COMMENT | Appeal for sensitive media coverage of OKU

COMMENT | We are disturbed by the media's focus on the disabled status of the 19-year-old man arrested on Feb 21 in connection with the alleged sexual assault of a young girl at a mosque in Selangor.

Some media outlets approached the Social Welfare Department and the department's Selangor branch and confirmed that the man has had a "learning disability since childhood".

This information has little bearing on the case and the alleged action, but media attention has put a spotlight on and made the man's disabled status the focus of public attention.

The media has chosen to invoke the disabled label to sensationalise the alleged crime. As Norman Goh, producer of the "Bicara Minggu Ini" podcast has aptly observed:

"A careless headline can destroy years of advocacy, shatter trust, and fuel discrimination."

This example of irresponsible media reporting and biased journalism will worsen bias and prejudice in the minds of the public that persons with disabilities (OKU) are not to be trusted and are sexual perpetrators. It will worsen discrimination against the disabled and those closely associated with disabled persons and would hinder efforts for the inclusion of the disabled community in Malaysian society.



In reality, available local data show that the vast majority of sexual abusers are neurotypical individuals - persons without a disability. However, the media have never reported or focussed on the non-disability status of those perpetrators.

There are many similar incidents of poor and negative media reporting on the OKU community, especially those with autism, psychosocial disabilities (mental health problems), and learning disabilities.

The Feb 21 incident was reported to have gone viral on social media before the suspect was arrested. The lack of SOPs and legislation to protect disabled persons from breach of confidentiality by those who have access to their OKU card information and irresponsible behaviour in the public domain that could prejudice outcomes for the concerned OKU make attempts to redress this difficult.

We appeal to the Communications and Multimedia Content Forum of Malaysia (CMCF) to take action to train our media outlets on disability-, child-, gender-sensitive and nonbiased reporting.

We also appeal to Women, Family, and Community Development Minister Nancy Shukri and the Disabled Persons Development Department (JPOKU) to introduce SOPs that protect OKU from breach of confidentiality of the personal information held by the JPOKU of OKU cardholders by JKM personnel at all levels to anyone except when permitted by the law.

We are unaware of any provision of law that allows such personal information (e.g. an individual's disabled status) to be disclosed to the media without the explicit written consent of the concerned individual.

This negative and discriminatory media reporting strengthens our call for the urgent amendment of Article 8(2) of the Federal Constitution to expressly prohibit discrimination on the grounds of disability and the comprehensive amendment of the Persons with Disabilities Act, 2008 to align it with the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD).

To the good people of Malaysia, we ask that you do not join in making this type of negative reporting viral. Recognise that all of us - disabled or not - have the same rights and entitlements to justice.

Releasing CCTV recordings on social media while police investigations are ongoing is a no-no. We need to work harder in Malaysia to mature as a society and to become a fully inclusive "developed" nation.

To all media practitioners, we appeal that you please use your words wisely in the spirit of Steven Aitchison:

"Your words have the power to hurt, to heal, open minds, open hearts, and change the world. Never forget the responsibility you have over the words you speak."

KUCHING: The Women's Leadership Apprenticeship Programme (PERANTIS) 2025 is set to expand its reach to 5,000 participants, further advancing efforts to bridge the gender gap in leadership across various industries.

Announcing the application period from February 27 to March 26, 2025, Women, Family and Community Development Minister Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri reaffirmed her ministry's commitment to empowering women entrepreneurs.

She also highlighted ongoing efforts to strengthen partnerships between the government, NGOs, and the private sector to support women entrepreneurs while promoting inclusivity to ensure equal opportunities across all industries.

"True empowerment comes not only from providing resources but also from fostering a mindset of resilience, confidence, and leadership.

"Through collaborations with organisations like WESNA Kuching, we can build a stronger support system for women in business," she added.

For the record, WEC 2025 was organised by WESNA Kuching to equip Dayak women with the skills, resources, and opportunities needed to excel in entrepreneurship and become influential business leaders.

Supportive ecosystem crucial for women entrepreneurship

KUCHING: Women's participation in entrepreneurship is a key driver of economic progress, innovation and social transformation.

In stating this, Women, Family and Community Development Minister Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri pointed out that women-owned businesses globally contribute significantly to gross domestic product growth, job creation and community development.

"Here in Malaysia, we see women excelling in various sectors, including technology, hospitality, agriculture and the circular economy.

"Despite these advancements, women continue to face challenges such as access to capital, market entry barriers, and gender biases in the business world.

"As such, conferences like this serve as an essential platform to bridge knowledge gaps, facilitate mentorship and create opportunities for women entrepreneurs to thrive," she said.

She said this in her speech read by Women's Development Department Director General Hanani Sapit during the Women Entrepreneurship Conference (WEC) 2025 at Dayak Chamber Tower here Saturday.

Citing the studies by Tateh, Latip, and Marikan (2014), she said that the lack of exposure and training in entrepreneurship among Dayak women compared to other ethnic groups caused such challenges.

"This reality underscores the urgency of creating a more inclusive and supportive ecosystem where all women, regardless of background, can access opportunities and succeed in business.

"In this regard, Women Empowerment and Sustainability Network Association (WESNA) Kuching has taken a commendable step in advocating for women entrepreneurs, ensuring they have access to training, financial literacy programmes, and networking opportunities.

"Such initiatives are vital in fostering sustainable economic participation among indigenous women in Sarawak," she said.

Nancy commended the organisation of WEC 2025 as a powerful initiative that aligns with national and global efforts to uplift women in business.

During the conference held from Feb 21 to 22, she said participants would engage in insightful sessions on entrepreneurship in the food industry and hospitality sector; caregiving and wellness entrepreneurship; financial management and taxation for businesses; digital branding and marketing strategies; and success stories and networking opportunities.

These discussions, she noted, are crucial in equipping women with the knowledge and skills to navigate the evolving business landscape, particularly in the digital and gig economies.

"Women entrepreneurs must not only be business leaders but also champions of change within their communities.

"By fostering leadership qualities among women, we ensure that they can advocate for themselves, contribute to economic sustainability and create opportunities for future generations," she said.

Having said that, she called on all the women entrepreneurs present to seize the opportunities provided through this conference.

"Network with industry experts, exchange ideas, and leverage the knowledge shared to advance your businesses. Let us continue breaking barriers, challenging stereotypes and uplifting one another.

"Remember, when women succeed, families, communities and nations thrive. Empowered women are not just business leaders; they are catalysts of social and economic transformation," she said.

Manusia mampu lakukan jenayah tanpa kira status

SHAH ALAM - Walaupun seseorang itu disahkan sebagai orang kurang upaya (OKU) namun individu terbabit masih mampu melakukan jenayah seksual.

Profesor Psikologi di Universiti Malaya, Profesor Dr Awang Idris berkata, sekalipun seseorang individu itu berstatus OKU yang ada masalah mental, ia masih berkecenderungan melakukan jenayah atas pertimbangan waras.

"Untuk melakukan jenayah, manusia berkemampuan untuk melakukannya selagi mana ia ada keinginan dan niat tanpa mengira status OKU atau sebaliknya.

"Sama ada pelaku jenayah berstatus OKU berkenaan sengaja memanipulasi statusnya bagi tujuan jenayah, saya rasa tidak.

"Namun, saya berpandangan golongan itu masih berkeupayaan untuk melakukan jenayah berat seperti pedofilia dengan pertimbangan waras, sekali pun status OKU melibatkan isu kekurangan berbeza-beza.

"Jadi pihak berkuasa perlu teliti status OKU pelaku jenayah berkenaan bagi mengelakkan cubaan manipulasi undang-undang di mahkamah," katanya kepada Sinar Ahad.

Tambah beliau, sekiranya benar pesalah terbabit memiliki kad OKU, polis perlu menyelidik sama ada status OKU dimiliki seseorang suspek jenayah adalah berkenaan mental atau fizikal.

Katanya, ini memandangkan pemberian status berkenaan adalah berasaskan pelbagai faktor kekurangan dialami individu terbabit.

Sementara itu, Pensyarah Kanan dan Perunding Psikologi Klinikal, Pusat Kajian Psikologi dan Kesejahteraan Manusia, Fakulti Sains Sosial dan Kemanusiaan Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM), Dr Hilwa Abdullah @ Mohd Nor pula berkata, kejadian remaja mencabul kanak-kanak yang sedang mendirikan solat di masjid membuktikan mana-mana kawasan dianggap selamat dan suci, bukan jaminan tidak akan berlaku kejadian jenayah.

Beliau turut menegaskan pemilikan kad OKU oleh seseorang pelaku jenayah tidak sewajarnya menjadi pelindung mereka daripada berhadapan sebarang tindakan undang-undang terutama dalam konteks serangan seksual.

"Hakikatnya pelaku jenayah pedofilia sememangnya berdepan masalah kecelaruan seksual yang dipanggil parafilia, isu rangsangan seksual abnormal yang ditandai dengan fantasi seksual berterusan.

"Kelompok ini sebenarnya boleh dikategorikan di bawah gangguan mental," kata beliau.

Why are disabled job seekers still facing these barriers?

I RECENTLY received an e-mail informing me that my civil service exam is scheduled on Thursday. I have a burning desire to secure this job, yet I find myself fighting to hold on to hope.

For many years, I struggled to find a job. Many times, the journey made me question whether I was even on the right path.

I studied hard till masters level. I believed that education would open doors, that my qualifica-

tions and perseverance would be enough to build a future. Yet the reality has been far from what I imagined.

The government has urged the public sector to increase the employment of disabled individuals to meet the 1% employment target. According to policy, disabled candidates are exempt from taking the civil service entrance exam. At first, in 2023, I was informed that my SPA9 (Sistem Pendaftaran Pekerjaan Suruhan-

jaya Perkhidmatan Awam) registration did not indicate my disabled, or OKU (orang kurang upaya), status, which is why I was required to take the test. While this was frustrating, I understood that errors happen.

But now my OKU status is clearly recorded in the system, yet I am still being asked to take the exam.

It makes me wonder. If the government is serious about its commitment to hire disabled individ-

uals, why am I still facing the same obstacles as before?

This experience has left me questioning whether the policies in place are truly meant to support disabled individuals.

I am not alone in this struggle. There are many other disabled job seekers facing similar barriers. If even the basic step of applying for a job is riddled with challenges, how can we expect real inclusion in the workforce? I am not asking for special

treatment. I am asking for the government to uphold the very policies it has set in place. I am asking for fairness. I am asking for the opportunity to serve my country.

Dear Prime Minister, will you take action to ensure that these policies are not just promises but a reality for all disabled job seekers?

PETALING JAYA – Isu kemudahan dan keselamatan golongan orang kurang upaya (OKU) dalam menggunakan perkhidmatan pengangkutan awam, khususnya Transit Aliran Ringan (LRT), terus menjadi perbincangan dalam kalangan masyarakat.

Walaupun pelbagai inisiatif telah diperkenalkan bagi memudahkan pergerakan mereka, masih terdapat kekangan yang menimbulkan persoalan mengenai pihak yang bertanggungjawab untuk membantu serta memantau pengguna OKU ketika menggunakan sistem LRT.

Menurut Zarul Azri, meskipun ketika ini syarikat pengendali LRT telah menyediakan pelbagai kemudahan seperti lif, laluan khas, dan butang bantuan kecemasan, masih banyak cabaran yang dihadapi pengguna OKU.

Katanya, antara isu utama yang telah dibangkitkan sejak sekian lama adalah adalah kekurangan petugas untuk membantu pengguna OKU di stesen tertentu.

“Jadi apa-apa masalah, tak ada petugas yang ‘stanby’ di stesen stesen, menyebabkan pengguna OKU terpaksa mencari alternatif lain termasuklah meminta ihsan daripada pengguna LRT yang lain.

“Ada juga yang merungut mereka terpaksa menunggu lama untuk dapatkan bantuan petugas di stesen,” katanya dalam satu catatan di Facebook hari ini.

Perkongsian Zarul Azri turut mendapat perhatian pengguna lain dan rata-ratanya mereka juga mempersoalkan siapakah yang bertanggungjawab untuk membantu pengguna LRT di stesen terutama golongan OKU.

“OKU ni dia pergerakan terbatas, jadi perlu ada petugas yang pantau. Kes macam di LRT Titiwangsa semalam. Kenapa boleh jadi macam itu? Mana mereka yang patut bertugas?,” soal Ainur.

“Saya sangat berharap ada satu mekanisme pemantauan lebih ketat serta kehadiran petugas yang sentiasa bersedia untuk membantu pengguna OKU. Ini bukan sahaja memudahkan pergerakan kami, tetapi juga menjamin keselamatan,” kata Mohd. Khairul

KUALA LUMPUR, 23 Feb (Bernama) -- Pemasangan penghadang di kawasan berisiko termasuk di platform aliran ringan (LRT) antara langkah kritikal bagi menjamin keselamatan orang kurang upaya (OKU) terutama OKU penglihatan.

Presiden Persatuan OKU Sentral Datuk Ras Adiba Radzi berkata golongan berkenaan khususnya mereka yang tidak biasa melalui sesuatu kawasan berisiko, terdedah kepada bahaya jatuh ke landasan atau lubang yang boleh membawa maut.

"Sebelum ini, pernah berlaku beberapa kejadian yang menimpa sahabat-sahabat OKU penglihatan akibat risiko di tempat yang mereka lalui termasuk terjatuh ke dalam longkang yang tidak ditutup atau dihadang, menyebabkan ada individu tidak dijumpai selama sehari-hari," katanya kepada Bernama hari ini.

Selain itu, beliau berkata kehadiran petugas di stesen-stesen pengangkutan awam juga mampu memudahkan urusan OKU penglihatan selain warga emas dan kanak-kanak ketika menggunakan kemudahan berkenaan.

Ras Adiba turut mengulangi gesaan supaya semua rekaan pejalan kaki termasuk di sekitar kemudahan awam perlu mengikut piawaian universal yang mesra OKU.

"Saya berharap keselamatan OKU akan terus diambil serius dengan sekurang-kurangnya meletakkan petugas di stesen pengangkutan awam kerana kemalangan mungkin tidak berlaku jika ada individu lain berada di platform yang boleh memberi amaran atau membantu mereka," katanya.

Pasang PSD segera jamin keselamatan pengguna OKU, budak

Kuala Lumpur: Pengguna perkhidmatan Transit Aliran Ringan (LRT) di Stesen Titiwangsa di sini, berharap Prasarana Malaysia Berhad segera menambah baik ciri keselamatan di semua laluan pengangkutan awam itu.

Mereka berharap insiden lelaki Orang Kurang Upaya (OKU) penglihatan terjatuh dalam kawasan rel dan maut dilanggar tren di sini, kelmarin tidak berulang.

Penuntut politeknik, Nur Nadia Intan Abdul Razak, 20, mencadangkan pintu skrin platform (PSD) dipasang segera di platform bagi menjamin keselamatan pengguna terutama OKU dan kanak-kanak.

"Pada pandangan saya, PSD adalah ciri keselamatan yang patut dipasang di platform LRT seperti dilaksanakan di stesen monorel.

"Ia boleh mencegah OKU penglihatan dan kanak-kanak daripada terjatuh ke kawasan rel berbahaya," katanya, semalam.

Pemandu teks, Lim Hoong Boom, 70 pula mencadangkan pihak berkaitan

menempatkan pegawai keselamatan atau polis bantuan di platform bagi mengawasi pergerakan pengguna.

Menurutnya, sepanjang 30 tahun dia bekerja sebagai pemandu teks di terminal bas berhampiran Stesen LRT Titiwangsa, ini kali pertama dia mendengar insiden meragut nyawa pengguna.

"Saya terkejut apabila terima berita itu. Dalam masa sama, saya risau jika perkara ini berulang lagi.

"Seeloknya, pihak berkaitan perlu tambah pegawai untuk bantu pimpin OKU dan warga emas yang memerlukan di platform.

"Walaupun ada garisan kuning di platform dan pengguna diingatkan tidak melepasi, kita risau mereka hilangimbangan dan terjatuh," katanya.

Bagi penuntut doktor falsafah (PhD) Universiti Malaysia, Sandy Nur Mulyono, 36, penambahbaikan dua ciri keselamatan itu harus disegerakan.

"Stesen LRT perlu ada PSD antara platform tempat menunggu dan landasan tren.

Seorang lagi pengguna

LRT, Viki Fauzan Muslem, 21, menggalakkan pengguna untuk peka terhadap OKU penglihatan dengan membantu memimpin mereka di platform LRT.

"Sebagai pengguna, kita juga bertanggungjawab untuk saling membantu insan memerlukan.

"Tiada salahnya kita tawarkan bantuan pemimpin mereka ketika menunggu dan masuk ke dalam tren dengan selamat," katanya.

Kelmarin, seorang lelaki warga emas maut selepas dipercayai dilanggar tren sebelum mayatnya ditemui di bawah rel kereta api di Stesen LRT Titiwangsa.

Lelaki berstatus OKU penglihatan itu dipercayai terjatuh di kawasan rel sebelum dipercayai dilanggar tren yang melintasi kawasan berkenaan.

Susulan kejadian itu, Menteri Pengangkutan, Anthony Loke mengarahkan Prasarana memasang kamera litar tertutup pintar (smart CCTV) yang berupaya mengesan perilaku berisiko di stesen.

Child care centre not authorised to operate

PUTRAJAYA: A kindergarten embroiled in allegations of abuse involving a six-year-old autistic child in Shah Alam was found to be operating without complying with regulations.

In a statement, the Social Welfare Department said checks revealed that the premises was not authorised to operate as a child care centre (taska).

“The department has issued a notice prohibiting the kindergarten from operating due to violations under the Child Care Centre Act. It has also instructed the operator to attend a meeting at the Selangor welfare office. The case has been referred to the district education office.”

The notice was issued following an investigation into a complaint by the parents of an autistic child, who alleged that the child had been abused at the premises.

On Friday, Shah Alam district police chief ACP Mohd Iqbal Ibrahim said the report lodged by the victim’s mother stated that her husband had found red marks on the child’s back and below the right eye. The case is being investigated under Section 31(1)(a) of the Child Act 2001. – Bernama

'Prioritise safety, protection of children at mosques'

KUALA LUMPUR: The authorities and mosque management must take immediate proactive action to ensure the safety of worshippers, especially children, who often frequent places of worship to seek knowledge and engage in religious practices.

Malaysian Islamic Youth Movement women affairs bureau vice-president Dr Fatin Nur Majdina Nordin said the attempt to molest a young girl at a Batang Kali mosque in Selangor on Friday had tarnished the sanctity of the mosque and posed a threat to the psychological well-being and safety of visitors.

She said such incidents should not occur in

mosques, which are supposed to be places of worship that guarantee peace and safety.

"The movement expresses concern and urges the community to be more attentive to the issue of child protection and safety, particularly with regard to the recent sexual harassment incident involving a young girl at a mosque.

"The incident highlights the importance of monitoring and ensuring safety of both inside and around mosque premises, especially during worship times."

On Friday, a closed-circuit television (CCTV) footage went viral, showing a man wearing a white skull cap sneaking into the women's prayer area and hugging a young girl from behind while

she was in *sujood* (prostration) and then fleeing with the victim.

The man was arrested at his residence located approximately one kilometre from the mosque, at 10am the same day.

Selangor Social Welfare Department director Azmir Kassim confirmed that checks revealed the man held a disability card due to learning difficulties.

Fatin Nur Majdina said the issue of disability in the incident must be carefully considered as it is a sensitive matter and requires thorough investigation and assessment. She added that offenders should be appropriately punished and the identity of the child protected. – Bernama

Man arrested for allegedly molesting teen niece

TAWAU: A man was arrested on suspicion of molesting his 14-year-old niece at a house in Merotai Besar, here, on Saturday.

Tawau police chief Assistant Commissioner Jasmin Hussin said the victim's mother lodged a report at 9.12am the same day.

A team from the Bombalai police station, led by Sergeant Gegerahman Mohammad, arrested

the 30-year-old suspect at 3.30pm that day.

"Based on the victim's statement, the child is believed to have been molested by her uncle while she was watching television in the living room of her grandmother's house.

"The suspect allegedly approached her, tried to undress her and then molested her

before fleeing."

He said the suspect was being detained for further investigation under Section 354 of the Penal Code for assault or use of criminal force on a person with intent to outrage modesty.

"If convicted, he could be punished with imprisonment of up to 10 years, a fine, whipping, or any two of these punishments."
