies and enforcement of child protection laws.
- Act as an independent authority to investigate cases of child rights violations.
- Provide recommendations to the government on improving child welfare policies.
- Work with civil society organisations to raise awareness and promote child-friendly policies.
- Ensure that Malaysia complies with international child protection standards, such as the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC).

The establishment of a Children's Commission would signal the government's strong commitment to child welfare and ensure continuous, focused advocacy for children's rights.

Children are the future of our nation, and failing to protect them means jeopardising our society's long-term well-being.

It is our collective duty – government, civil society, parents, and communities – to ensure that every child grows up in a safe, nurturing, and empowering environment.
