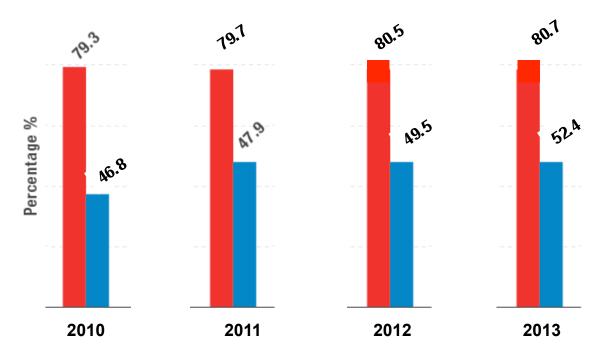

2010 - 2013







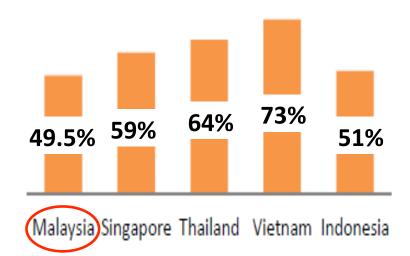

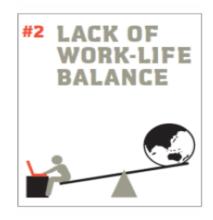

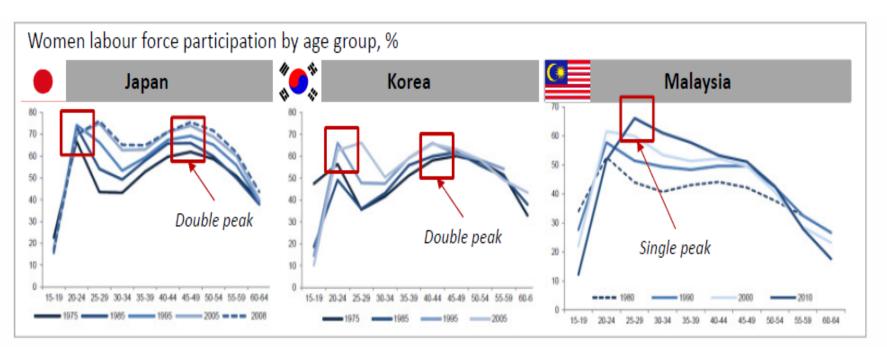








WOMEN LABOUR FORCE PARTICIPATION RATE IN MALAYSIA IS SINGLE-PEAKED

Career Comeback Grant

Grants in line with Budget 2015, was launched on 2 March 2015 to encourage companies to embark on a Career Comeback Programme.

CAREER COMEBACK GRANT



Resourcing Grant

Implement or enhance a programme or campaign to recruit women returnees. The grant offers co-funding of 75% of the cost incurred to run the programme up to a maximum of RM100,000.

Start date of programme must be between

1 January 2015 – 31 December 2015



Retention Grant

Successful recruitment and retention of women returnees for more than 6 months. The grant amount is equivalent to a returnee's one month salary. The grant is up to a maximum of RM100,000.

Women returnee(s) must be hired between

1 January 2015 – 31 December 2015

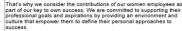

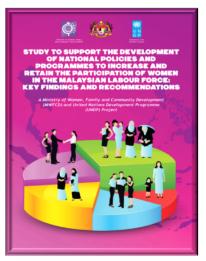

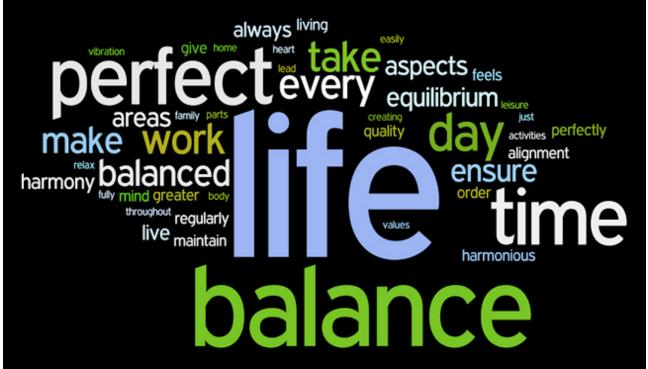

Rohani: Flexi-hours key to getting women back to work

KUALA LUMPUR: Companies offering flexible work schedules are the key to luring professional women back into the workforce, said the Women, Family and Community Development Minister Datuk Rohani Abdul Karim.

Flexible work arrangements, she said, was a tried-and-true strategy used by advanced economies and offered a work-life balance that was becoming essential in attracting and retaining employees, especially mothers who wanted more time with their family.

"Employers should look at various arrangements, like job sharing among employees, working from home, and flexitime, under which employees choose when to start and end work," she said.

KUALA LUMPUR: The Women, Family and Community Development Ministry is walking the talk to retain women in the workforce by offering flexible hours for its officers beginning this month

Minister Datuk Seri Rohani Abdul Karim said the ministry hoped to blaze the trail for other ministries to implement similar policies in order to encourage more women to stay in their jobs.

The policy, which was effective on Sunday, is also extended to male officers.

"We are offering our staff three options of flexible work arrangements – working from home, flexible working hours and a modified compressed work week system.

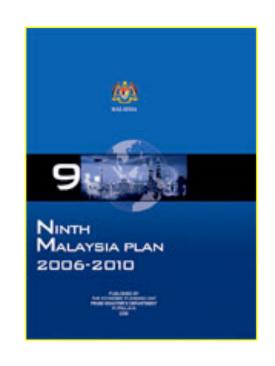
"We are currently taking applications from our officers now. This initial and trial phase will be implemented for three months," she told reporters after launching the Career Comeback Programme and grant by the ministry and TalentCorp here yesterday.

WOMEN DIRECTORS PROGRAMME



- Introduced in 2012 to ensure women candidates are ready to hold decision-making positions.
- Qualified women candidates are encouraged to register in the Women Directors' Registry System.
- From 2012 to 2014, 828 women have undergone the Women Directors Programme.
- Since 2013 until 2014, 164 placements of women directors on the boards of Public Listed Companies.
